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

Featured Member Bill Worthen by Charlotte Burrous

When he joined Eureka Lodge No. 66, Cañon City resident Bill Worthen expected to find a pristine building, where he would become a part of its tradition.

Instead, he found a building that needed a lot of love and attention. The dilapidated building had junk strewn all over a bowed floor with plaster falling in. Outside the lodge, he found a disheveled wood pile, which he could not stand.

He incorporated the help of his wife, Joan, to straighten the wood pile and clear out the junk from the lodge building.

It looked so much better that they took it another step and then another. Before long, they saw a vision of the

heydays of Coal Creek and fell in love with the whole concept of what it once was.

For their efforts, Eureka Masonic Lodge No. 66 received the Stephen H. Hart award from the Colorado Historical Society with special recognition to Past Master and current treasurer Bill Worthen along with project manager Joan Worthen earlier this year.

During the 23rd annual ceremony, the lodge received a Stephen H. Hart Award along with

seven other projects and individuals "that have impacted historic preservation in Colorado," a press release said.

The couple said they were honored to be recognized by the state. "We spent a lot of time and work in this place, but at least somebody noticed it," Bill said.

Originally, the couple began with getting the building placed on the State Historic Registry.

"That authorized us to be eligible for grants," Bill said. "We put in for five grants (for \$107,000) in nine years and successfully completed all of them within the time frame and under budget."

From the beginning, the couple along with help of their son, Bill Jr. and his wife, Linda Worthen, replaced the new footers. Under Bill Sr.'s supervision, Colorado State inmates removed the floor boards, numbered them, salvaged

and installed them.

As a result, the Worthen family renovated the kitchen, the bathrooms for handicapped accessibility, installed new doors, as well as a fire escape on the outside of the building, patterned after the original wooden one.

In addition, the Worthen's painted the interior, rebuilt the interior inside stairway and added a rail, re-roofed the building, replaced the skylight and the existing bead board wainscot as well as numerous other renovation efforts.

But Bill Sr. pointed out that Eureka Masonic Lodge members supported what they accomplished. Many of them live in Pueblo while others are unable to do the work anymore. In the future, the Worthen's plan to have the parking lot paved and install a fence around it. "Originally, we had eight lots and I traded around until we have five lots here in a row," Bill said. "Then we had the lines vacated and it's all platted into one lot for tax purposes."

Constructed of sandstone blocks native to Coal Creek and Rockvale, the two-story building was officially built as an Odd Fellows lodge, which was used until the 1940s. The building housed, at the same time, the Eureka Lodge No. 66

Ancient Free & Accepted Masons, who shared the building with other lodges until 1907 when a devastating fire burned most of the town. The next year, the members patterned the building after the original one and completed it in 1908.

Since then, the building has been used as a community gathering place, where numerous fraternal organizations meet, such as IOOF, Rebekah Lodge, Knights of Pythias and the Coal Miners Union.

The Eureka Masonic Lodge

celebrated its 100th anniversary last year and continues to meet on a regular basis in the lodge.

Bill Worthen received his first degree Jan. 11, 1965, at Henry M. Teller Lodge No. 144 in Denver. From there, he received his second degree on Feb. 22, 1965, and the third one on May 10, 1965. Along the way, he demitted from Denver via Fremont Lodge No. 97 and then Eureka Lodge No. 66, where he went through all of the chairs, becoming the master in 2000-2001. He joined the Scottish Rite on May 3, 1975, and in 1990, he joined the Al Kaly Shrine. He is currently a member of the Al Kaly Past Masters Shriners and the Fremont County Shrine Club. In the past, he belonged to the Al Kaly Foot Patrol.

Born Oct. 26, 1936, in Clayton, Mo., Bill married (continued on page 7)

IT'S A CARIBBEAN CRUISE!!!

Illustrious Sir Tom Holmes and Lady Sherry to the Southern Caribbean from October 10 to October 18. We hope you join us for some fun in the sun! Here is a brief overview:

Oct 10 – Overnight in San Juan.

Oct 12 – Day at Sea.

Oct 13 – Bridgetown, Barbados: though Barbados gained its independence from the British in 1966, it maintains a distinctly English flavor. From British products such as chocolate and china to the national pastime, cricket, the British influence.

Oct 14 – Castries, St Lucia: St. Lucia has been a part of the British Commonwealth since 1803. But prior to that, it was often occupied by the French, which is evident in much of the island's culture. Castries offers a colorful local market and great shopping. And the surrounding areas offer lush rain forests, striking waterfalls, beautiful beaches and Sulfur Springs - the world's only drive-through volcano.

Oct 15 – St John's Antiqua: First settled in the 1600s by the English, Antigua remained a part of the British Commonwealth until its independence in 1981. Today, Antigua is a popular vacation destination, attracting tourists with its ideal climate, 366 beautiful beaches, amazing landscape and leisurely lifestyle.

Oct 16 – Philipsburg, St Maarten: soon after the Spanish closed their colonial fort in 1648, the Netherlands and France signed a formal agreement to split St. Maarten in half, as it is today. Philipsburg displays its Dutch heritage in its architecture and landscaping. The island offers endless stretches of beach, beautiful landscapes and great shopping. Oct 17 – St Croix: St. Croix, the largest of the U.S. Virgin Islands, is a tropical dreamland complete with stunning beaches, clear aqua-blue ocean water, a small rain forest and rolling green hillsides. Danish influence is still apparent in the island's architecture and language. Though most of the sugar mills lie in ruins, you can still get a taste of the island's history in freshly squeezed sugar cane juice or Cruzan Rum. Oct 18 – Wake up in San Juan and flight home.

South Sioux City is across the Missouri River from Sioux City, Iowa, the home of Abu Bekr Shriners, the hosts of this year's mid winter meeting. The Mid Winter meeting is also referred to as the CSSA business meeting. The most important event was probably the election of officers for the 2009-2010 year. Our own Ill. We know we have to invest in our economy to help strengthen it. Let's support those businesses that support us on our way to helping make America shine again.



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

The point system in the Al Kaly Temple is designed to honor Nobles for their work in support of Temple activities. 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ANNUAL RECORDER'S SEMINAR

I attended the annual
Recorder's seminar in San Diego,
CA February 22-24, 2009 and will pass on some items that
may be of interest to you.

There were 44 new Recorders elected this year. This number seems to run consistently every year. Basically, it means that one-fifth of our Recorders are replaced each year. Along with things being replaced, as time moves on, the Shriners scimitar, the logo we've carried forever is being replaced by the Shriner fez on all literature, correspondence, and the web site. We in Al Kaly will also be replacing the scimitar logo as our existing supply of paper and envelopes are exhausted. Your 2010 dues card will have the new logo on it. Important stuff!!!

Most temples, including Al Kaly, have been in violation of Imperial by-laws on the suspension of members at the end of the year for non payment of dues. Prior to the December stated meeting, we must notify members that they are being suspended and they are given the opportunity to

defend or explain their upcoming suspension at this meeting. In all probability they won't show; but, they must be given the opportunity to be heard. Then, we must vote on their suspension.

Although we are not guilty, temples are not permitted to have contingency funds and the potentate is not permitted to have a "slush" fund. Again, we are not guilty; but, there sure was heavy emphasis on this item. All expenditures must be in the budget. Our Treasurer will get more of an ear full on this subject when he attends his seminar.

Sexual harassment is a problem plaguing temples. Be considerate to those of the opposite sex when at Al Kaly functions and be careful that you don't do or say anything that could be construed as offensive to them. Some training may be helpful. You'd be surprised what constitutes sexual harassment.



Of course membership is our main concern. Last year, Shriners net loss was 5.19 percent; this is two times more than the losses in our Masonic lodges. Here are membership stats for 2008:

Creations - 8,051 Suspensions - 15,473

Total losses – 19,509 which leaves our total membership as of December 31, 2008 at 356,112. At the time of this seminar there were 17 temples with a positive gain; however, our headquarters had not compiled all losses so this could be reduced.



A great big Thank You, is in order to all



PATIENT CARE SPECIALTY AREAS AT SHRINERS HOSPITALS

(article extracted from the Imperial, Shriners Hospital For Children flyer)

Orthopedics: Nineteen of the 22 Shriners Hospitals provide specialized orthopedic care to children with problems of the bones, joints and muscles, including congenital deformities, problems resulting from orthopedic injuries, and diseases of the musculoskeletal system. Some of the most commonly treated disorders include clubfoot, limb deficiencies and discrepancies, scoliosis (curvature of the spine), osteogenesis imperfecta (brittle bone disease) craniofacial abnormalities, and conditions related to spina bifida, cerebral palsy and muscular dystrophy. Burns: Recognizing a lack of pediatric burn care, Shriners Hospitals opened its first burn hospital in the mid-1960s. Since we first made a commitment to advancing burn treatment, a burned child's chance for survival has more than doubled.

Spinal Cord Injury: Three Shriners Hospitals operate programs that provide long-term rehabilitative care and intense physical, occupational and recreational therapy designed to help children with spinal cord injuries re-learn the basic skills of everyday life. Counseling is also provided to the patients, helping kids learn to cope with their injury and look forward to the fulfilling life that lies ahead for them.

Cleft Lip and Palette: About 5,000 children are born each year with deformities of the upper lip and mouth, and comprehensive care for these conditions is often difficult to obtain. Several Shriners Hospitals offer comprehensive care for lip and palate repair, nasal reconstruction, jaw surgery, dental procedures, and audio logical, speech and psychological services.

This month I would like to talk about one of Al Kaly's oldest Shriners and our senior band member, Clyde "Bus" Hoyt. Bus joined the Al Kaly Shrine Band back in 1955 (wow – 53 years ago!) as a symbols player and eventually took over the bass drum position. You might say he anchors the band with his steady beat!

Bus was born in Hiawatha, Kansas on July 14, 1915. Yep, he will be 94 years old this summer! [Note that the Shrine Band(s) were formed in 1918!] In 1921, when Bus was six years old, the family moved to Windsor, Colorado (near Ft. Collins). Then in 1930 another family move brought him to Colorado Springs, where he has maintained his home ever since.

At one point, Bus' Dad, who was in the construction business, slipped off a roof and was injured. During the two years it took him to fully recover, Bus supported the family with several paper routes. Later Bus formed his own construction company, Hoyt Construction. Among his many successful projects, he worked on the Myron Stratton Home and the Gazette-Telegraph Newspaper building,

finally retiring at age 62 (let's see – carry the 5 and divide by 3..., that would be in 1977).

Of course, like many healthy young men of his generation, Bus was drafted into the Army during World War II. Bus does not enjoy talking about the war years, but he did say that for the last two years of the conflict he was stationed in the Philippines, helping to mop up the remaining Japanese soldiers after Gen. MacArthur's return. At war's end Bus was sent to Tokyo, Japan and billeted at the (then out of business) Aichi Aircraft Factory until he was mustered out and returned to Colorado Springs.

Bus has had a lot of experiences in his long life! He married when he was 23 years old and he and his wife raised two children (Bus' wife passed away in 2000 after they had been married for 62 years). I had the pleasure of sitting down with Bus at his home to interview him for this article and, though I was only there for an hour, I could have stayed all afternoon to hear his stories and observations of life in America (and specifically, Colorado) over the many years. Bus, who has been a Shrine Band member since longer than anyone can remember, deserves our heartfelt appreciation for a long and successful life of service to the community and the Shrine organization and I for one look forward to being anchored by Bus' drum beat for many a parade to come!


