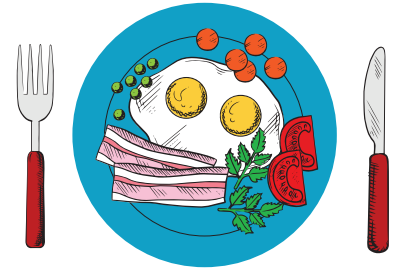

My Lady, Rhonda and I can't believe it's May already! Where has the time gone?

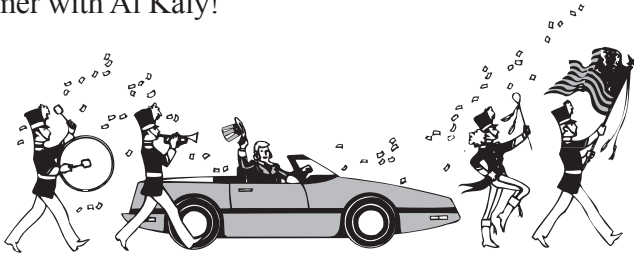

and not all of them will get used, or for that matter, even get acknowledged. But, this is not a reason to give up on the Temple.

Are you the Noble who only does things because you're going to get a point, or a silver or gold star? If this is you then you have lost the focus of what the Shrine is about.

When was the last time you invited a Mason, a friend or a community leader to a dinner or asked someone to come speak at a dinner? Are you the one assuming it's the Potentate's fault, or a certain group is running things, or the Potentate can't handle what's before him? And, if this is you, why are you not willing to help or is it just easier to complain? Noble, is this you? Are you Anonymous?

I must remind you, if nothing is ever said out loud to the Nobles or Divan then we will never know there is a perceived problem. Sometimes, what we believe in our hearts to be a problem, could be a personal issue.

Sometimes, it's not. Too often, it is easier to say nothing, perhaps out of fear, and wait till you're amongst your group to complain. Noble, is this you?

The Noble who says things are bad but isn't willing to step up and do something is just being anonymous. Noble, is this you? Are you Anonymous?

wearing a Masonic ring and asked about it. A few years after his military career, he saw a friend also wearing one and thought it was just for “rich folks”. After finding out more about the Masons, he joined.

Joining the Army proved to have a very special “side-effect”. While James was stationed at Ft. Carson, he and a buddy went to a very crowded bar in Pueblo. They walked in and clear across to the other side of the room, they spotted a very attractive young lady (Liz) and made a pact: the first one who could get to her got to ask her to dance! His buddy took the path of least resistance and went around the outside of the room. James took the shortest route and pushed his way right through the crowd, including across the dance floor! He asked her to dance, she accepted and after dating for about 2 years, they tied the knot. Today they have four kids and 7 grandkids - a truly loving and happy family. James and Liz love family activities, laughing, and especially dancing. They have been dancing

together for 32 years!

Go back about 26 years. James’ son was born missing a foot. The Army provided a prosthetic – a rigid “foot”. Soon the boy’s school bus driver asked James if he had ever heard of the Shriners. He referred them to the Shriners who sent them to a clinic and then to Salt Lake City where their son was fitted with a proper prosthetic which had flexibility. It made all the difference in the world. He played all kinds of sports, including wide receiver in football! That’s a lot of hard running! James and Liz have never let him think he was handicapped in any way. James joined the Shrine as a way to give back because there was no way he could ever repay the costs and the peace of mind for everything the Shrine had given his family.

In 1990, James and Liz went home to Corpus Christi for Christmas. While he was there, his father passed away and the couple decided to move to Texas to run his dad’s business. James’ mother also had cancer which progressed to her brain and she passed away 14 months after his dad. In a sad coincidence, Liz’s dad was then diagnosed with cancer so they moved back to Pueblo to be close to her

James is this year’s Chief Rabban. He was born in Corpus Christi, Texas, the youngest of five children. His mom was a notary and court stenographer; his dad was a pharmacist in the Navy and was in the Midway battle. After the war, his father worked at the Naval Air Station in Corpus Christi as a locksmith and owned his own shop.

James graduated from Moody High School in Corpus Christi, then attended community college with a major in accounting as he wanted to become a CPA. Through school he worked in his father’s locksmith shop. Seeing his dad’s struggles he was determined he would NEVER become a locksmith! His father, however, was determined he WOULD. He still believes he was forced to work in the shop as punishment! But today he is glad he learned the trade.

Not wanting to follow in his father’s locksmith “shoes”, James joined the Army to escape the business. For 8 years, he was a truck driver, mechanic, cook and driver for a colonel and a substitute driver for the sergeant major. One day, he noticed the sergeant major’s primary driver was

family. James worked for a trash company, Coca Cola, and Budweiser, but those were short term jobs. Needing something more permanent to support his family, he found a locksmith shop and went to work there. The owner picked up James' training where his father had left off and 10-12 years later, the owner retired.

After a lot of soul-searching and discussions with Liz, they decided he should take a risk and start his own locksmith business. It turned out to be an excellent decision and now Pueblo Lock Doc is a thriving and growing business with some interesting stories.

One story in particular involved a safe. A funeral home had bought a damaged safe at auction, had it refurbished and the safe door repainted. They had James come in to change the combination. To do that, he had to remove the back panel of the door. When he started loosening the panel screws, a \$20 bill fell out. Thinking maybe one had gotten stuck there he continued, but when he loosened it a bit more, more \$20 bills slid out. James called the funeral home director to come in and stay with him while he got the panel off. By the time he was done, around \$5,000 in \$20 bills had fallen to the floor. There was no way to trace the owner since the safe had been bought at an auction and had no ownership records.

James enjoys cooking, especially with his smoker and everyone at the Pueblo Shrine Club will attest to his skills! He also enjoys baseball. 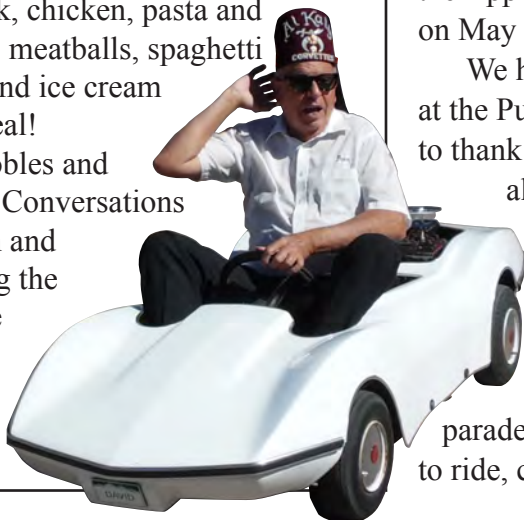

PROVOST GUARD

Jim Gibson

First, I would like to welcome out newest member, Brian Carter, to the unit. Brian has already started practicing for the upcoming competition at CSSA, Branson, Mo. by shooting with Paul Nigro and myself at Whispering Pines shooting range here in Colorado Springs.

Talking about CSSA, we are looking for more nobles who might be interested in shooting with us. Part of the problem in finding nobles interested in joining us is they think they must perform some type guard duty as a member of the Provost Guard. They might, also, think they must meet requirements such as having to be from a law enforcement background, or past or present military. Well, those are requirements to be part of the unit's Security Team but the unit has another entirely different unit—the Al Kaly Shooting Team.

When the shooting team gets together we shoot either pistols or shotguns preparing for the upcoming Provost Guard shooting events at CSSA. You can still be a member and shoot with us even if you do not want to compete at CSSA but, you do have to a member of the Provost Guard for insurance purposes and our dues are only \$15.00 a year. Also, we are not a parade unit so you won't have to worry which unit to parade with. If you want to compete we do not require you to shoot all of the events at CSSA, just ones you are interested in.

Here is a list of the events available at the CSSA competition.

PISTOL

The Balloon Shoot

Here your target is set at 25 yards with about a 6 inch balloon stapled to the target frame on the bottom right side. Then you shoot at the balloon until you break it; easier said than done. Then, once you break the balloon you shoot at the paper target for score. I think you have 10 minutes to perform this event.

Optic Pistol Shoot

At this event you shoot a pistol with an optic for a sight, usually a red dot or something like it. Here you shoot 10 rounds at 10, 15 and 25 yards and you have 3 minutes at each distance. You can only load 5 shells at a time so you will either need a speed loader for a revolver, a second magazine for a semi-automatic pistol or be a fast manual loader.

Regular Shoot

This is exactly the same as the optic shoot EXCEPT you cannot use optics, just regular iron sights.

The target for these events is the official 25-yard pistol target. The bullseye is black but in the past they have let you put a small orange circle in the center for an aiming point.

SHOTGUN

Trap

A round of trap is 25 targets and we shoot 4 regular rounds. We usually shoot a round then take a break and proceed to the next field and shoot 25 there. We continue shooting until we have shot all 4 rounds for a total of 100 shots.

Sporting Clays

Here we shoot a regular round of 100 targets. Usually at 10-12 different shooting stations where you might shoot at clay birds flying away from you, toward you, on the ground in front of you, angling from you or any other way they might want to try. It really is a fun event.

These events are on Thursday and Friday then Friday evening we have the banquet and award ceremony. And don't think you cannot win a trophy because they give a trophy for lowest score on trap.

It would be nice to get some more nobles interested in these events. In Trap and Sporting Clays a team consists of 5-man teams and right now we only have 2, maybe 3 to shoot on our team. This is alright because they have individual trophies as well as team trophies, but we would like to have a full team.

And ladies, there is a team for women so long as your husband or father is a member in good standing with the unit.

FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

It is natural to associate the fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children. Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fundraising activities, including circuses, to make certain that such activities comply with the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe that his money will be used for the Hospitals when all or a portion thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

Your specific attention is called to the following fraternal and charitable bylaws:

335.3 USE OF NAME “SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN.” The use of the name “Shriners Hospitals for Children” or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fundraising activity by a temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the board of Trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

503.10 The use of the name “Shriners Hospitals for Children” or reference to the hospitals in connection with any commercial product or business enterprise is prohibited unless the written consent of the Board of Directors and Trustees has been first obtained.

Now, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Fundraising for Fraternal Purposes:

No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated of

a. An appendant corporation shall engage in any fundraising activity without the express written consent of the temple having jurisdiction thereof.

b. There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

c. The temple potentate shall carefully examine all phases of the advertising, promotion and solicitation to determine that it complies with 335.3 and 503.10 of the fraternal and charitable bylaws.

d. The temple potentate must approve the terms and provisions of any contract for a fundraising activity after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, and additionally, as may be required the temple bylaws.

e. A copy of the temple potentate’s written consent shall be mailed to the Executive Vice President – Shriners International. Further, such written material pertaining to the fundraising activity, as requested by the Executive Vice President – Shriners International, shall be promptly mailed to him.

2. Fundraising for Charitable Purposes:

a. No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any charitable fundraising activity other than for Shriners Hospitals for Children. Permission therefore must be first obtained in writing from the temple potentate. The temple potentate must then obtain written permission from the Chairman of the Boards of Directors and Trustees. This request for written permission shall be sent to the Executive Vice President, Shriners International, P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, FL 33631-3356.

However, a joint charitable fundraising activity with another 501c3 charity may be authorized provided that a minimum of 50 percent of the net proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and the chairman of the boards of directors and trustees determine, on a case by case basis, that it is in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children and they grant their written permission for the activity.

b. 100 percent of net proceeds (as defined in the Charitable Fundraising – Approval and Reporting provisions of this General Order) from charitable fundraising must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children except for such portion thereof as may be permitted to be retained for the temple Shrine Hospital Patient Transportation Fund, pursuant to the Special Purpose Funds provisions of this General Order. Provided, however, if the Chairmen of the Boards of Directors and Trustees determine for good cause shown, that the law of the land requires that a portion of the net proceeds must be distributed locally, then they may, if they determine it to be in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children, grant their written permission for such distribution.

c. The temple shall report the results of each charitable fundraising activity within sixty days of the activity, pursuant to the Charitable Fundraising – Approval and Reporting provision of this General Order.

d. This section shall not apply to activities exempt under 335.4b of the bylaws of Shriners International.

e. Each independent corporation or entity that receives the permission of the Chairmen of the Boards of Directors and Trustees to raise money for Shriners Hospitals for Children, and which does not have its financial statements audited pursuant to 334.5 and 337.8 of the bylaws of Shriners

International, shall have its financial statements audited by a certified, chartered or licensed public accountant shall submit such audit report to Shriners International within 120 days of the activity.

3. Statement of Purpose and Disclosure:

a. Every fundraising activity must contain factual information on its solicitation material, tickets, programs and documents, including electronically transmitted material, regarding the use of the proceeds.

Examples: "Proceeds are for the benefit of (____ Shriners) (____ shrine club) Activities." "Proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children."

b. Every fundraising activity which is not entirely for the benefit of Shrines Hospitals for Children shall prominently state on the solicitation material, tickets and documents that "payments are not deductible as a charitable contribution."

c. There must be compliance with the Revenue Act of 1987 provision of any existing general order by U.S. temples.

4. Compliance with Applicable Laws:

It is the responsibility of the temple potentate, after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, to determine that there is compliance with all applicable laws in its jurisdiction for the temple's fundraising activities.

5. Financial Records:

a. The temple shall maintain detailed financial records pertaining to all fundraising activities involving nobles, clubs, units, organizations of nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations. Details of all revenues and expenditures shall be maintained in such financial records.

b. The temple must retain such detailed financial records for a period of seven years.

c. There must be compliance with Financial Reporting on Charitable Funds and Activities provision of any existing general order.

6. Notification of Nobility:

A copy of the Fundraising Activities provision of this General Order shall be printed in the temple publication at least once every calendar year. If there is no temple publication, then a copy shall be mailed to each Noble in the temple not later than the last day in March of each calendar year.

7. Discipline:

Any officer, Noble or temple which violates a provision of Fundraising Activities is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of Shriners International.

Shriners Hospital for Children – Salt Lake City

I am honored to be one of Al Kaly’s representatives, along with Noble Phil Moss, on the Board of Governors at the Shriners Hospital for Children – Salt Lake City. We have a great staff, headed by the Chief of Staff, Dr. Kristen Carroll, an amazing doctor. The primary focus of the entire staff is to provide superb care for the kids regardless of their ability to pay. One of the benefits of serving on the Board of Governors is we get to learn first-hand about heart-warming stories of how children benefited greatly by

the excellent care provided at the hospital time after time.

Last year the hospital had a record year of over \$3 million for donations to the hospital, and, in comparison to the other 21 Shriner hospitals, performed very well against the criteria established by Shriners International Board of Trustees. I say very well, but in a system which rates the hospitals A, B or C, our hospital was rated B for 2017. This year the staff is working hard to become one of those few A-rated Shriners hospitals.

The improvement over last year is in many areas. Patient days are up 28%; average daily census is up 27.6%; discharge days are up 50%; average *(continued on page 34)*

Statistics presented March 2018 from Salt Lake City Shriners’ Hospital for Children

1. The Tampa Board of Trustees devised a new rating system for the hospitals. The hospitals are now rated A, B, or C. Salt Lake was rated B due to the amount of draw on the endowment to support operations. While the main focus is always outstanding care for kids “without regard for the ability to pay” an increase or stronger focus will be operating within budget, reducing the amount of draw from the endowment by increasing the unrestricted donations rather than restricted to special functions.

2. In 2017 \$3,144,433.75 in donations was raised. This is up from more than \$1.7 million in 2016 and 1.4 million in 2015. As above, much was restricted and the 2018 goal is to lower the amount of restricted monies donated. Unrestricted donations for SHC-SLC (our hospital) will go to International and then re re-directed to SLC for general operations. This will reduce draw on the endowment.

3. The Donor Development Committee of our Board of Governors has a 2018 goal of \$2 million in unrestricted donations. Some \$750,000 will be needed in restricted use for replacing lights in the operating rooms and wheelchair creation unique to each child. January 2018 saw \$427,000 plus in these donations.

4. Statistics for January are up from 2017 including patient days, daily census, discharge days and average stay length. Operations, outpatient surgery and clinic visits are up as well as physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech therapy. After all the increases we are over \$8000 under budget. We are off to a great start!

(continued from page 33) length of stay is up 49%; total outpatient visits are up 2.9%; physician clinic visits are up 2%; in-house radiology exams are up 7%; speech therapy is up 20.5%; in-house orthotics are up 1.6% and in-house prosthetics are up 23%. However, surgical operations are down 2.5% (we expect these to increase as summer approaches). More good news is the hospital is currently under budget despite these workload increases.

In 2017 our hospital in Salt Lake City cared for 5,403 patients from 31 different states and 321 patients from 11 different countries. While continuing to provide superb care to children remains the primary focus, members of the staff are also conducting important research to continuously improve how they provide care well into the future. The doctors, nurses, therapists, social workers, care management staff, interpreter services, volunteers and many others work hard every day; and the really neat thing to observe when you are there – they love working at the hospital.

This year, through March, donations to our hospital are even higher than they were last year. On September 15, 2018 the hospital will host its annual “Walk/Roll for Love” fundraiser at the hospital. Last year my family proudly represented Al Kaly at this event and we look forward to doing so again this year. Let me know if you would like to join us on this 1.5 mile walk at the hospital.

We had a great turnout for the Bowl-a-Thon at Harmony Bowl in Colorado Springs on April 8, 2018.

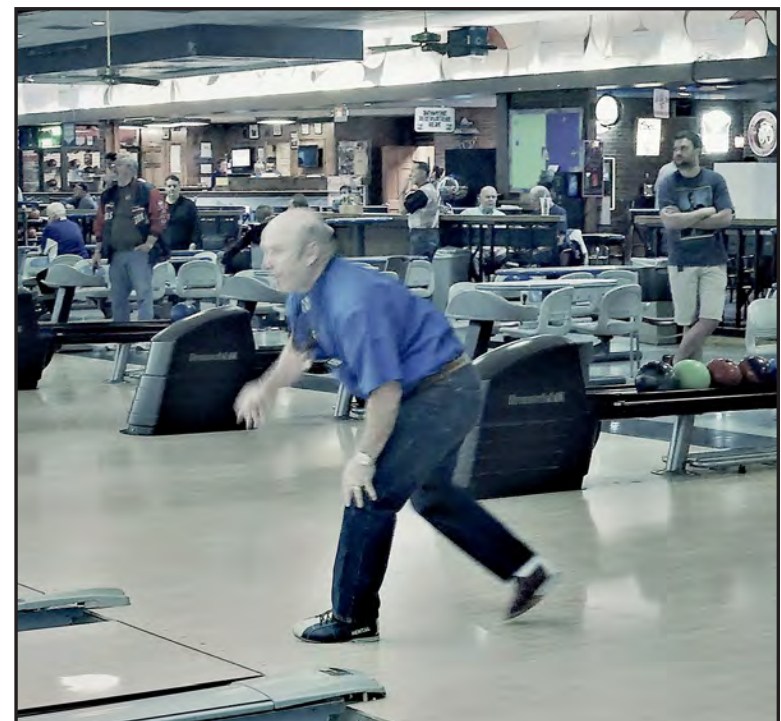
