



A HISTORY LESSON

What an interesting experience to talk with IS Billy Thornburg who was Potentate in 1993 and his Lady Leah. They are great examples of dedication and commitment to Al Kaly Shrine and the International Shrine. Things have changed a lot since IS Billy entered the Shrine in 1975. Al Kaly has changed certainly in numbers of Shriners, When IS Billy was Potentate, there were thirty two hundred members and more active units. Of course the Hospital System has grown



in scope or treatment and the techniques developed. IS Billy has been faithful and participates in many functions and capacities.

IS Billy was raised in Houston, Texas and joined the US Army with a buddy right after high school. After Basic, they were sent in different directions. He was sent to Vietnam and while there got disabled by Agent Orange. He is sixty per cent disabled from it. When he was returned stateside, he ended up at Ft. Carson where he retired from the Army after six years. While he was there, he met Lady Leah and their story began. Between them they had nine children that they raised together. One son was lost while he was in the Service. Six of the children live in the state, one lives in Kansas and one in California. They have a family tradition of spending time together, just hanging out and just being together. The day of my visit, instead of packing for their annual two week trip to Mexico with family, they calmly chatted. They pack what they want to take and if they forget something, no big deal. They have other weeks dedicated to family time and enjoy their time and family.

IS Billy and Lady Leah have been married forty seven years. She continued to work and supervise the hospital lab at Ft. Carson for fifty years. IS Billy retired after thirty years of government service. Before he retired, he bought a liquor store and filling station where he saved up enough money to buy his first Model A. That started a hobby that he still enjoys. A visit to their home isn't complete without a tour of his collection of cars that he has restored. He shows them and drives them in parades

> with the Flivvers. One truck, complete with a painting by a son-in-law, looks brand new after several decades of driving.

IS Billy became a Mason in 1975 because Lady Leah's mother wanted to join Eastern Star. Her mom became ill and never joined Eastern Star, but they went on to be Worthy Patron and Worthy Matron in 1982 and 1983. IS Billy was Worshipful Master of Coal Creek Lodge and a member of Fountain Valley Lodge 191. He joined the Consistory in 1976 and Al Kaly in 1977. Bud Moore was Potentate and Bill Shawley his first line signer. As fate would have it, IS Billy

was Western State Association President the same year he was Potentate. That was a challenging and busy year. He was still working at the time and all of his bosses encouraged him to do what he needed to do and not worry about his hours there. They traveled almost nonstop for that year visiting the WSA activities and parades and attending all the units and clubs in Al Kaly.

IS Billy's dedication to the

Shrine extends to Imperial Sessions. He has attended twenty four consecutive sessions and is an Imperial Marshal Representative. You need to attend fifteen consecutive sessions to become an Imperial Marshall. They enjoy going to Imperial and always make it a vacation. Interesting note, when IS Billy got his thirty-third degree from Consistory, he went in with Jack Elway, John Elway's dad in Denver.

Then the blocks were assembled and quilted and given to the Potentate and his Lady as a Memory Quilt. What a precious gift to receive.

We looked back over all the years of involvement and the fun and friends and it brings the whole idea of fun and fellowship as well as helping children into focus. Both parts of the Shriner's mission are needed to keep the Shrine alive and moving forward. Last year I made mention of a new web-based membership program that will replace our current "stand alone" membership program in the Office. 1939 Shriner Drum Gets Facelift and New Stage at CSU-Pueblo



As published in an October CSU-Pueblo Press Release

The Shriners are known for their generous philanthropic nature, especially as it relates to children, but the 2010 gift of an old drum to Colorado State University-Pueblo now has the campus moving to a different beat.

The Al Kaly Shrine gave the drum to the University in 2010 in poor shape, on a broken three-wheeler golf cart that was unsafe to drive. The Shriners have a longstanding relationship with CSU-Pueblo Athletics, having sponsored football games from 1951-1983. The Shriners then established the Al Kaly Basketball Tournament in Massari Arena in 1983, which continues to this day.

Enter CSU-Pueblo Materials Supervisor Anthony Bonfiglio, who approached Owen Hunt of Stickies Stickers and then carried the project through to completion. Bonfiglio had a relationship with Hunt, who installed decals on University fleet vehicles. When asked to create a new stencil to cover up the old Shriners artwork, however, Hunt and his friend Matt Langloss, who both have backgrounds in fabrication, paint, and body, fell in love with the project. The two have donated significant time and resources to refurbishing the drum and the cart on which it is transported.

"We were hooked instantly," Hunt said. "We wanted to find a way to make it salvageable both as an instrument and a vehicle."

Hunt and Langloss first did a search and found a drum head large enough with the original Remo Company

that made the drum in California. He traced the drum back to 1939 through an original packing certificate for the railway he found with the drum and believes it has spent most of its life here in Colorado. He said Puebloans may remember seeing it in parades with Shriner clowns as drivers.

"Once the drum was done, it was too pretty to be transported on the worn out cart, which needed a major overhaul," he said.

After finding the new drum heads, Hunt and Langloss stripped it down to the bare metal and totally rebuilt the cart into a four-wheel drive cart, installing new LED head and tail lights as well as lights in the drum for night events. A new gong mallet allows the cheer squad to bang the drum after every score.

The refurbished drum has a prominent place front and center at home football games and will have a special place of honor at the 31st annual Al Kaly Basketball tournament, scheduled this year for Nov. 14-15.

"It's a passion of ours, doing things that are off the wall," he said. "You don't get the opportunity to say 'yes' to refurbishing something like this every day!"

LISTEN TO GRANDDAD

When Michelle Ransom was four months into her second pregnancy, she was told that her baby had cleft lip and palate. She immediately became involved in the research and in the treatment of the condition. She wanted to be prepared for caring for her child. She had the

special bottles needed and was prepared for what she would need to do to care for him.

Dad Duane's grandfather, the late Noble George Doring, suggested that they go to the Shriners, but Michelle and Duane were under the impression that the hospitals were for those who couldn't afford to pay for the treatment.

They had insurance that covered most of the cost. They were living in Idaho at the time and Ryan's first surgeries were done there.

When the family moved to Colorado and Duane was no longer in the service, they found out about what the Shriner Hospital system could do. They chose to go to the LA Shriner Hospital because they had family who live in



the area and they could stay with them during the visits and the surgeries. There were two very successful operations on Ryan's nose.

Ryan is twelve now and his last surgery was when he was nine. He needed to have a bone graft from his hip to complete the repair of his palate. The downside to that surgery was being on a liquid diet for six weeks. He was







so bored with the liquid diet that Michelle decided to improvise. One of his favorite meals was pureed pizza. (I can't imagine it, but there you are.) The bone graft was very painful and having to heal his hip while drinking his meals was not a pleasant time. He will not have the surgeries to align his jaws until he reaches his full growth,

usually when he reaches his late teens.

The Shriners are not held to a specific time line. Shriners take care of their children until the services are completed to the Shriner's satisfaction.

Ryan is an active boy who enjoys hockey and is

involved with the Colorado College Junior League team the Glaciers He loves the contact and athleticism required for hockey. He is a good student at Sky View Middle School where social studies and PE rank as his favorite classes. He is grateful to the Shriners for their help and for the knowledge that they will care for him in the future

There were several things that were inspiring about this family and their attitude



toward Ryan's challenges. First off, Michelle, not only learned whatever she could before Ryan's birth, she put her knowledge into action by preparing information packets and bottles to be given to the families whose children were born with cleft lip and palate. She emphasizes that this condition can be repaired. She also started a Cleft Lip and Palate Group on the Internet. There is an active blog group where people can ask questions and share information and encouragement with one another. Michelle refers others to the Shriner Hospital System on this page. By reaching out to others, the Ransoms have turned their experiences into a positive service to others.

Another lesson that can be learned from their experiences is the desire to let people know that the Shriner



Mule Train Flag Ceremony at Installation

The Mule Train Flag Ceremony is normally performed with the riders on mules. The ceremony is actually a visual and audio presentation of the American Flag history, although a brief history at that. We perform the ceremony to open horse shows, rodeos, and just about anything else we are asked to do. We even opened one rodeo at the Colorado State Fair a few years ago.

The first rider rides out at a trot, displaying an early version of the flag. He rides around the arena then stops, facing the audience. Each succeeding iteration of the flag is displayed in the same manner until ten flags are displayed in a line facing the audience. A rider then rides out at a trot carrying the Colorado State Flag, but this rider stops and stands in front of the line of older American Flags. The last rider enters the arena at a lope carrying the current (50 Star Flag) and circles the arena coming to a stop in front of the State Flag. The Star Spangled Banner is then played and the Pledge of Allegiance recited by the audience. Very Impressive! A short history of each flag is narrated by Shirley Fortney via public address system. Shirley, by the way, does a great job.

For the very first time, however, we Mule Train members and Ladies performed the Flag Ceremony on

Noble Eugene Howard, better known as "BB" the clown, has answered the last summons of the Grand Warden of Heaven and entered into that Celestial Lodge above. His memorial service was held on January 7, and several of our members were able to attend.

Noble Eugene graduated from Pueblo Centennial High School in 1948 and served in the United States Army with the Military Police in France and Germany from 1950 to 1953. When he returned from duty, he returned to his civilian job at CF&I Steel Mill where he was a roller in the rail mill for 17 years before becoming the foreman of that department for the last 20 years of his career until he retired in 1987.

Noble Eugene joined Silver State Lodge #95 in 1951 and was raised in 1953. He was a very active member, serving as Secretary of the lodge from 1997 until 2001. He was also a member of the Scottish Rite and York Rite bodies in addition to being a Shriner. Eugene was Past Worthy Patron of Pueblo Chapter #7 of The Order of the Eastern Star and Past Royal Patron of Laurel Court #16, Order of the Amaranth. Noble Eugene was also the 2002 recipient of the Reisenecker Award by Silver State Lodge #95 for his service to Freemasonry.

His hobby was restoring antique cars; over the years he has owned a 1920 Model "T" Ford, a 1948 DeSoto, a 1953 and 1951 Cadillac, a 1937 Auburn, a 1937 Pontiac, a 1966 Chevrolet, and a 1934 Hudson Terraplane, among many others.

He was married for 60 years to his wife Ruthie and








Top: Noble Eugene on his wedding day. Below: Noble Eugene with some of his antique cars.
