BEST RECIPES SEARCH

In our continuing search for the best recipes from our Nobles (and Ladies) I was given this one from Dean Dooley of the San Juan Basin Shrine Club. After reading this mouthwatering recipe I immediately thought of The Bushwacker, a top-selling sandwich from a restaurant in Pueblo West just like this...it's fantastic!!

PASTRAMI REUBEN SANDWICHES

12 slices Russian rye bread
Butter for bread
18 thin slices Muenster cheese (Sargento is best)
1 can Bavarian sauerkraut (don't substitute)
Very thinly sliced beef pastrami – 4 per sandwich
Thousand Island dressing

Butter one side of the bread and lay out on waxed paper with buttered side down. Top 6 slices of bread with $1\frac{1}{2}$ slices of cheese. Add a generous layer of sauerkraut and 4 slices of pastrami. Top with another $1\frac{1}{2}$ slices of cheese. Apply a generous layer of Thousand Island dressing to the other 6 slices of bread and place them on top of the sandwich, buttered side will be up.

Grill sandwiches on medium heat for 4-5 minutes, cut in half and serve hot. Makes 6 sandwiches.




As summer draws to an end, it's been a great time! I hope you all have had as much fun as I have.


"Use WebFez to verify your personal information, payments, and Shrine Activity." When you received your 2019 dues notice, this statement was there along with guidance as to how to register for WebFez and Login information. About one-fourth of our



membership is registered into WebFez. Once registered and logged in you can verify and change your personal information to ensure it is updated. I'm not sure it would stand up in court; but, you can delete your Lady's name and type in a new one. Please take the time to register and stay current. The address is: webfez.shrinenet.org and follow the instructions.

We are also on a campaign to have current email addresses for all our members. With the WebFez program we also have the capability of storing your Lady's email address in our system. With your current email and your Lady's current email you can now both get the Weekly Update (Nuts and Bolts). Just let the Office know and we'll ensure both emails are listed for this weekly communication.

Some of our membership would rather have an electronic Dust instead of a printed copy. Again, let the Office know and we will get you on that list. Lady's too! Many of you travel or have winter homes away from your permanent address can stay current with the Dust. This helps us in that we can reduce the number of mailed Dusts saving us some money and it reduces the number Dusts returned by the post office because you are "temporarily away". Each returned Dust cost's us \$.57 - it adds up over a year's time.

OFFICIAL CALL OF THE POTENTATE...STATED MEETING AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Notice is given the Stated Meeting and Election of Officers of Al Kaly Shriners will be held at the Pueblo Shrine Club on December 14, 2018.

You will be called upon to elect the following officers: Potentate, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer, Recorder and Representatives to the Imperial Council.

To gain admission into this meeting, the Shriners International Bylaws require a member must be in possession of and present his current year's membership card.

Shriners International Bylaws Election Regulations: Shriners International Bylaws, paragraph 325.11, Election Regulations Electioneering.

A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited. Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Larry was born and raised in Santa Cruz, CA where his dad was a journeyman printer and his mom a beautician. They were long-time residents of Santa Cruz when Larry was born in the Dominican Hospital - just three weeks before Helen! He was two months premature so they kept him as in 1949, you had to be 5 pounds to be released from the hospital. Helen's cousin, Gayl, was born the day before she was and Gayl was the one who introduced them – a few years later, of course.



They met the first day of college at Cabrillo College in Aptos, CA. Both had led their high school pep bands and they both played saxophone – Helen needed one and Larry had an

extra one in his car.

Larry also played in the DeMolay band which played at the East/West games when they were played in California.

Larry was enlisted for his first 6 years in the Air Force. He had many assignments in the Air Force, from Lackland AFB in TX to Peterson AFB, including the Pentagon. He went to OTS and then to the Pentagon as the Computer Systems Engineer. He completed his BS in Computer Science at the University of Louisiana in Lafayette, LA. He completed his MA in Contract Management at Webster University in Colorado Springs and did some post-grad work at Walden University in St Louis, MO. Larry retired at the rank of Major in 1989. After retirement, he began a civilian career with Northrop Grumman and then Boeing. He retired again in 2016.

One of his Air Force assignments was to Woomera AB in South Australia in the outback. While they were there, the family took a trip in the outback in a Land Rover. They stopped at a gas station and son, David, wanted a pack of gum. OK, David (reluctantly).

About halfway home, the fuel gauge started dropping rapidly. It was discovered they had picked up a rock on the outback roads. Larry got under the vehicle and put his thumb in the hole the rock had made. They were in the middle of nowhere and wondered what they were going to do. There wasn't enough fuel left to get back to the gas station and Larry's thumb wasn't even a good temporary solution. They remembered David's gum so everyone started chewing gum as fast as they could. They plugged the hole with the gum and made it back to the gas station!

During their Australia assignment, they rescued and raised an orphaned baby kangaroo for about 6 months. They called her "Tilley" – short for Matilda. She slept in a pillowcase hung on the door. She'd jump in the pillowcase and sleep there. Larry was a teacher at the University of Maryland while they were there and Tilley became their mascot.

Larry's job was as a programmer in the program shop. He took over Computer Operations and, as a captain, had about 70 people working for him. He was also in community theater where he had the male lead in the play "Blithe Spirit". His daughter, Kimberley, played the ghost of his wife, Elvira.

Australia was their favorite assignment. The timing was perfect for their family – the kids were old enough to enjoy it. Larry was the educational liaison at the school there. In Australia, the high schools only go through the 11th grade; but you can leave school at year ten.

After 10th grade, most go right into the work force. The students in the 11th grade are deciding what subject they are going to study in 12th grade. You go to year 12 if you are going to go on to the university and you have to have a certain grade point average to even go on to the university.

Larry arranged for curriculum to be made available so the American students were able to complete the graduation requirements according to the American standards. Their daughter was valedictorian since she was the only one in her class! In his position as liaison, he actually took some of the students to Adelaide about 4 hours away where they went to a rock concert with Iron Maiden. It was his first exposure to hard rock!

Larry's introduction to "Shrinedom" was at an East-West game in California. He saw a Shriner playing soprano sax near him and decided he wanted to play saxophone like that Shriner. He played all through high school and college, but always had the desire to wear a fez. They moved back to Colorado Springs in 2002 where he became a Mason in Ramah Lodge #165. He was Master of the lodge in 2008, Wise Master of Scottish Rite in 2006, and is now a Past Master and Secretary of his Ramah Lodge. He is also a member of York Rite. He has been Secretary, Treasurer, and President of the Al Kaly Band, playing his sax and enjoying the fun of being a Shriner. In 2017, Larry and Helen went

to the East-West game in Florida after picking up their son Phillip (a drummer) and grandson Gus (also a drummer). During the tailgate period, they got to play their music on the field!

Their daughter lives next door and has season tickets to the USAFA football games so they go to some of the games. She used to be the ambassador for the AF Intelligence Agency at San Antonio and would go on to represent the general at special events for the Alamo Descendants. 
