Born in Denver, Cindy was a "surprise" child – completely unexpected. Her father had been married before and already had a grown son and daughter, so, she was pretty much raised as an only child. As they all lived in Denver, she would go and play with her half-sister's kids (her nieces and nephews) because they were the same age. Her half-brother lived in Salt Lake City and she didn't see him often. Cindy lost her dad when she was only seven and when she was 11

she and her mom moved to Glenwood Springs for a couple of years.

Later her mother got a job in Colorado Springs which meant a move in the middle of the school year. Cindy chose to go live with an aunt and uncle on Elmendorf AFB in Anchorage, Alaska, instead of splitting 9th grade between Glenwood Springs and Colorado Springs. Until this time she knew nothing about the military.

When she later came to Colorado Springs, she went to Mitchell High School. Because of the location, about 90% of the students were military, including all of her friends, so she fit right in.

After she graduated from Mitchell, in 1969, she and her mom went to Florida and Louisiana and had a great time visiting friends. When they came back to Colorado Springs, Cindy was involved in a serious car accident leaving her with a broken back and paralysis. That was August of 1969.

The rods in her back kept breaking – this was before titanium. She had several surgeries, much rehab, and many halfway houses to get familiar with living on her own. The Colorado Rehabilitation Department paid for her to attend LSU New Orleans which is now the University of New Orleans. Despite multiple surgeries, her stubborn determination helped her complete two years of college.

In August of 1975, Cindy went to work for the phone

company as an operator. Three months later, all her rods broke again. In order to get medical benefits, she had to work a full year. Despite pain meds and wrapping her body, she made it to work, never missing a day. At one year and one week, she went out on medical benefits for surgery once again. Since doctors didn't know it was best to move around and be weightbearing, she was confined to a hospital bed in her living room for a year.

When she was finally able to go back to work, in the beginning of 1978, a supervisor recommended she should put in for another job because she had much more to offer than "just an operator" and asked her what she would like to do. Cindy liked it where she was, so she jokingly commented that other departments had a lot of men in them and maybe she would go man-hunting.

In reality, that was the last thing she wanted. Just for fun, she put down she wanted to go to the Engineering Department. She told her supervisor she wanted an engineer, but in reality, she liked the Engineering Department location

with its free parking. It wasn't in the main building where she had to pay for parking. In April of 1978, her transfer was approved to the Engineering Department where she worked on the pricing team.

Cindy had been there a couple of days when this guy came up, put his foot on her desk and his elbow on his knee and said "Hello. My name's Jim." She said "Get your foot off my desk!" He thought that response was pretty funny and would repeat that off and on. This man turned out to be Jim Stivers, an engineer working in the basement. He was pretty persistent and in August, she finally agreed to go out with him. Since it was lunchtime, she suggested Wendy's and they went for a couple of burgers. It was

only years later she found our he hated Wendy's.

The phone company knew changes were in the offing. In 1988, in anticipation of future job losses, they offered to pay for any school the employees wanted. Cindy loved to travel, so she chose Mountain States Travel School where she became a travel agent. In 1989, she hired on at Charlie Brown's Goodtime Travel. Five days a week she worked at the phone company from 7:15 to 3pm and then worked for Charlie Brown's from 4:00 until 8:00pm, just to get her feet wet.

As expected, in 1996, Cindy's job with the phone company moved to Denver so she took the buyout the

company offered and worked at the travel agency. She worked full time for several years and is now with them on a part time basis working out of her home. It's all referrals – her phone company friends, Nile friends, and Shriner friends. Because of current technology, there's not as much demand for travel agents which is ok with her! She's winding down but still happy to help anybody when they need it.

Jim took Cindy to her first Shrine social event in the fall of 1978. She ended up dragging him to a lot more Shrine things than he thought he'd ever go to. She was very social - "enjoyed doing stuff". Her father had been a member of El Jebel, so she was familiar with the Masons and Shriners. She has a photo of herself at the age of 6 months getting on a plane with the El Jebel Hillbilly Band, on their way to a convention. Her dad was the band director, and she says she's probably the youngest person to have gone to a convention. Since 1978, she has been a "Shrine Person". She and Jim married in 1983, so then she was an official "Shrine Lady".

Jim built their house which had specific requirements - it had to be facing south, all one level, no steps and nowhere near Academy Blvd.; and the sun had to be at their back when they drove to work and when they drove home. Amazingly, they found the lot which met all these requirements and Jim and a friend built the house, completing it in January of 1984.

Jim had been married before and Cindy was blessed with his three adult children, plus, she got five grandchildren out of the deal! She doesn't see them very often, but they have fun and get along really well.

Ann Fields thought Cindy should be in Nile, but she didn't think so. After she retired from the phone company in 1996, she magically got an invitation to join Nile. She told Jim she was too busy doing other things but he encouraged her to go and network. She finally joined in 1997 and has formed many close friendships within Nile which will last a lifetime.

When Jim died in 2016, she lived alone until March this year. Kimra, her caregiver, would come in the morning to help her get up and return in the evening to help her get into bed and she did cleaning and helped her with some personal things. Kimra was a single mother with three children looking for affordable housing so Cindy invited her and the children to move in with her until they could find a suitable home. The kids are 16, 14, and 7; they call her "Auntie Grandma Cindy". Needless to say, there is always lots of activity going on!

Cindy has four inside cats and several outside. She's a colony manager with the Humane Society, trapping the feral animals so the Humane Society can neuter them and then return them to their original area.

Two cats were orphaned at about 3 weeks old and had to be bottle-fed. She didn't know if they were girls or boys at the time, so she guessed and named them Lewis and Clark.

They turned out to be Lois and Claire. Claire sleeps on Cindy's face every night; some part of Claire must be touching Cindy's face!

Her garage is like a resort for her outside cats. She can only get one car in it; the rest is cat condominiums! They are her kids and she wouldn't have it any other way. She loves all animals. Jim was worse... if he could. he'd come home with anything with four legs and a tail running loose!

Cindy loves all kinds of critters. There's a

bowl of water outside the front door with a flyswatter hanging on the wall. When bees or wasps fall into the water, she rescues them with the flyswatter and turns them loose. If an ant gets in the house, she puts him on a piece of paper, takes him outside and puts him in the grass. The one thing she will kill is a mosquito! She apologizes, but still nails 'em.

There are no special future plans. She and Jim travelled extensively from the time they met, always taking one or two really nice trips a year. Her motto is "Been there, done that" and actually has the t-shirts from everywhere she's been. A couple of her friends are talking about doing an Alaska cruise in the next year or two - maybe she'll do that. Being able to drive her pickup, Cindy is quite independent. However, she credits much of her independence on the love and support of her many friends. She's too busy to be bored.

She and Jim always had a calendar you write on....it was always full. It still is.






AUGUST **EVENTS**







A Sand Dunes Shriner Kid Dreams Big

Urianna ("Uri") Acosta is a Sand Dunes Shriner's Kid. Uri was born 12 years ago with a condition called arthrogryposis multiplex congenta (AMC), stiffening of the bones affecting 1 in 3,000 individuals. All four of Acosta's limbs were affected. At birth her arms were stiff and did not bend and her legs were tucked up against her body. Her thumbs were bent forward against the palms of her hands.

"My mother's womb was too small for me. So I was stuck in the position where my legs were criss-crossed and my wrists were bent," said Uri. Although AMC is physically limiting, it has not been painful for her. "Other than surgeries, I


have never had pain with this condition," she said.

As a toddler, she would sit on her bottom and hop or scoot to get around, but when her "Pama" got her a little chair, she quickly figured out a way to use the chair for support and walk on her knees. "Pama" is the affectionate name all her grandchildren and 'half of Monte Vista' now call Linda Archuleta because her first grandchild couldn't pronounce "Grandma".

Archuleta, who has been raising Uri since she was three, researched AMC and found a world-renowned doctor, Dr. Harold van Bosse, who works, not only at the Shriner Hospital in Philadelphia, but in clinics worldwide. Meanwhile, Archuleta met Dick Smith in Monte Vista who suggested Shriners could possibly help and would help defray their travel costs. It took two years to get Uri in for her first surgery with Dr. van Bosse.

Previously Uri was told there was not much to do for her; amputation of her legs was suggested but she told the doctors, "I want to walk with my real legs."







At Philadelphia SHC, van Bosse performed an eight-hour surgery where her hips and feet were moved into correct position, her ankle was turned 90 degrees and her foot was turned another 90 degrees." Now Uri's hip, knees and legs are in the right positions but, they have to do a little more work on her feet.

Uri, who is very knowledgeable and wellspoken, added, "It's almost like my foot was on backwards; he aligned them with my knees. I had one foot in front and one in back. One of my feet points down and the other points up and they are still crooked. My feet were so tiny, so so tiny, but they're pretty big now". She went from a size 6-infant shoe to a size 12 youth after the surgery.

In August they are going to put a fixator on her knee. "Every day I will click it and it will straighten my leg out little by little and in three months my leg will be straight" says Uri. The same process will be used to straighten her other leg and both feet.

Uri and "Pama" may stay in Philadelphia for eight months until this process is completed. "We think by the time we come home, she will have braces and will probably be walking with a walker," Archuleta said. "I'm pretty excited, I'm really excited actually!


"I have dreams about it. She looks absolutely beautiful standing and walking and doing the things we do. She does the things we do now but she does them different."

Uri is experiencing many firsts. With her legs released and aligned with her knees, she can now wear jeans; she can move her body in ways she never could before - she dances while sitting in her scooter.

Uri has her sights set on possibly being a choreographer or maybe joining the military. "Do you know who Justin Bieber is?" she asked. "He sings and he dances, too. I want to do that." For someone whose body was so restricted, Uri is dreaming big.

Archuleta will encourage anything she chooses to do. "When she was in the hospital, she performed for the staff," said Archuleta. "They had a music therapist and she worked a lot with Uri."

Monte Vista policeman, Dave Pino, heard Uri sing, went to her classroom and asked her to sing the National Anthem at the Police Memorial in May 2016. She sang the song a cappella.

Monte Vista Middle School Principal, Tom Tichy, and School Resource Officer Adam Atencio say, she loves school and hates to miss. They call her self-motivated, an extrovert, out-going, a joy, one smart kid, a natural leader and independent The kids love her and she loves being around them. She strives to get good grades, is conscientious about her work, learns fast, and does a really good job academically. She doesn't complain, always has a smile on her face, is level-headed so her maturity is far beyond her years.

Uri is innovative. To write she holds her pencil between her index and middle fingers on her right hand. She types by using the knuckle of her index finger on the same hand.

Linda spoke highly about Shriners saying, "Uri





was in the hospital for a whole month and had all these surgeries and we didn't pay a penny," she said. "I can truly say our experience was one of the most awesome experiences we have ever had – the people we met, the treatment, the bedside manner. It's all about the children."

Sand Dunes Shrine Club has and will help Linda with some expenses in the near future.

The current medical plan for Urianna is:

- 2 times per week for 2 weeks serial casting before surgery
- Surgery, arm release and fixator 4-5 days in the hospital Aug 17th
- 2 weeks in cast for arm release
- After hospital 1 appointment per week 5-6 weeks
- Occupational Therapy 2-3 appointments first week
- Follow up appointment in 6 weeks




