

- 4. Join and SUPPORT a unit. The Shrine will not survive without ACTIVE units. Just paying your dues won't get it.





I extend my thoughts and prayers to all the Nobles and their families who may be experiencing health issues, passing of loved ones, and any hard times in general. Let us know if we can help.










Fortunately, Spring is rapidly approaching with the string of parades (great!) and much more golf (even better!).

As many of you know, Al Kaly have been insured through Thompkins Masonic Insurance in the past. Last

Fall, Thompkins cancelled us because of (through their underwriter AIG) excess wind and hail claims to our buildings over a 10-year period.

Through the diligent work of our local agent, we were able to obtain insurance from Secura Insurance Company. Because Shrines are "unique" in their insurance, it has been a struggle getting the new policy in place. Once we received the premium, and paid it, I pushed to get the breakdown so we could bill clubs/units to re-coup Al Kaly's money. In doing this, we discovered a mistake which resulted in an entire reevaluation of our policy. Consequently, it brought changes to our building and umbrella premiums.

We believe everything is good now, and by the time you receive this Dust all refunds due have been sent to the clubs/units. Sorry for the mess. Next year should be better.


year Jim Johnson rode Maggie for a flag posting at the Softball Tournament.





# **Bo Cruz**

Michael A. "Bo" Cruz was born and raised in Spanish Harlem, New York, the second eldest of four boys. His father served in the Army during the Korean War and two of his four sons followed in his Army footsteps. Bo was accepted to Fordham University, a Catholic Jesuit School, in the Bronx section of New York.

Originally, he planned to enter seminary to study for the priesthood after graduation, however, in his third year he changed his mind and entered into the Army's Reserve Officer Training Corp. On graduating and receiving his commission in the Army, he traveled to Fort Benning, Georgia for basic training and then on to his first duty station in Schweinfurt, Germany. After completing his tour of duty and returning back to the States he earned a coveted slot at the Green Beret qualification course. For 26 years of his 28-year military career, he served in Special Forces and on several occasions, his career took him to Central America, Afghanistan and Iraq before retiring from the Army in 2013.

After his first tour in Germany, he attended aviation school at Ft. Rucker, Alabama then headed back to Germany for a second tour of duty as a pilot. While flying helicopters along the Czechoslovakian border he discovered all his flight buddies were country boys who grew up south of the Mason Dixon Line (Bo was the only New Yorker) and during every flight the Country Boys would pipe country music through the aircraft's sound system. One day a buddy yelled to him from across the gym, "Hey, Bocephus", and the nickname stuck.

After several years of flying the border listening to Johnny Cash, Waylon Jennings, Patsy Cline, and all those country folks, he turned! He came back to the US with a big belt buckle, cowboy boots, Wrangler jeans, and a cowboy hat. He was a Puerto Rican turned country! For over 30 years, he has gone by the name "Bo". The few exceptions are his 90-year old mother (who lives with him and Nicola), his extended family and a few close friends.

During his second tour in Germany, he asked one of his fellow Green Berets (whom he looked up to and considered a mentor) why he was dressed up in a tuxedo twice a month. Bo, not knowing what was going on,



thought his buddy simply had a lot of weddings to go to. His buddy replied he was a Mason and started explaining what it involved. Bo was so intrigued he asked him what it took to become one. And right there is what started his Masonic career in the Prince Hall Lodge.

By around 1981 he had gone through initiation in the Consistory, York Rite, Knights Templar and the Shrine. He was a member of Aswan 115, a part of the Oklahoma jurisdiction. In the early 80's he eventually planted roots at Ft. Bragg, North Carolina where, as a member of Special Forces, his career was very hectic and deployments were constant. He maintained his membership in his assigned lodge, but the constant traveling prevented him from attending many lodge meetings.

On one particular tour in northern Iraq his unit needed a contractor to handle various purchases between the Army and the local Iraqi businesses. So the personnel request was submitted and an Air Force member – a female named Nicola was assigned to them.

Females are not accepted in Special Forces and they are rarely assigned to support positions but she was there. He didn't like her at all when they first met – she was all

"New Jersey attitude" and kept bugging him for details concerning purchase requests. Although she was only doing her job and being a good steward of tax payers' money, he couldn't give her all the information for security reasons. They worked together for just under 4 months when she returned back to her duty station. After his deployments began to taper off he was scrolling through his email and came across the email she used during deployments. A few months of emailing later, they decided to meet in Disney World. Having spent time together and with things seemingly going well, he asked her to marry him.

The story about his proposal is rather funny; it goes like this. Each year he came to Colorado and New Mexico from North Carolina to hunt. He mentioned to her he was paying an outfitter \$6,000 to \$7,000 a year to hunt and said it would be cheaper to hunt if they got married... "What do you say we just get married?" he asked. She then said, "You're asking me to marry you because you want to hunt out here?" He stammered "Well, yes, uh no, uh yes. ... "They've been happily married for X7 years.

In 2012, when Nicola was transferred to her final duty station in Delaware (she retired in 2016 with 26 years of service), he decided it was time to join a lodge where he could be more active. Scott Autry requested his letter of good standing and introduced him around here. Bo asked where they could use him and then Vince Johnson came walking in! They got along great so Bo demitted to a Colorado Springs Lodge, our Consistory, Templars and Al Kaly Shrine.

While in search of a way for the Masons to give back to the community, Nicola mentioned the Marion House and what a great service they provide to the community regardless of one's religious beliefs. He went to Marion House, spoke to the director and offered up the help of his lodge; the director was thrilled to have them onboard. Bo was honest with the director and let him know the help he was offering was from a group of Freemasons. The director replied this wasn't a problem, so he and his lodge brothers decided to dedicate Wednesdays to help with the cooking and serving. Over the last 7 months of volunteering they have prepared and served over 10,000 meals.

The director of Marion Hose applauds their dedication and has asked Bo to invite more of his lodge brothers to participate. They get there at about 6:45 a.m. for meal preparation and from 10:30 to 1:00 p.m. they assist with serving and/or bussing the tables. Bo states it's a most humbling experience!

Since joining, his Masonic career (second to hunting) has always been part of his livelihood. He intends to continue his journey within the Colorado jurisdiction, stating that Al Kaly has been most enjoyable specifically due to his wife's ability to participate in events with him.
