Noble Ralph E. "Doc" Hathaway Named Shriner of the Month

Noble Ralph E. "Doc" Hathaway of Al Kaly Shriners in Pueblo, Colorado, has been named Shriner of the Month for June 2015. The award program was developed by the leadership for the Shriners International to honor outstanding nobles who demonstrate an extraordinary commitment to both the fraternity and its philosophy, Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Becoming "Doc"

For as long as Noble Hathaway can remember, he wanted to be a physician. His childhood and lifelong nickname "Doc" came in seventh grade, when he delivered his first baby in an ambulance. Upon graduation from high school, he entered nursing school, which was cut short when he entered the Navy, to serve as a medic.



After his discharge, he worked in television, as a news photographer, and then for a short while he went into business on his own. With a wife and baby, Noble Hathaway was accepted into medical school in Kansas City, Missouri. In 1964, while struggling financially with his young family and working various part-time jobs, he achieved his goal of becoming a physician, and received his Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree.

Noble Hathaway then returned to Maine, completed an internship, and opened a practice in Oakland, where he served as hospital chief of staff, director of Maine Osteopathic Association, medical examiner for the state of Maine, county coroner, and deputy sheriff of Kennebec County. Somehow, during this busy time, he found time to complete his Masonic degrees at Messalonski Lodge #113.

He kept his Lodge dues paid, but like so many of us, family and vocation kept him from an active Masonic life until 2006.

Bringing Dedication and Medical Expertise to Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children

In 2006, Noble Hathaway joined Al Kaly Shriners and immediately became a staff doctor for the local Shriners Hospitals for Children. He took charge of the temple's screening clinics and became an active member of Al Kaly's telemedicine program. In addition to screening countless patients for admittance to Shriners Hospitals for Children, he has served as Chairman of Al Kaly Shriners' Burn Awareness Week and IHOP's Free Pancake Day events. At his own travel expense, he has delivered more than 8,000 burn packets to grade schools in Southern Colorado. In addition, as a result of his work with nine IHOP restaurants in Southern Colorado, more than \$55,000 has been raised for Shriners Hospitals for Children. Noble Hathaway has also voluntarily attended Board of Governor's meetings at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Salt Lake City to offer assistance and provide expertise.



Noble Hathaway's community involvement with the local Sertoma service club, where he holds the title Man of the Year, and Silver Key, a program for seniors in the Colorado Springs area, has given him ample opportunities to give lectures promoting Masonry, Shriners

International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. Annually, Al Kaly Shriners can count on a \$500 donation from Sertoma for their children's transportation fund. Many lodge and Shriners International petitions contain "Dr. Ralph Hathaway" in the first line signer slot.

Since 2006, Noble Hathaway has served as Master of his Masonic Lodge, where he has also been secretary for the past seven years. He has served as Al Kaly Shriners' President of the Elite Scooters, Wagon Master, and seven years as Colorado Springs Shrine Club secretary. In the Scottish Rite, he is Junior Warden in the Lodge of Perfection and an active participant on the Lighting Crew for reunions.

"Donating his time is only one aspect," said Ill. Sir Bart Guthrie. "He's purchased and donated many Cardiovascular Defibrillators to numerous Masonic Lodges and the Shrine Club in the Colorado Springs area, provided considerable money to Al Kaly's Transportation Fund and Shriners Hospitals for Children, and has purchased several \$100 Million certificates." He also had a mini handcrafted tractor-trailer and truck built, which he drives in parades promoting Shriners International membership and Shriners Hospitals. "And," said Ill. Sir Guthrie, "a few thousand steaks have met their fate on a barbeque grill with Chef Hathaway serving them up for Shrine and lodge functions."

This year, Noble Hathaway's Lady JoAnne will be installed for the second time as Queen of Ruhamah #71, Daughters of the Nile. Noble Hathaway donates his time to assist the local and supreme sessions, doing anything that is asked of him. In May, he was honored with a 50 Years of Masonic Service certificate and pin.

"The phrase, 'Well done, good and faithful servant,' can have a line added, 'Thanks Doc, you've done it all!' Noble and Worshipful Brother Ralph E. "Doc" Hathaway is truly an outstanding citizen and deserves the recognition of the Shriner of the Month Award," said Ill. Sir Guthrie.

Ill. Sir J.D. Potter, Potentate of the Al Kaly Shriners, confirms, "Al Kaly proudly nominates Noble Hathaway for the Shriner of the Month Award."

Congratulations to Noble Hathaway for his achievements and for being chosen as Shriner of the Month.

Shrine Club Benches

The wooden benches along the walls of the Colorado Springs Shrine Club were originally purchased for the new Masonic Temple at 9 N. Nevada Avenue.



Upon the dedication of the Temple, on December 1, 1908, these benches began serving the brothers of El Paso Lodge #13, Colorado Springs Lodge #76, and Tejon Lodge #104, along with the two Star chapters and the York Rite bodies until the new temple at 1150 Panorama Drive was completed in 1972.

The old benches were slated to be destroyed until Lew Peterson, a member of El Paso #13 and the Colorado Springs Shrine Club, called Brother Homer Sharpton, the Sharpton Room namesake, to tell him of the benches. The two of them decided to pick them up and use them for seating at the Shrine Club. Over the years, the club has had to reupholster them, but for 107 years they have and are still serving Masonry well.

This past month has been a very busy one in many ways and in many places.

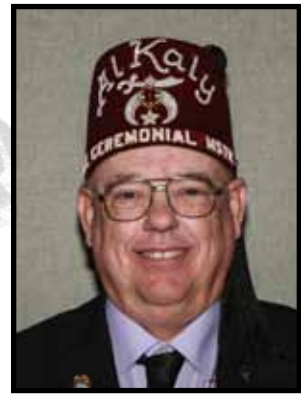

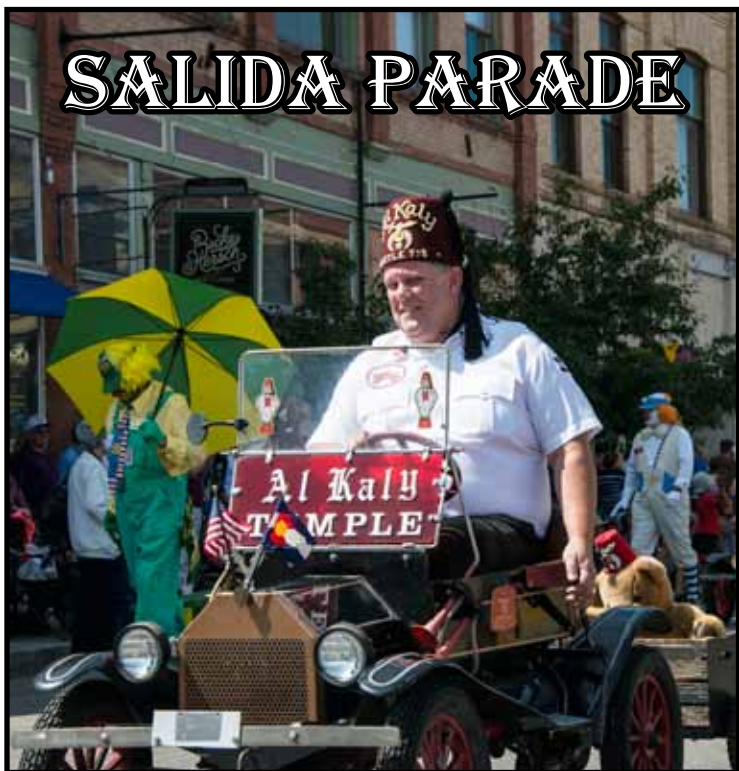

A Tale of Two Sisters

Meeting the two girls Alyssa, fifteen, and Zoey, six, it would not be obvious the genetic condition they share. The main difference in their current status is that Zoey was seen by the Shriner Hospital for Children in Salt Lake City as a week old infant. The parents Brenda and Brad knew what to look for when Zoey was born. When hip-dysplasia was detected, she was treated from then on. She wore a harness and brace to keep her leg bones in the hip sockets to allow them to form correctly. As a result, Zoey no longer has hip-dysplasia and has no lingering side effects from that condition.

Hip-dysplasia was not identified in Alyssa until she had begun to walk. Her first surgeries were not at a Shriner facility. Her surgery was at fifteen months old and she had another surgery a few months later. The family heard of the Shriner hospitals from a cousin who also has hip-dysplasia. The numbers and invasiveness of the surgeries that Alyssa has endured is staggering. At one of her Big surgeries, she saw the entrance and part of the operating room. She remembers being freaked out and still freaks out remembering it. Even with the multiple operations, she lives with chronic pain. Her legs are nearly the same length and she requires a lift in her shoe to make her limp less noticeable.

As she thinks of entering Sand Creek High School this fall, Alyssa is concerned about how she will be received. In the past, she has been bullied by students because she limps, her scars and her absences from school due to surgeries. At the start of seventh grade, she missed the first two weeks of school because of a big surgery. She is really self-conscious and she is really brave. She has

been on a Y swim team for years and dealt with the stares at her scars. Her main swimming strokes are the backstroke and the butterfly. She has competed successfully and enjoyed it. However, she also plays a flute in the marching band. The schedule for band practice is grueling and she has pretty well decided to focus on band and drop the swimming practice schedule. There is also a concern over starting high school and the classwork it will entail. She is in Honors classes, and she is not sure how much study is required.

As an entering freshman with all those concerns, she wonders how much the past cruelty will follow her.

The classes that she is looking forward to are art, music and science. She is excited to have art classes and shows great skill in her drawing. Her music and art will bring her into classes where she will shine and be involved with other students who have similar interests. Being in the Marching Band will give her a way to add to school spirit and be part of a fun group.

Some of Alyssa's observations about Salt Lake City's Hospitals were that the staff there always talks with her and explains things to her. They are concerned with her well-being as well as her physical issues. Part of the trips are fun in that they stay in a hotel and sight see a bit. They always bring home gifts from the hospital which tries to match them to the child's interests. When she has been the hospital, there is a pray dog who visits with the children and is very comforting.
