Our Featured Member Our Founding Fathers Billy and Walter's Dream

The other night I found myself across the table from the most unusual man—a popular actor and Mason, yet a man most reachable and interesting. His name is William Jermyn Conlin, more commonly known as William J. "Billy" Florence. Billy told me about an organization he and his friend Dr. Walter Fleming had begun and which was growing rapidly. Their Masonic friends had wanted a new club where they could bring their lady-friends and wives and enjoy good times and a tip of the glass or two. These Masons pitched in with ideas; however, Walter did most of the work. He winked at me with that comment but explained his acting career had kept him busy touring in the United States and abroad while the foundations were set to paper. Walter is known for his imagination and highly colored descriptions and used this gift to create the theme, costumes and ritual of this new group.

In asking the common questions I find Billy was born July 26, 1831 in Albany, New York. He was made a Mason October 12, 1853, a member of Mount Moriah Lodge Number 155 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and a year later went into Zerubbabel Chapter Number 162, and then into Pittsburgh Commandery Number 1 that same year. Wait...did he say 1831? I'll get that corrected here in just a minute. Billy relates a short time after the conferring of these degrees he left for Europe on a working vacation where he was filming his latest movie. During his time in France and Algiers he visited several local organizations where men of like mind joined for the fellowship and contemporary entertainment they provided. It was these organizations which, just a few years ago, gave



him the idea for the "Club" his friends wanted.

At age 40 on April 16, in a Special Communication of Aurora Grata Lodge of Perfection, he was proposed, received, referred for investigation, immediately favorably reported upon and elected. At this meeting he remembers he was considered an actor by trade and called the Metropolitan Hotel home. On June 16 Noble Florence and Noble Fleming conferred the first degrees of their new organization—they call it the "Shrine"—on four Knights Templar and seven Consistory members. They became the first members of Gotham Temple, later to be renamed Mecca Temple, which was then chartered September 26, 1872. 1872?? I've got to get this figured out.

When he was 46, on April 21, William Conlin had the degrees of the Scottish Rite "up to and including the Thirty-second Degree" conferred on him. This was done by Brother Charles McClenachan, a member bearing the Thirty-third Degree title, and a close friend of his. He speaks highly of Brother McClenachan as an upstanding Mason and a friend. The pomp and circumstance of this occasion took place in the elegantly appointed Metropolitan Hotel in New York City which Conlin, aka Florence, still called home at that time.

Noble Conlin/Florence is proud of having conferred the Degrees of this new "Shrine" on Noble Sam Briggs who later became Potentate of Al Ivoran Temple for the 25 years '76 to '01 and Imperial Potentate from '86 to '99.

As Dr. Fleming was not able to be with us Billy began to tell me about him. Walter was born June 13, 1838 in Portland, Maine. He was a well loved and well known doctor who joined the Masons February of '69 in Rochester, New York, Rochester Lodge 660. When he moved to New York City and joined Aurora Grata Lodge of Perfection he also joined the Consistory; that was May of '71. Dr. Fleming was honored with the Thirty-third degree in September '72. In April of '72 he had been elected Eminent Commander and was re-elected for four consecutive years. On the founding of Gotham (Mecca) Temple, Dr. Fleming was installed as Potentate and remained as such through '87. When the Imperial Grand Council was created in June 1876 (there's that 1800 again) Dr. Fleming became the first Grand Imperial Potentate. Later the "Grand" was dropped and the titles became "Imperial" and "Imperial Potentate".

Billy became quieter as he told me about his untimely death at the age of 60 while at the Continental Hotel in Philadelphia, November 19, 1891. His Catholic wife had last rites performed by the priest of St. Agnes Church although he was later buried next to his mother in plots he had purchased many years before in the Protestant Greenwood Cemetery in Brooklyn, New York. Billy says Dr. Fleming has also died. This occurred at Mount Vernon, New York, September of

1913 and he is buried there in Kensico Cemetery.

I shook my head sharply trying to sort this out and woke myself up. Now I know why he kept saying 1831 and 1867 and I understand how he knew the details of his own death. But it was a wonderful dream; I mean, how many people have had coffee with the founder of the original Ancient and Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine? And...was it coincidence or did those two men intentionally name the order so the first letters of its proper name "AAONMS" when re-arranged spell" A MASON"?








2011 IN REVIEW




Nobles, Ladies, and Honored Ladies, another year





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Shriner Child SHRINERS CHANGE THE WORLD

Changing the world one child at a time is the Shriner way of doing things. Work with a child and help that child reach his/her highest potential. We do this as part of the Shriner Mission and yet, I met a family that is doing the same thing, changing the world one child at a time.

I had the pleasure of meeting Heather and Tom Tang on the Christmas Cog Railway train that was sponsored by PP Earl and Lady Shelia Aldrich's niece, Debbie, in early December. Tom

and Heather brought four of their children to see Santa and to ride the cog railway. Ella and Ian, the two youngest children, were adopted from China. Krista Pearman and Emilie were part of the dance class that the girls were in. Krista told Heather about the Shriners and their ability to help children with special needs. When investigating a second adoption, Heather saw the Shriner Hospitals listed on the websites of agencies that help a child who may have special needs.

Ian, who joined the Tang family at three and a half years old, is our Shriner Child. Before he was adopted, he had his first cleft palate surgery in China. Cleft palate requires multiple surgeries depending on the severity of the problem. He still has to have repairs done to his mouth, and a bone graft and orthodontia in the future. He started the journey to reach his fullest health potential with the Los Angeles Shrine Hospital. Tom and Ian took the first visit to the LA Hospital about a year ago where they met with Dr. McGee. He discussed a treatment plan that would correct Ian's nose to allow for better breathing and function. Last summer, Heather and Ian made a trip to start the surgeries that will be needed.

The first surgery was minor, but it was also the most painful part of his long list of surgeries. It required precision and a stint to be placed in his nose. It was painful and Ian managed to handle the pain pretty well. His nose will take about a year to heal to the place where it doesn't bother him. What impressed Heather so much was the fact that Dr. McGee drew pictures and explained the procedure carefully. He gave them his cell phone number and asked for frequent contact complete with pictures when they returned home. Heather and Ian were given a room in the hospital to sleep in so that he would be available for surgery first thing in the morning.

The love that surrounded Ian in the hospital from the staff was comforting and very real. With Dr. McGee directing them on the phone, Heather and Tom removed the stint after ten days.

Because Ian has a history of ear infections, he has a hearing loss that will be corrected with surgery once they are sure that his ear infections are under control. There is no nerve damage, so repairing his eardrum will restore his hearing, which will be done as soon as possible to develop his language. Currently Ian attends preschool

where he has speech therapy. Once his eardrum is repaired, his hearing loss will not be a barrier to his speech. When we remember that Ian didn't speak English when he came to his family, we marvel at the miracles that can happen in this world. He is a typical inquisitive boy who was able to love and accept love from a family far from what he had known. He recently discovered his older brother's Legos and has become a master builder. Ian moves with the speed of light as he entertains us with his remembrances of the trip to the hospital and the trip to see Santa on the Cog railway. The best part of that trip was the goodie bag, cookies, hot chocolate, the huge Christmas tree and, of course, Santa.

What an amazing family the Tangs have. It is so remarkable that they listened to their hearts when they wondered about adoption. They were led to help other children thrive and to guide and love these children. It is always a joy to meet the children and families and know that the Shrine does truly make the world better, one child at a time. We are so blessed to have this opportunity to be part of an organization that believes in and performs miracles.

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
A Christmas Treat for Shriner Hospital Children

December 3, a car on the Pikes Peak Cog Railway was filled with Shriner Hospital Children and their families. They went up the mountain looking for Santa and his




AL KALY MULE TRAIN
