MULE TRAIN NEWS

(A Snapshot of Mule Care)

It was bitter cold, about ten degrees below zero, as I recall. Luckily, there was no wind. In fact, there was no breeze at all. Linda and I were in my pickup with the heater on full blast as we drove up to the Mule Train. We were there to unload four bales of grass hay that Ray Lingley had recently bought. They were stowed on the Mule Train's flatbed trailer and covered with a tarp, which in turn was covered by about four inches of snow. Debbie stood behind my pick-up where I could see her in my side view mirror. She gave me a series of hand signals to guide me left or right so I could line up my trailer hitch with that of the trailer itself. She gave me the stop sign, so I threw the gear shift into park and hopped out. I quickly hitched up the trailer and cut the strings that held the tarps down. She and I removed the tarps, being careful not to spill any snow on top of the bales. There is nothing that'll spoil a bale of hay faster than moisture, which allows mold to quickly grow, thus rendering the hay unusable. She said, "I'll fold these up, you go ahead."

"Ok," I said, "thanks." As I pulled away, with the trailer in tow, I saw Jacob arrive with his own trailer, which carried a skid loader that he would use to unload the hay. I stopped and got out as he hopped up on the trailer.

"It's a little cold, isn't it?" he said.

He's a tall young man with an easy smile. He had on heavy coveralls and a COVID mask, which I reckoned was more for warmth than COVID protection. Even though he wore the mask, I could tell by the crinkles around his eyes that he was grinning.

"Yup," I said and grinned myself. It was too cold to say much of anything else.

I didn't tarry, but drove quickly around to the main corral so I could park more or less adjacent to the hay barn. I had to stop in front of



the main corral gate, however, until we could move the mules out of the way. Debbie opened the south gate so she and I could push the mules out of the main corral and into the practice arena. They did indeed move into the practice arena and bunched up there to stay warm.

As we walked back towards my pickup, she said, "I fed them twice this morning."

"Excellent," I said. "That was a good idea." (Digesting feed actually generates some internal warmth for the big animals, so it's good to keep their stomachs full during extremely cold weather).

Debbie opened the main corral gate for me, so I drove in and parked in a place where Jacob could unload quickly and easily.

Jacob drove into the corral with the skid, armed with the hay spears looking like some sort of medieval weapon or maybe a weird stock car. He speared the first bale and carried it into the hay barn. He's unloaded and stacked enough hay at the Mule Train to know exactly where to unload.

After he unloaded the remaining three bales, he drove his skid loader/stock car out of the corral, removed the hay spears and mounted a bucket on the front. He just as quickly drove back into the corral and cleared the manure away from the front of the feed troughs. I stopped him long enough to say thanks for all his help.

"Too easy," he said and his eyes crinkled again.

Bruce was standing by so I walked over to him. He was really bundled up and all I could see of him were his eyes. "Let's take a look at the water troughs," he mumbled through his hood and mask.

"Ok," I sez. (Or mumbled through my mask).

We walked over to the heated water troughs, and he said, "As you can see, they have a little rim of ice around the outside, but that's all."

"Looks like no problem, Bruce," I said.

"That's what I thought, but wanted to run it by you."

"Thanks a bunch. We're good to go."

"I'll get the gates," Debbie said. "You and Linda go on home."

All right, I thought to myself, there were five of us here and look at the teamwork and cooperation that occurred. And this ain't but a snapshot of the care those big ol' animals need!

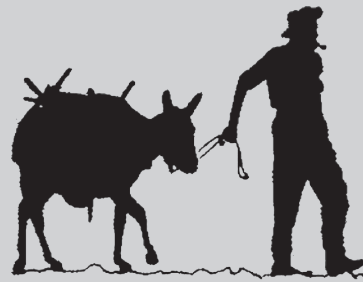

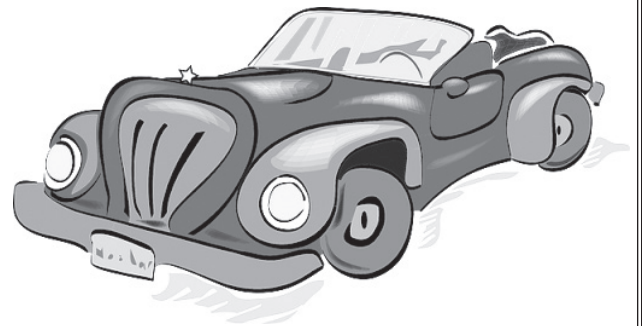
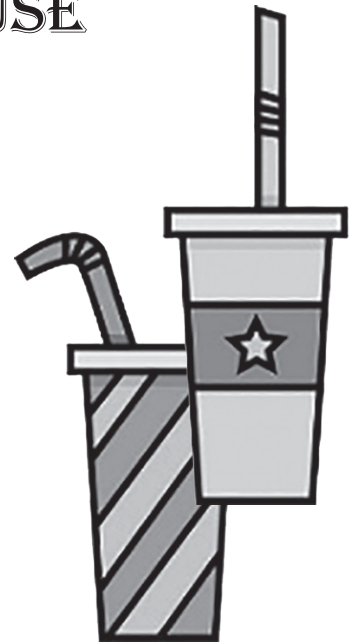
