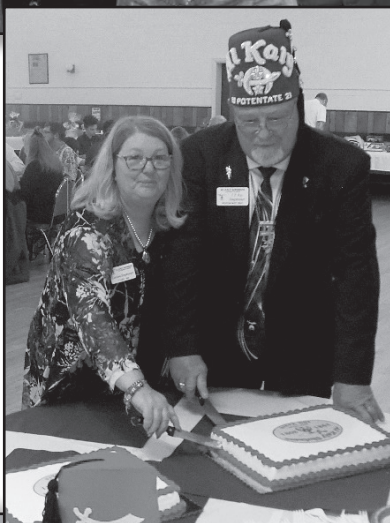

FEATURED SHRINER JAY BERNARD

Jay was born December 30, 1949, in Pueblo, Colorado - an only child. His parents were both born raised in Florence. He graduated from Centennial High School in Pueblo in 1969. Immediately following his graduation from high school, he became an electrician and followed this trade for his entire career.

Jay's first job as an electrician was with A-1 Electric; where he honed his skills for about three years. At the young age of 21, Jay made a career move and took a job with Johnson Electric Co. He was hired by Bud Moore and Ray Johnson, both members of Al Kaly Shrine. He was an electrical technician at Parkview Hospital when Johnson's had the maintenance contract there. He then worked as a service tech for Johnson's until about 1990. After that, he was hired by Industrial Plant Services, again as an electrical technician until Roy Trivett (Royal Trivett's son) opened his own shop. In 2006, he went to work for Pueblo West Metro District as a Maintenance Technician for the water and waste water systems. He retired there in 2014.

A funny thing happened on the job. Jay was called out for an emergency electrical problem at someone's home. They were hearing a vibrating sound in the closet and thought it was an electrical short. When he arrived, he opened the closet and found a personal item that was on and vibrating.

Jay met Barbara at a Singles Group Halloween Party in 1978, at the Minnequa Club. He knew two of her female cousins and liked them so he thought Barb would be a nice lady to get to know. It was a week or so later that they were at the To It Club with other friends when they really connected. He pretty much believes fate or a guardian angel was working on them that night - they haven't been apart since.

Jay's hobbies include collecting light bulbs! He also has a large collection of tools that he used in his work. He enjoys "messaging" with his light bulbs and light fixtures. He also enjoys watching TV and videos. Jay and Barb's other interests do differ a bit. She likes to travel, he likes to stay home. She does needlework, he fiddles with his electrical stuff. Their common interests are being home together and spending time with their family. They have two children. Daughter Kathryn (Katie) Rael and her husband Chris and their son Xavier, who is their only grandchild; they have spent the



past 16 years spoiling him. Son Jay B. (Blake) Bernard III is not married but "is looking". He lives nearby so they spend more time with him than with their daughter's family. They love their immediate and extended family. Since Jay and Barb are both "only kids", they treasure their relationships with their cousins and their families. Barb was an executive employee of the Housing Authority of the City of Pueblo for 40 plus years. One of her work responsibilities was traveling to training and other job related functions. Over the years she and Jay made several trips, including Washington, DC; San Antonio, Texas; Seattle, Washington; and San Diego, California. They took their kids along whenever possible, which allowed them see parts of our country they would not likely have seen otherwise.

Jay became a Mason in 1975. His father became a Mason in 1947, South Pueblo 31. Working for Bud Moore and Ray Johnson, Jay knew the Shrine was a worthy organization and became a Shriner in 1989. He enjoys being a Shriner and most of their friends are involved with Shrine and Masonic activities.

EAST-WEST SHRINE BOWL COLLEGE FOOTBALL ALL-STAR GAME HEADS TO LAS VEGAS IN 2022

NEW YORK (July 6, 2021) – The East-West Shrine Bowl™, America's longest-running college football all-star game, which supports Shriners Hospitals for Children®, will be played on Feb. 3, 2022, at the home of the Las Vegas Raiders as part of NFL Pro Bowl week.

Televised nationally during primetime on NFL Network, the East-West Shrine Bowl will kick off from Allegiant Stadium, one of the nation's premier professional stadiums.
