Featured Member Billy Edwards

Get Involved. Billy Edwards has these words to give to new or uninvolved Shriners. **Get involved** seems to be the motivation for this Shriner of 50+ years and he has practiced what he preached. Billy, who will be 85 this month, is the epitome of what it means to be involved.

Billy joined his Blue Lodge, El Paso #13, as soon as he was old enough. His proudest moment as a Mason

was when he was crowned an Inspector General Honorary, a 33rd Degree Mason. He has been part of, and/or started, several of the Al Kaly units, and I felt privileged to sit in the room where two units were born.

Billy credits his daughter, Norma Jean Valerio, with starting the Al Kaly Clown Unit. She was working in a bank when Dale White, a transplanted Shriner clown from Texas, came in, and she commented that her dad was

a Shriner. Dale asked if there was a clown unit in Al Kaly. She called her dad and asked, and he replied that there was one now. Billy checked with the Potentate to see what he needed to do and was told that he needed eight clowns for the circus that weekend. He got eight of his fellow Drum Corps members to dress up as clowns and be there. Through his efforts to organize the clowns, he became an honorary clown, "Ornery", and dressed for the occasion. He helped recruit the fifteen or so clowns that became members of the new unit.

Billy was part of the Drum Corps, which his brother Kenneth had started. The Drum Corps was his primary unit all these years. Even though it is inactive now, he and Jean, his wife of sixty-three years, still go and meet with the group for dinner once a month.

After his service in the US Army Air Corps, he worked for the Telephone Company. One afternoon he overheard Jim Stivers and Bob Mahan talk about motorcycles. He invited

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them over to the living room where they figured out how to start the Potentate's Motor Escort with Kawasaki motorcycles from Don Bymaster's shop.

Billy and Jean were members and served as Wagon Master for the Nomads and held a Mystery Trip to Estes Park. They also organized a group to go to Branson for the entertainment. Billy and Jean loved the Nomads, and all the

trips they took with them.

Billy is still involved with the Colorado Springs Shrine Club where he served as President in 1963. He then stayed on as Secretary for another twelve years. He is on the Board again, helping the Shrine Club with his experience, wisdom and history. He reminisced of the times when the Shrine Club had a New Year's Eve Ball, and dinner was served at midnight to allow them to sort themselves out before going to breakfast, after

the dance was finally finished.

On a personal note, Billy saw Jean when he was a junior in high school, asked her name, called her that night and went to meet her folks. He later told his friend who had identified her that she was the girl he would marry. He went into the US Army Air Corp where he was a Pharmacist when he turned 18. They were married when he got back from his posting in Newfoundland, where he served as a Pharmacist. On two occasions, while in Newfoundland, Billy had an opportunity to accompany a medic team that flew to a tiny air strip in France, loaded the wounded, and flew back to Newfoundland. The wounded were then flown on to the US. Billy said, "Those trips served as a one-way vacation for me".

Outside of Shrinedom, Billy has enjoyed being part of the Civil Air Patrol. He talks proudly of being part of four Search and Rescue teams that were sent out to look for



Elections and Installation are over...your new High Priest and Prophet would like to take this time to wish everyone a wonderful 2011,


both in their private and Shrine lives. I hope Santa was good to all and the Easter Bunny finds you with plenty of goodies.

I would like to thank the membership for giving me this great leadership opportunity. As Ill. Sir Allan has said, "Shriners Wear MIENTAL GUIR

Many Hats", the hat I am going to wear today is as Al Kaly's Membership Co-Chair.

While attending a Membership Seminar in Tampa this fall, I learned a disturbing statistic - Al Kaly Temple has lost 27% of its membership over the last 6 years.

There was also some very good information presented at the Membership Seminar. I learned about the beashrinernow.com website that is designed for people looking for information about becoming a Shriner. The website has a lot of information about the Shrine, its Hospitals, and the many other great opportunities that the Shrine can provide. It allows one to sign up for Shrine Membership on-line and to have a Virtual Mentor from the closest Temple assigned to them. Nobles interested in becoming a Virtual Mentor can either contact me or go on-line to the shrinersvillage.com web site.

Our goal for 2011 is to increase members 6% this year, by getting 1 new Noble from every Blue Lodge (equaling 41 candidates) and 1 new Noble from each Club and Unit (equaling 35 candidates). Using this as our goal, if half the Clubs and Units could come up with one new candidate by our April 16th Ceremonial, we could see 38 new Nobles added to our Membership Roster. Then, if the other half can add one before the end of the year, we would meet our 2011 goal.

Membership is important to the survival of any organization, and Al Kaly is no different. The Board of Directors of Al Kaly Shriners is here to help, but this is something that every member of Al Kaly needs to get behind. Let's turn Al Kaly's membership decline around in 2011!

2010 FINANCIAL REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

For those who weren't in attendance at the annual communication in January, I want to let you know that 2010 was a good year for the Al Kaly General Fund. However, in the Transportation Fund, we finished with a net loss as we helped a lot of kids, but didn't do as well as we hoped on donations. Here are the highlights of what I reported to the Nobility for 2010.

In the General Fund, we finished with an operation surplus of about \$21,600. This achievement was due to the efforts of the many Nobles and Ladies who actively supported our fundraisers such as the cash calendar and raffle, the golf and basketball tournaments, and all of the other fundraising events. Our success is also attributable to the generosity of the units and individuals who made donations to the Al Kaly General Fund. I must also thank the members of the Board of Directors, who, in every activity we undertook, worked to find the least expensive way to accomplish the task. In addition, we had a gain in our investments of over \$2,000.

For the CSSA business session, we finished with an operating surplus of just over \$900. My thanks to IS Dave Stevens for reducing the costs as we realized that attendance (read registration fee income) was going to be quite a bit less than expected.

In the Transportation Fund, we finished with an operating loss of \$14,300. Patient travel to the various hospitals was pretty high this year. A quick count shows over 100 patient trips that we assisted families with, as well as the many children who were seen through the telemedicine clinics. I send out a special thank you to every one who donated to our Patient Transportation Fund in 2010.

As we move ahead into 2011, we again need your support. While we have done a lot of work to slash our operating costs, in many cases we will find our cost reductions being eroded by inflation and other economic factors over time.

Al Kaly Ambassadors

As the new year begins, the appointment and role of the Al Kaly Ambassadors has dramatically changed. The job of an Ambassador is to represent Al Kaly Shrine in those Lodges located within our boundaries. In doing so, Ambassadors are to promote the Shrine and keep those Lodges informed of our activities.

The Ambassador is to provide materials as necessary to those interested in becoming Shriners. This year, for the first time, we are using the same approach as the Grand Lodge in assigning District Lecturers to Lodges within the State. Each Ambassador is assigned one or more Lodges which he is to visit at least once a quarter during the year.

We have attempted to identify those District Lecturers that are Shriners, and assign them those Lodges that they are already required to visit each quarter. We hope to put informational packages together for our Ambassadors, as well as provide posters for each of the Lodges to post, not only within their Lodge, but to distribute for display within the associated community. We believe this would be a great way to promote the Shrine and assist the Membership Committee in recruiting new members.

We intend to maintain an open dialogue between the Ambassadors, in order to exchange ideas regarding recruitment. Each Ambassador is to provide a quarterly report to the Chief Ambassador, who will compile the results of all our activities. The results of the quarterly reports will be provided to the Potentate. Of special interest will be how the Ambassadors are received in the Lodges and any methods/approaches they have utilized in gaining membership.

We are always open to suggestions regarding this approach and how it may be improved.

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Ruhamah Temple No. 71 - Daughters of the Nile

History for Daughters of the Nile 100th Anniversary

Ruhamah Temple No. 71, Pueblo Colorado Compiled and Written by PQ Norma Harre

Quoting from first Queen, PQ Hazel Boyce's notes regarding the founding of our temple:

"In the summer of 1945 a number of us accompanied our Shriners to an Imperial Session in San Francisco. During our stay there we heard much of Daughters of the Nile. On our return trip home our enthusiasm was truly awakened as we stopped at the Shrine Hospital in Salt Lake City. It was there that we were educated as to the wonderful work of the Nile temples for the hospitals and also the Convalescent Relief Fund which does so much for the children as well as the hospitals. It was right there that Ruhamah Temple was born in our hearts."

We set May 4, 1946, as the date. On May 3rd, Ruhamah Temple No. 71 was instituted by the Supreme Officers. On May 4th, sixty one Charter Members were initiated by Queen Evelyn Thorn and her officers of El Mejdel Temple No 47, Denver. After the Ceremonial, the Supreme Officers installed our Officers in a beautiful ceremony attended by our husbands, newspaper reporters and photographers, and Ruhamah Temple became a reality."

Her notes continue: "Previous to the instituting ceremonies I was informed that I was chosen to be the first Queen. We chose the name 'Ruhamah' for our temple name which is the Egyptian word for "Compassion" and is found in the Book of Hosea of our Holy Bible, Chapter 2, and Verse 1." PQ Hazel said, "I believe that without compassion, we would lose much of the beautiful teachings of our order".

When the temple was only four weeks old, several of the members went to Sacramento to their first Supreme Session. A special train was planned to pick up delegates and members from New York City to Sacramento. Four from Pueblo left on this train. Several of our Ladies in Colorado Springs went down to see the train as it stopped there, and after it left and they had witnessed the joy of seven or eight cars of women gathered up from New York to Colorado, they had a little meeting, dashed home, packed their bags and good natured Noble Marvin Allen drove them non-stop to Sacramento. PO Hazel's notes read, "You can imagine our surprise when we saw them and those next few days will always be among our happiest memories. The chairman of music for the Supreme Session, Mable H. Betz, wrote a song "White Rosebud" in honor of the incoming Supreme Queen. Our Pr. Recorder, Charlotte Strieby was requested to sing this song and after that it seemed to us that the whole Supreme Temple went all out to make us happy that we were Daughters of the Nile."

The temple was fortunate to have the help and good will of Al Kaly Shrine who presented a check for \$100.00 with which to start our sewing projects. We also met in their Temple for more than three years, rent free.

Following the war there was a terrific shortage of everything, and to purchase paraphernalia was almost impossible. One day Irene Creason, who worked at Herman's Department Store, phoned Hazel that they had just received a full bolt of white satin. Hazel went out there on the run, purchased the whole bolt and by the first fall session, she had made the beautiful white altar cloth, throws for the kneeling benches, a charter drape, dyed enough material green and gold to make attendants costumes and had enough satin left for a queen's robe. To make the robe she had to double the material for weight and lacked the amount to make it full enough for beauty, but they used it for five years.

The crescent pedestals were used oak cast-aways from a Denver Eastern Star Chapter and cost \$25.00 and

were painted gold to make them look more Egyptian. A banner was purchased for \$34.95 in February, 1955, during Queen Margaret Fees' year.

On October 28, 1946, El Mejdel Temple, Denver, presented us with our first rose hand made by Princess Daisy Smith of Denver with a "wand" for the Marshal, our first Bible and veil. The Ladies in Waiting all wearing identical gold crepe gowns, each presented the Temple with a Nile green quilted silk pillow with gold fringe and respective emblem hand embroidered on each in honor of Queen Hazel Boyce.

Pr. Recorder, Charlotte Strieby, wrote "Bless Our Temple" which we use for our opening ode and when the Supreme Queen heard it at her Official Visit to our Temple in February, 1947, she invited Charlotte to sing it at Supreme Session the following June. Many Temples now use this song as their opening ode. We should be very proud of this because it is not often that an organization has a song written especially for their opening ode. Charlotte also wrote a closing ode to the music of "Bless this House":

One of the first commitments the temple made was to plan a gift for the opening of the new Shrine hospital the following year. The Ladies made 50 youth size quilts, as it was to be a 50 bed hospital. The quilts were finished on time and were on display at the opening services for the hospital.

The first Alligator Party was held January, 1947, and by 1957, it had grown to an attendance of 225. The spoof "initiation" made Ladies of the Household Spouses, members of the Ancient Order of River Nile Alligators. This tradition still continues to this day.

The first anniversary Banquet and Ceremonial was held May 3. 1947. It was a very elaborate affair with linens and candlelight served by the Alligators. Eighteen new Princesses were initiated.

Skyline Club was formed in 1956. They first sold

Fruit Cakes, but later changed to selling Pecans. From 1958 through 2003, the club sold over 38,000 pounds of Pecans---that's 19 tons. In 1988, I calculated their sales in dollars and determined at that time they had sold \$55,395.00. All profit from Pecan sales was given in the form of stepping stones to the CEF Fund or sizable yearly donations to the CRF Fund. Unfortunately, as the years went by and the number of members in the Canon City area dwindled, they disbanded in November, 2004, but what a legacy they left us with.

Our present banner was presented to the Temple in January, 1995, by P.Q. Bess Wyant in memory of her sister

and our first Queen, Hazel Boyce. The sequin work was done by P.Q. Norma Harre and it was constructed by Pr. Elvera Hahn.

The lighted emblem was presented to the Temple in 1988, in memory of our life members Princesses Martha Lewis, who served as Floor Director for many years; Florence Behm, who served as Recorder and then Banker for many years and the presenter's mother, Frances Gardner who was a fifty-year member.

Queen Hazel wrote in her farewell speech at the end of her two-year reign as our first Queen, "I wish to record here, my thanks for your steadfastness in your efforts. It is my earnest belief we cannot know the results of these two years' toil in such a short space of time. Only the seed sown can be recorded, but it is my hope in years to come, we may reap some harvest that can trace its source back to these constructive years".

In closing, I think we can truly say the first seeds were sown in fertile soil. I am very proud, as I know each and every one of you are, to be a member of this Temple. Let us pledge ourselves today, to continue tending those seeds of love and service that were sown so many years ago, to nourish and care for them, that we may always reap the harvest of caring friendships and the sharing of our talents and possessions to benefit God's special children in the Shrine Hospitals.


CLOWNS OF ALKALY
