

June was born in N. Easton, MA and raised in Manchester by the Sea. June's first name is Beatrice after her mother – her maiden name is Ericson. She had two older brothers and thought she could do whatever they could so she tried it all; she loves sports and even played football! She also played varsity basketball and field hockey. However, her true forte was swimming – after all, she was raised near the water. Her high school

classmates thought she would become the next Physical Education teacher in Manchester. In a small pond, she stood out in sports; in a large pond she said she was very average!

June's first year of college was Bouve' School of Physical Education, a very small girls college in Boston which no longer exists. After one year, she felt she needed to do something to help in the war effort so she joined the W.A.V.E.s. As the minimum age to join was 21 and she was only underage at 19, she had to promise to go back and finish college to enlist. She served for 2½ years then, as she had promised, she returned to Boston University and completed her bachelor's degree in education.

After graduation, she became one of the first four consulting teachers whose job it was to train all new teachers how to teach in a classroom situation at grade six. Then they brought in seniors (men or women) in some of the colleges. She just happened to get men from Harvard with degrees in liberal arts, not education. Most of the women requested the lower grades. Her adventures in completing her education is another story! Finally at age 50, she got her PhD in Administration and Supervision at Santa Thomas University in Manila.

June's aura seemed to put her in the right place at the right time. She was offered the opportunity to teach in the Department of Defense schools overseas. Being an adventurous young woman, she jumped at the chance and eventually became the principal at a DoD school in Japan. This turned out to be a fortuitous move.

At a PTA meeting, Colonel Donald Williams asked Miss Ericson if she would like to meet Bob Hope; of course, she accepted with enthusiasm. One of the Generals was hosting a cocktail party and Bob Hope was to attend. However, a typhoon interrupted those plans, so Col. Williams took June to dinner. When she ordered her beef rare, he decided he'd better marry her. After all, how likely would it be to find another lady who liked her beef rare?

Getting married overseas was no easy task for active duty military personnel. First, he had to get permission from the Army. Next, they had to pay the equivalent of 75 cents in Japanese currency to be married by the Japanese. Then they had to be legally married at the American Embassy. But, June just didn't feel she was married until she could be married in church so, after three ceremonies, she and Don

were finally fully and legally married!

Col. Williams served in World War II (including Utah Beach), Korea, and Vietnam. Life with Don was exciting and adventurous. She was the Language Arts Coordinator (English, Literature, etc.) for K-12 DoD schools for all of the military bases in the Pacific, including Japan, Philippines, Okinawa, Taiwan, and Midway. June traveled by plane the way most of us travel by car! Don was a great supporter of her adventurous spirit. Retiring after 36 years in the Army they traveled "Space A" to Thailand, Australia, New Zealand.

He was active in many facets of the Masons and Shrine. Holding an office in Sojourners, he told June she needed to learn how to use a computer so she could help him with those duties. So,

in her 70's, she took night classes in District 12 in Colorado Springs to learn how to use a computer!

With the Shriners in Massachusetts Don and June took a trip to Russia. On that trip she realized just how lucky she is to live in the United States as everywhere they went, the Russians knew where they were and what they were doing. It was an uncomfortable uneasy feeling. She was very happy to return home! On another trip, they visited China which was a completely different experience. She was very comfortable there and thoroughly enjoyed the trip. She







# CHANGE OF ADDRESSES AND DUES

Please keep your address current by notifying the Office when there is a change. The majority of the changes we receive are from the Postal Service. They charge us \$.58 for each change notification which is in addition to the stamp cost for mailing to members. I looked, and we pay slightly over \$100.00 per year to the Postal Service for address changes. The majority of them are for "Dust rejects" which are sent by way of bulk mail.

Also, if you have a winter home, we have the capability for more than one address in our system. And, we can schedule it as recurring if we have the dates. Thanks much.

Approximately 140 nobles have not paid 2017 dues. Tampa will be sending reminders to you shortly. Notices and new dues cards/stickers are mailed bulk mail from Tampa. The approximate time from when you send your check to us and when you receive your card/sticker is six weeks.

# A Story From 9/11... to Mow!

When 9/11 occurred in 2001, on my birthday no less, I knew I wanted to do something personal to help. I contacted a local Masonic Lodge in New York and asked if there were any members who had lost a loved one that day.

I was told a Brother, who had just left the office, George



Sikorsky, had lost his son, Gregory as the towers fell. They gave me George's phone number to contact him.

He said Gregory was a firefighter who was using the "Jaws of Life" prying tool to open up elevator cars stuck because of the loss of power. Then, the towers fell. They knew he was missing immediately and finally found out he was one of the casualties.

Greg's son, Steven, turned 3-years-old on September 18, 2001, one week later. George assured us Steven and his mother, Maria, were being taken care of by money donated to the 9/11 Fund and through family. I asked if we, in Colorado, could do something for Steven. He said it would be a great tribute and the family would appreciate any support we could offer.

I visited many Blue Lodges, Shrine functions, organization meetings and schools telling them Steven's story. So many people generously gave to Steven's Fund. The money was placed into a CD as it came in and in 2003, after the CD had come up for renewal, the money was forwarded to George to put in trust for Steven's college. The family couldn't believe the hearts of the Masonic Bothers and others for their family.

Sheila and I have kept up with George and his wife, Luiza, as well as Steven and Maria. Steven is now attending Manhattan College in New York City and is a fine young man. Those of you who remember contributing to this fund can take great pride in your part in Steven's life.



2 lbs sweet potatoes, peeled and cubed

3/4 cup sugar

8 oz crushed pineapple, drained

2 large eggs lightly beaten

½ cup sour cream (or yogurt)

½ tsp grated orange peel

1/4 cup orange juice

½ cup real butter\*, melted

1 tsp. vanilla

#### **TOPPING**

1 cup flaked coconut 1 cup chopped pecans 1 cup packed brown sugar ½ cup all purpose flour 1/4 cup real butter, melted \*For this recipe "real" butter or stick margarine is needed as the whipped margarine we get now separates when melted.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Put sweet potatoes in large saucepan, add water to cover, bring to boil. Reduce heat, cook uncovered until tender (10-15 min).Drain.

Put in large bowl and mash. Stir in sugar, pineapple, eggs, sour cream, orange peel and juice, butter and vanilla. Transfer to 13"x9" baking dish.

Mix dry topping ingredients. Add butter and mix until crumbly then sprinkle over top.

Bake uncovered 40-45 minutes until heated through and golden brown. ENJOY!




