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

Featured Member **Robert "Bob" McCormick**

He spent his entire life working in a fish hatchery. Ironically, he does not like to catch or eat them. But from time to time, he found himself out in the wilds on a fishing jaunt. "I only went because Dad liked to go," said Salida native Robert "Bob" McCormick, who spent his entire career at the Mount Shavano Fish Hatchery in Salida. "For a long time, after working with them five days a week, I would not go fishing on the weekends. I did like going ice fishing in the winter when

I was in high school." Born in 1947 in Salida, McCormick graduated from Salida High School in 1965 before enlisting in the Army in October of 1965. After basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., he served his entire two-year tour performing clerical work on the base. After his discharge, McCormick returned to Salida, where he worked at Monarch Dairy until it closed. Then

he worked one summer as a temporary laborer at the Mount Shavano Fish Hatchery under the Colorado Division of Wildlife, which was right up his alley. He first got involved at the hatchery during his senior year in high school while working two hours a day through the coop program to earn his credits. When a position came up after his discharge from the Army, McCormick was hired to work for the Colorado Division of Wildlife, which he did from Nov. 1, 1968, until he retired in March of 2002.

During his tenure at the hatchery, McCormick said he did everything there, from feeding the fish, cleaning the ponds and hauling them to various streams and lakes in the area during the summer months. His last five years, McCormick was in the hatchery building, where the eggs

were raised from babies until the fish were big enough to go outside. "The most enjoyment I got out of working my vears with the Colorado Division of Wildlife were the times you would go out on fish plants ... to some of the high back country," McCormick said. "At times, you would be able to see different forms of wildlife," such as "bear, deer, elk, turkeys and the scenery. A lot of times, you wouldn't see this kind of scenery unless you were a hiker and enjoyed getting into the back country."

His father, the late Harold McCormick, who was a Shriner, had a big influence on his joining the Masonic bodies, including the Salida Lodge No. 57 in 1974 and the Topaz Chapter No. 27 Order of Eastern Star in Salida a year later. McCormick also joined the Southern Colorado Consistory and Salida York Rite, as well the Al Kaly Shrine Temple, the Monarch Shrine Club and Al Kaly Shrine Past Masters Club in 1976.

McCormick credits his clerical work in the Army to helping him with being Secretary of the Salida Lodge No.


57 for the past 30 years. Prior to that, McCormick went through the chairs, serving as Worshipful Master in 1979. If that is not enough, he also served as President of the Monarch Shrine Club several times and has been the Treasurer of it for the past five years. Along the way, McCormick was elected as the Worthy Patron of Topaz Chapter about eight times and is a member of American Legion Post 64 in Salida.

In between, he became the Grand Tiler of the Grand Lodge of Colorado in 2007 and a Potentate's Aide for Past Potentates Jimmy Evans and Ray Gibson.

In his leisure, Bob collects coins, which he started in 1960 in high school, collecting yearly United States mint proof sets and uncirculated sets, along with certain commemorative coins.

But through it all, he says he is lucky. "I've always considered myself to be what they call the right person at the right place at the right time," McCormick said. "Everything worked out for me to be able to come back to Salida and" work in the Mount Shavano Fish Hatchery.

Not long ago, a Noble and friend of mine said that he was saddened by the fact that we in the Shrine had to spend so much





For those who weren't in attendance at the annual

communication in January, I want to let you know that Al Kaly finished the year in the black for the General Fund, Transportation Fund, and the CSSA Ceremonial. Here are some of the highlights of what I reported to the Nobility for 2009.

In the General Fund, we finished with an operation surplus of about \$1,100. We were able to achieve this due to a combination of the Board of Directors significantly reducing expenses during the year, the efforts of the Nobility in supporting our fundraisers such as the cash calendar and the raffle, and the generosity of the units and individuals who made donations to the Al Kaly General Fund. In addition, we finished the year with a gain in our investments of over \$6,400.

For the CSSA Ceremonial, we finished with an operating surplus of over \$11,000. I tip my Fez to those who worked so hard to make CSSA a success. Not only was it a huge hit with those who came to spend the week with us here in Colorado Springs, but it was a financial success as well.

In the Transportation Fund, we finished with an operating surplus of \$6,150. This is especially noteworthy since we've been trending downward for several years. Our success this year is due once again to controlling our expenses, and the many Nobles and Ladies who contributed their time to our fundraisers and their own financial resources through donations and memorials.

My thanks go out to everyone who helped make 2009 a success!

As we move ahead into 2010, we again need your support. Our fundraisers and fundraising activities can only be successful if the members of our Shrine family support them.





The Imperial Council recently approved changes to the Al Kaly By Laws. These changes were approved by the nobility at the August 2009 stated meeting. Please make the following "pen and ink" changes to your copy:

- 1. Cover
 - a. As reads: 2007
 - b. Change to: 2009
- 2. Page 2, Meetings & Ceremonials
 - a. As reads: Stated meetings shall be held during the months of January, March, May, August, October, and December. The dates and times of all meetings, including the annual meeting, shall be designated by the potentate.
 - (a) December Meeting. Officers and representatives for the ensuing year shall be elected at the December stated meeting.
 - (b) Annual Meeting. The annual meeting shall be held during the month of January.
 - b. Change to: Stated meetings will be held at least once in each in each calendar quarter. The dates and times of all meetings, including the annual meeting, shall be designated by the potentate.
 - (a) December Meeting. At the December stated meeting the officers and representatives for the ensuing year shall be elected. The meeting is to be held at the location of the temple.
 - (b) Annual Meeting. The annual meeting shall be held during the month of January at the location of the temple.

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

Burn Week - Feb. 1st to the 5th

Feb. 1st to the 5th is Shrine Burn week. I will be visiting schools and Dwain Jack will be distributing Burn material to several School Districts throughout the territory of Al Kaly Shrine.

During "Burn Awareness Week", Shriners are encouraged to join with the Shriners Hospital for Children in using this first week of February to kick off a yearlong safety and awareness campaign. The focus of the 2010 campaign is preventing burn injuries and we at Al Kaly Shrine will be distributing Burn Awareness materials to the 4th graders in El Paso county, Colorado Springs and Pueblo area public schools.

I would welcome help from any Potentate's Aids in distributing material and also spending 30 minutes with 4th graders in your area discussing Gasoline Safety and Burn Injuries. The kids are great and very inquisitive.

Burn prevention is a key endeavor of Shriners Hospitals for Children, which is why the health care system began its Burn Awareness campaigns over 20 years ago.

The 2010 Burn Awareness Campaign

Reckless use and improper storage of gasoline and injuries resulting from scald burns caused by hot liquids, steam or foods, lead to thousands of young children being burned every year. These dangers are being addressed in Shriners Hospitals 2010 Burn Awareness Week campaign. Burn Awareness Week is recognized each year during the first full week in February.

Gasoline Burn Injuries

To help parents, caregivers, educators and firefighters teach children about the dangers of gasoline; the 2010 campaign provides printable lesson plans and fact sheets, as well as printable coloring pages featuring Anthony the Fire Ant, who takes kids along on his mission to prevent gasoline injuries.

"Tweens" and teens ages 10-14 years old are four times more likely to get in trouble with gasoline. For this age group, the campaign uses the personal story of Austin Bailiff, a teen who sustained serious burns over most of his body as a result of he and a friend experimenting with gasoline to set fire to a glove. Austin shares his experiences in an effort to reach out to other teens in an effort to prevent others from making the same mistake.

Scald Burn Injuries

Scald burns are the most common burn injury among children age 4 and younger, and kids in this age group have the highest mortality rates for this type of injury. In one year, U.S. hospitals treated an estimated 16,000 children under the age of 5 for scalds.

To help parents, caregivers, educators and firefighters educate kids and the public, the 2010 campaign provides posters and stickers featuring helpful scald prevention information.

In addition to the resources immediately available on this Web site, Shriners Hospitals for Children is providing resources for order, at no charge, that can be used during Burn Awareness Week and throughout the year.

Quick Facts About Gasoline and Scald Burn Injuries

• Each year in the United States, 1.1 million burn injuries require medical attention. Approximately 4,500 people die. And up to 10,000 people die every year in the U.S. from burn-related infections.

• The Shriners Hospitals for Children specializing in treating burn injuries have admitted more than 10,000 acute pediatric burn patients since 1994.

• Kids ages 13 and older are in the highest at-risk group for gasoline and other flammable substance burns.


• According to the Consumer Products Safety Commission, in one year approximately 1,270 children under age 5 were treated in emergency rooms for injuries resulting from the misuse of gasoline and unsecured gasoline cans.

• Children ages 10-14 are almost four times more likely to get in trouble with gasoline.


• Every day, more than 300 young children with scald burns are taken to emergency rooms.



An Editorial Without Words

The Shriner standing on the pedestal as you enter the Colorado Springs Shrine Club is a symbol of love and dedication with all Shriners and will linger in the thoughts of many who have gained the knowledge of its' existence. We have made changes in it since its' origin, when in 1998 Ill. Sir Earl Aldrich instituted a dramatic change in the way we conducted the Shriners' Childrens' Clinics. Under the leadership of Noble Robert H. Kula, Ed.S. as chairman of the newly formed Hospital Representative program, the logo we were used to – the Silent Messenger, changed from a Shriner walking away to a Shriner walking forward. back. That picture was the only one that turned out on the entire roll. From this, the "Silent Messenger" was founded as we have known it for all these years, but a change was in store.

Under the leadership of Ill. Sir Earl many changes were made in how we conducted the entire Shrine Clinic Program. The Hospital Reps were to wear black trousers, white shirt, a green sport coat not

the least a Silent Messenger Bola. A new Bola was made especially for the Hospital Reps – the "Inverse Messenger", a Messenger walking forward or toward you. This Bola was made by an engraver and foundry specialist in Albuquerque, New Mexico who made only 24 to satisfy the number of existing Hospital Reps. The Hospital Reps wanted to be known and recognized as a group but not become a singular Shrine Unit. This Bola gave them the one item that would do that without announcements. The Bola was constructed of pewter and gold plated, black neck strand and gold bullet ends and worn with Honor and Pride.

This Bola has become a collector's delight and at the present time there are actions to reincarnate it for the future Hospital Reps to adorn in their pursuit for "Our Kids". I had many happy years in my efforts to help the Clinic Program and wish every success to those who hold the future in store. We were saddened to learn that Noble Al Hortman passed away on December 9, 2009.


