At the December 11, 2015 stated meeting the nobility approved letting Al Kaly Shriners ladies and children participate with units and clubs in civic parades under the provisions of Shrine law. The provisions are as follows....

"In civic parades, and non-shrine public appearances, nobles their ladies and children may participate with the approval of the potentate. Only nobles may perform, compete, ride vehicles with fewer than four wheels, or operate any vehicle while parading."

A unit or club meeting the above criteria that wishes to permit their ladies and children to participate in parades must complete a parade permission form and send it to the Al Kaly Office for potentate approval. When approved, a signed copy will be retained in the Al Kaly Office and a copy returned to the unit or club. The form is located under the "Forms" tab on the Al Kaly Web site or a copy may be obtained from the Al Kaly Office.

This form must be completed and on file before ladies and children can participate in civic parades.

It was a real treat to visit with 1st Ceremonial Master

Ray Singmaster and his wife Past Queen 2014, Daughters of the Nile Ruhamah Temple #71, LorAnn. They are both relatively new to the Masonic family, and that is one of the interesting parts of their stories.

First Ceremonial

Masonic journey in
2007and finished his
degree work in 2008
under the tutelage of
Noble Alex Pettigrew.
Noble Alex had a plan
from the time Ray asked
about Alex's Masonic
ring. FCM Ray had seen
and read "The Da Vinci
Code" and was attracted

to the fraternity aspect and the mystery and history of the Masonic Order. The rest, as we say, is history.

Once FCM Ray had joined the Masons and had done his degree work, he joined the Scottish Rite and is a 32nd degree. He then went into the Shrine in a

short form, joined the York Rite and is a Knight Templar. He is now a Past Master of Colorado Springs Lodge #76.

He jumped into the whole of the Masonic family, read constantly and attended so many meetings and with such frequency that PQ LorAnn really began to wonder what this was all about. Had she lost her husband to the Masons? After a few discussions on the subject, she decided to join in the fun and became a Daughter of the Nile in 2010.

FCM Ray's attraction to the Shrine is their care for children. As such he enjoys parading with the Flivvers, carrying the Silent Messenger (the Shriner emblem) in his truck. Serving and supporting the hospital system is his mission.

What is also remarkable about Ray is how he attributes the transformation of his life and how he interacts with the world to his love and study of Masonic principles. He has become more introspective and reflective; it has helped him to stop and consider his actions and the consequences of his actions. His curiosity has led him to study the mystery and secret teachings of each of the orders he has joined. He relates others have commented on the change they've seen in him. Being a Mason has

also been good for his marriage and for his relationships in general.

In his journey toward this transformation, Ray learned more about himself and it has made a huge difference in him. He has jumped into the Masonic family feet first and is loving it. He says he will continue to grow and learn as his study

and practice of the Masonic teaching goes deeper, since the Masons are about self, brotherhood and growth. "It answers questions that you didn't know you had," said Ray.





The body (the Nobles) votes on a Divan they trust will make decisions for the best of the Temple; they make it the Heart of the body per sae.



thank the Potentate, Divan, Nobles and Ladies for making me feel welcome in my role as First Ceremonial Master.




I hope to see many faces this year participating and enjoying all of the upcoming events.

# Barney's Chocolate Peanuts

One time, long ago, in Lamar I was sitting with a sweet little man, just gabbing away about life in general when I casually stated I needed a good recipe for munchies for an upcoming pot luck brunch. He says, almost as casually, "I have one if you want it."

That was the beginning of many pots of chocolate peanuts, thanks to Barney Miller. Barney has since passed away but his peanuts will live forever. If you need a good recipe for something like this or just think you might ever use it...keep this. These taste exactly like the chocolate peanuts you get in a specific high-end chocolate shop.

I bought all the items at Wal-Mart. I love one-stop shopping.

### **Barney's Chocolate Peanuts**

16oz Planters Dry Roasted Unsalted peanuts
16oz Planters Dry Roasted Salted peanuts
12oz semi-sweet chocolate chips
4oz bar German's Chocolate – broken into pieces
(green box)
2½ pounds Almond bark broken into pieces

Into a 4-5 quart crock pot, put all the above ingredients in the order they are listed. Cover with the lid and DO NOT REMOVE the lid for 3 hours. After 3 hours thoroughly mix the goo inside and drop onto foil or waxed paper to cool. (The peanuts hide in the bottom so be sure to get all of them away from where the bottom and side come together.)

This makes 180 reasonable sized pieces... but who wants to be reasonable?

# March is Cerebral Palsy Month, Wear Green

Sarah Pray is a delightful, bright and engaging sixth grader at Discovery Canyon Middle School. As we talked about school and her friends, she just bubbled with joy. Sarah really loves the Shriners and all they have done for her over the last nine years.

Mother, Chandra, knew "something was not

right" in the seventh month of her pregnancy with Sarah. After her birth things were not as Mom knew they should be when Sarah had not started or tried to walk as she should have. Her pediatrician said she was lazy when Chandra talked to him about it when Sarah was fourteen months old. Sarah was then sent to a physical therapist who thought she might have had a stroke and sent them to a neurologist.

They were living in California at this time and they discovered she had suffered a stroke in utero. It had a few effects, one of which was hemiplegia cerebral palsy. Hemiplegia translates to paralysis in layman's terms. It affected her right leg and left her with a bit of a stutter, which she has overcome. The credo of this family is "Cerebral Palsy doesn't have Sarah; Sarah has Cerebral Palsy". Her cerebral palsy doesn't rule her life, Sarah does. The doctors didn't think she would walk but she runs and dances and plays.

Sarah was three when the family moved to Colorado Springs. They were referred to the Al Kaly Clinic by a friend and then to the Shrine Hospital in Salt Lake. She has been seen at the Salt Lake Hospital for the past nine years, has had several surgeries and has received the benefit of the latest technology.

The first surgeries were to lengthen the tendons to allow her right foot to drop to floor level. The latest surgery, which was in June, was to place two plates on her right knee/leg to straighten a bow-leg on that knee. She went back seven months later and had the plates removed. The procedure was successful and she now is using the latest nerve stimulator technology which she wears to school. It allows her foot to be on the floor and helps her walk easier.

The biggest question right now is how long she will be able to use the forty-six thousand dollar device which the Shriners have loaned her for three months. She has

to go back to the hospital each month for three months so they can assess how it is working. Insurance doesn't think they should have to pay for it because it isn't permanently attached.

The worst part of all of the surgeries, according to Sarah was the second day when the anesthetic wore off from the plates in her knee. Before the nerve stimulator, Sarah wore a plastic leg brace which works but does not do

the job of bringing her nerves back alive and working like the nerve stimulator does. They are wondering what will happen after the loan period runs out.

Sarah loves school, after all that's where her friends are. She plays cello and viola and is looking forward to getting to play the saxophone next year. This year she was lucky enough to get to take part in building an underwater robot. There are three students to each robot kit and you have to follow the

instructions and learn how to solder, cut, and drill accurately.

The family has rescued Mario, a small chihuahua sized dog. Sarah loves animals and really like horses and riding. Learning to ride helped with her right leg and its development. The family has also served as a foster home for thirteen children who ranged from infants to teenagers. It was a great experience for the children and the family as a whole.

Chandra's grandparents were Masons and Eastern Star members. They are all so grateful to the Shriners for the attention and love given their family. It has given this bright, outgoing child a chance to have better mobility and more freedom of movement.

This is our basic list, but many other jobs are always popping up during the planning. It takes all of our members to make the circus a success. We start planning and setting up our circus in February. It is not necessarily done in this order, but the majority of the steps are listed.

We first contact the Jordan Circus and verify the actual date and times of the two performances. Not much can be done without this date set firmly. The Parks Manager is then contacted to reserve Ski-Hi Park and their billboard for the circus date. A Stampede representative is called to reserve the parking lot ticket booths and portable bleacher for the date.

Of course, we need printing so next we contact our printer and order the adult and children's tickets. Each year we have to make sure we get a different color than the previous couple years (for obvious reasons). We have to ascertain we can have delivery of these by April 1st so we can get them distributed to the proper people. And sometime before the circus date we need to get change for the tickets sold at the gate. We also need posters so those are ordered, distributed to Nobles and then taken out to businesses.

Insurance is checked and copies are sent/taken to the various people who need to know we have it.



When the tickets and posters arrive we get them to a meeting and distribute them to the Nobles who take them to Alamosa, Blanca, Ft. Garland, Center, Del Norte, Hooper, Mosca, La Jara, Antonito, Monte Vista and South Fork for display.

Now, we need to be nice to our Ladies so we can get volunteers to sell tickets, set up a roster/schedule and make a couple "cheat sheets" of ticket prices so the gals don't have to figure the cost of multiple tickets for each sale.

We send 2 adult and 4 children's tickets to all our Nobles and ask them to purchase them for their family or to give to someone they know or someone in need. We also send tickets to all our Honored Ladies, at no charge, for their use.

Sometime before the performances we make two posters directing attendees to "FORM LINE TO THE RIGHT" so we can eliminate confusion during the rush to come into the grounds.

Our Hospital Representatives try to find two of our child patients to talk during the intermissions. This doesn't always prove fruitful, but we try.

Contact is made with the Kalyklowns to see if they are available with their calliope and assure motel accommodations are available for them. Mountain View Restaurant is also contacted to verify they will be able to provide lunch and dinner for circus helpers at the necessary times and lunch can be served in a short time period to provide for a timely return before the second performance.

At sometime way before the circus date we make sure the Monte Vista ambulance is going to be present during the performances in case first aid is needed for any reason and police will be available during the late performance. Trash removal after the performances with an extra small dumpster near the elephants is set up. A handicapped accessible "potty" is arranged for those needing this.

The day before the circus a city representative goes through the facility to see its condition and a key is given to us so we can get going the next day. They assure any damage is noted and the restrooms are in working condition, clean and filled with soap, paper towels and toilet paper as well as seats, fences and other items are in good repair.

On the day of the circus we open at 7am so the circus people can set up their sets. We then set up the ticket booths, chairs and tall stools for the sellers about 10am.. The Eastern Star Ladies and Rainbow Girls are contacted before-hand to see if they can provide cleanup the day after and a donation is given if they can do this.

A Noble stands at every grandstand entrance as patrons leave so no one enters at this time. Then the facility is closed properly.

The parking area is another area of concern. We have to make Reserved Parking signs and set them where necessary, mark sections for special needs, and make sure we have cones (from the City). All gates need to be checked and opened or closed as necessary. Those Nobles in the parking lots (and all others) are given spare tickets to give away if appropriate. Our 3-Wheelers are used for the parking lot attendants to keep them from running too much.

Nursing homes are contacted early and tickets given to them. They make sure all residents have some type of identification, not only their name, but also with the specific nursing facility's name so any "wandering" persons can be returned to the correct area. The homes are asked to arrive no earlier than noon and to go directly to the appropriate gate where Nobles will be waiting to help get those in wheel chairs and with walking problems to their seats. We then direct them to the proper parking area for them or drive them to that area.

Snacks and beverages are provided for helpers, usually in the motor home of one of our members.

Thank you notes are a must and are sent during the following week to all non-Shrine persons involved in helping us provide the best circus experience possible.

There is a lot of work put into providing our community a top-notch circus and experience but we enjoy doing it.







When the grandfather learned Jaymie was taking Corbin to the hospital he arranged to meet them there. Then, during Corbin's second trip to the hospital, Jaymie arranged to extend the trip to the town in Idaho where his relatives live. This allowed Corbin to meet his many cousins and to



All of this happened because of a casual conversation our daughter had with a total stranger. I guess the moral of this story is to spread the word about what




we do. You never know what the result might be.



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

We will proceed to the Santa Fe Trail Encampment at Bent's Old Fort, reenacting the wagon train era through Colorado. And finally we will visit the Amache Internment Camp National Landmark where Japanese Americans were interned during World War II.

July 7-10: History of Fur Trade in the Rockies & Mountain Man Encampment. Here we will learn about the fur trade at the Fur Trading Days Festival in Chadron, Nebraska, with 3 days of films, reenactments and talks. We will then visit Fort Robinson National Historic Site to trace the US Army from the 1870 Indian Wars to the end of WWII.

September 23-26: History of Colorado Gold

Mining. Starts with a visit to the Colorado School of Mines Edgar Experimental Mine, which traces the techniques of mining from the 1970s. We will also visit the Argo Mine and Mill, where over 1 million ounces of gold were mined and refined. Finally, we visit Rocky Mountain National Park and a world class bourbon distillery, to enjoy brotherhood and the beautiful fall colors of our Rocky Mountains.
