SUPPORT OUR VETERANS

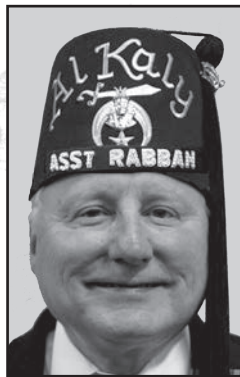

"The greatest of these is charity." We are taught as Shriners that our charitable support for our national and regional Shriners Children's Hospitals and Clinics is first and foremost. However, there are community charity needs which should not be overlooked. Last year, I furnished information regarding the Marion House, where the homeless can receive a daily hot meal at no cost to them. This year, I would like to provide details about the "Home for all Veterans" – a program of the Rocky Mountain Human Services (RMHS). Myself and Cynthia recently visited with Kathy Cross of their Colorado Springs office. This fine organization also has a branch located in Pueblo, right here in Southern Colorado.

Although the Veterans Administration provides medical services for our veterans, this organization primarily supports emergency and transitional housing for honorably discharged veterans. RMHS does receive grant money to support payments to qualified veterans for initial monthly rent and deposits. However, donations are needed to support utilities, initial food supplies, and needed car repairs associated with employment. Also, there exists the need for the normal outfitting of an apartment including bedding and some modest furniture.

In the Colorado Springs office, in the past year, this organization directly supported 300 homeless veterans! Each of their clients receives regular oversight from a case services analyst in order to help navigate the complex web of federal and state benefit systems. This would include assistance for mental health and substance abuse concerns, employment services, and legal needs. Although their service targets the veterans, it also includes family members.

I would encourage all members of Al Kaly who would consider donating to contact either the Colorado Springs office at 17 S. Weber St. or 111 N. Union Ave. in Pueblo. Central States is coming to Colorado!!! Per the Central States Shrine Association (CSSA) by laws, Al Kaly Shrine is responsible for placing a Noble in the 6th Vice President position at the 2023 Central States business meeting. This position requires the Noble to make a 7 year commitment. The Noble placed into this position will progress up the Central States line and finish as the President in 2029; the year Central States is scheduled to be held in Colorado.

The qualifications/requirements for this position are simple: 1) the Noble must be in good standing, 2) the Noble must be willing to attend the Central States Business and Ceremonial sessions; 3) the Noble must be an organizer and Team Leader

Additionally, Al Kaly Shrine must appoint a Noble to the position of Director General. This position is just as important, if not more so. The Director General holds the position for the entire time (7 years). While the requirements for this position are the same as for the President, this individual must be willing to network, be willing to work with others, and have "thick skin", all of which are necessary for an event the size of Central States to be successful.

With that said, if you are inclined to volunteer or if you have questions, please contact Ill Sir Dave Stevens or Ill Sir Bart Guthrie. We have the "battle scars" from 2009, and are willing to share our institutional knowledge to set the individual up for success. While both positions may sound "daunting", being proactive is half the battle and having fun is the other half. In all honesty, it was a great time and experience and we were very thankful for the support of the Nobility.

FEATURED SHRINER JARED MADDOX

Jared was born in Sioux City, IA in September 1941. He had 3 Jared was born in Havre, Montana on March 7th, 1975. His parents, Cole and Laurie Maddox, have a family ranch in North Central Montana, near the town of Chinook. He is the oldest of 5 boys. He graduated from Chinook High School in 1993 and stayed in Chinook working on the family ranch until 2005. He then attended Ricks College, now BYU Idaho in Rexburg, Idaho, and the Carroll College in Helena, Montana, majoring in American History. He has four children from a previous marriage.



His first job outside of working on the ranch was shoveling snow for several businesses in Chinook. He was 11 years old when he started his snow shoveling business and did quite well. For most of his adult life, he has worked in construction and the oil field. He now manages and runs carwashes in the Colorado Springs area. He served for one enlistment in the National Guard, with an MOS of 19D (Cavalry Scout).

Jared lived in Europe after the Iron Curtain came down. During that time, he met Alexandrina (Alex). She's from Romania. After almost 30 years, they reconnected through Facebook! They are dating. Anyone who has met her will like her immediately.

Jared's main hobby is Civil War Reenacting. He is the Captain of a group based out of Colorado that participates in Reenactments all around the country from Colorado to back



east. They are going to be at the 160th Battle of Shiloh in Tennessee this April. When he is able to get a moment of relaxation, he's almost always reading a book. History and Masonic related subjects are typically what he likes to study. He is the Commander of the Colorado Springs

chapter of the Sons of Confederate Veterans. Membership requires being a descendant of a Confederate veteran. His ancestor, George Maddox, fought with the 17th Georgia Infantry in the Confederate Army.

In Montana, Jared trained bloodhounds to track and then donated them to sheriff's offices. He trained his own bloodhound named Moose to track. Once, Moose tracked a missing woman in the snow. He kept running back to her car, apparently to refresh his scent and led the recovery team to her. Moose was Jared's "faithful and best friend" for ten years.

Jared first got interested in the Masonic orders when his oldest son, Wesley, was treated at the Shrine Hospital in Spokane, WA. Before this, he knew nothing about Masons or Shriners, other than that they existed. He was so astonished at how well they were treated by the Shriners, that he immediately wanted to become one. Not long after that, he learned that many members of his family had been Masons and Shriners, and he wanted to keep that legacy going. He joined Chinook Lodge #50 in Chinook, Montana in 2001. Shortly after becoming a Master Mason, he went through the 3 bodies of the York Rite, and then crossed the extra, extra, EXTRA, hot sands of the Algeria Shrine in Helena Montana. He wanted to be involved in his community by joining Free Masonry and being as active as possible as well as being a part of a brotherhood that does so much to help children.

Jared considers himself not an optimist or pessimist, but more of a realist. He always tries to help people who need it. He says he's not a "Christmas and Easter" Christian. He believes Jesus leads him to help whenever he can. He feels that's what being a Mason and Shriner is all about.

His favorite saying is "Sic Semper Tyrannus". It is on the Virginia State Flag. I asked him what it means and, with a grin, he said "look it up"!

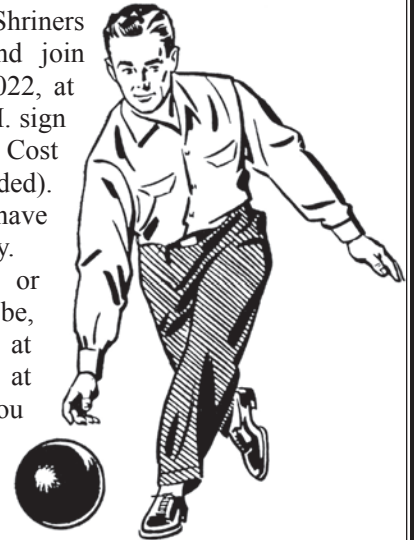
