Accidental Educator to World Traveler

The Korean Conflict was starting to heat up into a real war when seventeen year-old, high school junior IS Lionel


Robertson decided to join the Naval Reserves. He was living with his family in Ramah on the land that his parent's families had homesteaded, had to leave, and returned to several times. He was born in San Francisco on one of the extended moves during some really hard economic times. Their last time in California had them living in the hills running a chicken farm, when their valley was

flooded to make room for a dam when IS Lionel was about twelve. His family returned to Ramah and started a dairy farm, delivering milk for the town.

After high school graduation, he completed a year of chemistry studies at a college in La Junta before the money

ran out. He went into the Navy and was stationed in Texas where he was in communications. That lasted for two years, and then the Korean Conflict was ending and the Navy offered early dismissal for those who wanted it. IS Lionel was there near the front of the line. Armed with the GI Bill, he went to Greeley, then Colorado State College of Education where he earned a BA and MA with a major in organic chemistry.

His first job was with the Navy in San Diego. While he was there, a delegation from Ramah came and asked him if he'd come back and be the Superintendent, Principal, and coach for their school. He was twenty-five and thought it sounded like a good plan. He worked there for several years, and then at Harrison where he also taught chemistry and

physics. Meanwhile, there was a matter of certification, so he went to Western State for a MA in Educational Administration.

Then he went to Simlia as the Superintendent, back to Harrison as Assistant Superintendent for thirteen years. He moved to attend the University of Wyoming for a doctorate in Educational Leadership. He was the Assistant Superintendent in Casper and taught various classes for the University of Wyoming in various parts of the state. During this time he met his wife, Yvonne, who was also a student at U of Wyoming.

Ellicott offered him the job of Superintendent, requiring him to update his certification, so he agreed to teach at CU and continue to teach for the U of Wyoming and Adams State to get current. He taught at UCCS and supervised student teachers until it seemed time to retire from teaching. While at Ellicott, IS Lionel joined the Masons. After

> Megan and Adam Walter's accident, he knew he needed to become a Shriner. The Shriners kept the school apprised as to the progress of the children and came to the school to help with the adjustment of the staff and children to Megan and Adam's return. The people from the Galveston Hospital came to support the family and the teachers as to the best way to deal with the children and how to maintain the confidence that

they were gaining in the hospital. When the children returned, the support and care was very impressive to IS Lionel. We need always to be reminded of the special work that Shriners Hospitals for Children give to each child. These services are exceptional and we must not forget it. "Shriners don't beat their own drums enough so that people realize the wonderful services that they render to children and their families." From the inspiration in Ellicott, IS Lionel became Potentate in 2004.

IS Lionel never lost the love of chemistry and has done some part-time consulting for a local pharmaceutical lab. Ever practical, he has turned to the production of wine that he monitors and attends to with the care of a true scientist.




As I write this, Lady

"It doesn't rain in Indianapolis in the summer time."


Whoever wrote those song lyrics was not there during the



Shriner Child Alondra Talemantes-Bueno Tell the Story, Help a Child

Some of you might remember the title as my late husband, IS Bill Stoner's (08) motto. It certainly came to mind when I talked with our Shriner Child, Alondra Talemantes-Bueno. It started fifteen or more years ago with a family friend, Sonya Corral, reading an article about Shriners and Shriners Hospitals helping children, while she was sitting with her ill mother in a hospital room. How much did it affect her? Four years previously, a relative had a child with spina bifida. She remembered the article and called the Shriner Hospital for Children's phone number and got help for the little girl. She will not be cured, but she will live a better life.

Now we fast-forward to last year, another relative needed help. Sonya Corral got on the phone to Shriners Hospitals for Children. Alondra was born in Mexico with scoliosis. There seemed to be no help for her as she grew and her spine twisted more. As she entered her teens and went through a growth spurt, she was in constant pain and her spine twisted around with the shoulder coming up and turning forward. The Shriners were delighted to help her and had her come to Shriner Hospital Salt Lake City. Once there, the doctors wanted to operate right away because of the severity of the curvature. That was November 12, 2012. While in Salt Lake City, she had physical therapy for a week that allowed her to be able to fly to El Paso. She and her mother, Maria Patricia Bueno, had to stay overnight there to allow her to rest before returning home. Today, a scarce eight months later, you see a lovely thirteen-year-old girl who was given her life back by the Shriners. Not only is she erect, she is smiling and without the

pain that comes from advanced scoliosis. There is one detail which I've not mentioned: her mother, Maria, brought her to Pueblo so that she could talk with me. They live in Northern Mexico, not far from El Paso, Texas, where they attend the Shriner Clinic every six months. Because I called Sonya to see if Alondra was available to talk, they made the trip to see me. I can't tell you how grateful this family is for the help they have received from the Shriner Hospitals for Children. Her local doctor said that there was little they could do and she would have to be twisted and in pain the rest of her life. So what is the difference for Alondra today? Now she can write and do better in school because her arm doesn't hurt to be put in the position to write. Now she can sleep better. Now she can breathe better. Alondra can do everything now and can lift things too, if she's careful. She is stronger and is learning to walk with ease. Her ability to have what she hopes, a normal life, is now possible.

I asked Alondra what she hopes for and she said that her spine will stay straight and that things will be okay. She knows she can now have a normal life like other people.

There are issues that need to be resolved with Alondra's health. Her legs are not the same length and the hips are out of alignment. In Salt Lake Hospital their first and main concern was to relieve the spinal twist. The other issues will be addressed in a few days when they go to the clinic in El Paso. There has been no physical therapy offered since she left the hospital. I urged Maria to ask for physical therapy even if it was just pictures to show her how to make her legs stronger. One knee is sore and the therapy will help that. They need to concentrate on improved mobility. So many changes have come so quickly that I wanted to make sure that they knew that there were more changes possible.

There we sat, Maria, Sonya, Alondra and I, crying as Alondra and Maria tried to express their gratitude for the Shriners. After the fourth article dealing with the effects of scoliosis, it seemed that the end to the constant pain and the restrictions that the condition places on the patient are the most cherished outcomes.

I'd also like to mention that Sonya was a wonderfully faithful interpreter through our interview. She was so patient and wonderful that I owe her a real debt of gratitude. She opened her home in gratitude to the Shrine Hospitals that are there to help. She called Alondra's family to let them know that I wanted to do an article about her, bringing them to Pueblo. It was also Sonya

who was the ambassador for the Shriner Hospitals. We need to keep the vision and the wonderful help available for children out in the media visible so that other Sonyas will read and remember what the Shriners do for children.

Keep the tradition alive. Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?


brotherhood has meant to him. It was a great night and well worth the drive from Canon City.





Even the help eats the breakfast here, which says something about our cooking, doesn't it?

We regularly have more than 100 happy customers each month and share the work between 8-10 members. There are a few "old" familiar faces that are there nearly every month – in both categories. And there are new faces quite often. You are welcome to join us in either of these positions; we will be proud to feed you and welcome more help as each month someone cannot be there to do a portion of the work. We have a pool of 15-18 workers and are thrilled on months when the Nomads have an outing or hunting season pulls some away, or (sadly) the flu goes through town, that we can be assured others will "step up


their hospital visits every Tuesday and Thursday, dispensing "Clown Therapy" to patients there.
