

I am excited to share that today, Shriners Hospitals for Children® will announce a multi-year naming rights agreement with the Astros Foundation for their annual college baseball tournament. This 16 year Astros tradition, one of the top collegiate baseball tournaments in the nation, will now be named the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic.

The Astros Foundation will continue to operate the tournament and will announce for the first time in its history that the 2016 Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic will be nationally televised on the MLB Network. This media exposure provides yet another nationally televised platform for Shriners Hospitals to reach new audiences to share our mission to provide expert pediatric specialty care to children, regardless of the families' ability to pay.

The Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic will be played at Minute Maid Park, home of the Houston Astros, Feb. 26-28, 2016. Shriners Hospitals will be integrated into aspects of the on-air production including onfield activities, commercials and videos about our mission. Fundraising opportunities are also incorporated through ticket sales, merchandising and additional corporate sponsors.

This event is regarded as one of the top collegiate baseball tournaments in the nation, as it continues to draw

fans, top-ranked programs and scouts from every Major League organization each year.

In 2016, the tournament boasts a strong lineup, featuring five teams that finished in the top 25 of D1baseball.com's final rankings in 2015. The 2016 Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic will include TCU (#4), Arkansas (#9), UL Lafayette (#16), Houston (#22), Rice (#25) and Texas Tech.

Participating teams are by invitation only and change each year. Previous tournament teams have included University of Tennessee, Arizona State University, University of Alabama, University of California, University of Hawaii, University of Kentucky, Kansas State University, LSU, University of North Carolina, Ohio State, UCLA and University of Utah.

AN INTERESTING STORY

Noble Garnic Kidwell is best known for his position as Chief Aide for five Potentates and for being Assistant Chief Aide to several others. He and his Lady Marilyn have gone a lot of different places and have seen a lot of different motel/

hotel rooms where they made sure, in various Hospitality Rooms, people were happy and fed and watered. It is no small task, yet it is one they are able to do with an ease and grace which comes from helping so many Potentates be gracious hosts.

How Noble Garnic came to Colorado is an interesting tale. Garnic has worked in Information Technology

his whole life, starting out in Virginia working for various companies. In fact, that is how he and Lady Marilyn met. They were working in the same company with IT related jobs and within six months of meeting, in 1972 they were married. She, of course, had to change jobs because that was how the working world functioned in those days.

He reminisced about the growth of capacity in memory as the computers grew smaller and smaller and smarter and smarter. They started working with tapes and a card system. Those definitely were not the "good old days" of the computer industry.

Garnic and Marilyn eventually had two daughters. Tammy and husband Christian Eben live with their son in Virginia and while Dawn and Derrich Williams live in Georgia with their two daughters and a baby boy due in March. It keeps the thought of "family" in another part of the country as they go back and forth to keep involved with their grandchildren and children.

Noble Garnic progressed in his different jobs, and was working for MCI when it was bought by another company. As the industry changed and merged, he was given the choice in 1993 to move to Colorado Springs or look for another job. They moved with MCI which eventually became VISA and is now located in Denver.

Before they moved out west, they were involved in the Masonic family as Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron of Eastern Star. Their daughters were both High Queens in Job's Daughters. Noble Garnic became a Mason with his brotherin-law Jack Horseman as his first line signer. This is where things get very complicated.

Noble Garnic was born Garnic Knott and has four older sisters. They lived on a farm adjoining the Kidwell farm. His mother died when he was two and his father did what he could to keep the family

together. Eventually, however, the older sisters were sent to live with relatives. The Kidwells, who had no children, had cared for little Garnic while his mother was ill and after she died, wanted to adopt and raise him. His father reluctantly agreed and Garnic entered school as Garnic Kidwell. The family was split up for quite a while and Noble Garnic went to school, graduated and went to college.

A while after he and Lady Marilyn were married, they received

a phone call from Barbara Horseman, who turned out to be Noble Garnie's oldest sister. She asked if they would like to get together with the rest of the family. They did, of course, and met his father and step-mother and his sisters and their families

When their daughters were the age for joining Job's Daughters Noble Garnic asked his brother-in-law Jack about becoming a Mason so Garnic could sign the girl's petitions to join Job's. He was raised a Mason in 1987 in


I want to mention the Daughters of the Nile High Tea Feb 6th at the Colorado Springs Shrine Club (my timing may be off, remember this is my first submission

"WHERE'S MY DUES CARD?"

I've been receiving many phone calls/emails (at work and at home) from nobles wanting to know where their 2016 dues cards

are. Remember under the new Web Fez program dues cards are now being mailed from Tampa (International HQ).

Dues notices were mailed on or about November 1, 2015 from Tampa. The instructions are to pay your dues to Al Kaly. When we receive your payment we input the payment into Web Fez (we've been inputting them within 24 hours of receipt) and then Tampa issues a dues cards to an active member with a \$0 dues balance.

Cards were issued twice in December, twice in January and, as they call it, "maintenance" thereafter. If you're registered on Web Fez (we have a disappointing number of 78 nobles registered) you can go to the "General Information" page and there's a block "Dues Card Sent" to tell you if your card has been mailed (obviously dues must be paid first).

Tampa has identified a number of issues with the first "batch" issued – no middle initial or suffix on the cards. And, there is no prefix "Noble," "Ill Sir," etc. If this is an issue with you, Tampa will reissue your card at their expense. Let us know and we'll inform them (hopefully you'll be content with the card you received as this is an expense to everyone).

In their bombardment of complaints, another is the "Dues Status" is not on the card, such as "Total Life Member", "Regular Member", etc. Tampa folks are aware of the issues and want "Happy Nobles" so I'm sure they will make this right for everyone.

We have a small number of temporary cards we can issue to you if you're going to visit another Shrine and you don't yet have your 2016 card. Again, let us know. Last, thanks again, for your confidence in re-electing me to another year as your Recorder.

Ever Heard of "The Toeless Wonder"?

Ben Agajanian is Armenian but was born in Santa Ana, California on August 28, 1919, making him 96 years old. He graduated from the University of New Mexico, but while at his work in 1940, the toes on his "kicking foot" were crushed and so severely damaged they could not be repaired with the medical knowledge of the time. Consequently, four of the toes on that foot had to be amputated.

Despite the amputation, he had a phenomenal place-kicking ability, and maintained a long football career in the NFL and AFL from the 1930s to the 1960s. He was dubbed "The Toeless Wonder," and played for no less than 10 teams during that time. He was the documented "first kicking specialist".

Ben set several records in those early years with many of the football giants; most of those records have since been broken by newer players. Today Ben lives in San Diego, California.

Why do we care? Ben is a Brother Noble and is still a member of El Bekal Shriners.


Ruhamah Temple No. 71 - Daughters of the Nile

Happy New Year to all of you. What a wonderful year it was and I couldn't be more pleased with all the support I received during this past year.

Just a few dates to remember: January 25th will be our next Stated Session, February 6th is our annual High Tea,

It has been brought to my attention that some members of the Shrine and Nile don't know how the "Adopt a Bag" project was started. Here is some information: Several years ago the Hospital Request committee started making draw-string bags and filling with toilet articles, crayons and other small items and sent them to the hospitals for the parents and children. When the hospitals began requesting Gift Cards rather than the items we were sending we abandoned the cloth bags and started requesting money donations to be put in envelopes so that we could purchase Gift Cards from Target and WalMart. In 2011-2012 our Temple had the distinction of sending the largest dollar amount of \$1,480.00 in Gift Cards to the hospitals. The total came from the Ruhamah Units and Clubs and pop tabs collected and sold. Anyone could "Adopt a Bag" making it an excellent project for everyone

to become involved with.

Other Temples caught onto our gift card idea and in 2013-2014 we were tied for second place sending \$3300 in gift cards. In 2015 we were asked by the hospital if we could send money instead of gift cards to the Children's Need Fund at the Salt Lake City Children's Life Center. This gives the hospital the opportunity not to be limited to the stores we bought the gift cards from but to buy from companies that sell to them at wholesale or bulk.

The pop tabs that are collected are accumulated, turned in for cash and the money added to the "Adopt a Bag" donations. Shriners have donated huge bags of tabs to us. Pr. Judith Barto, known at the "pop tab lady" in Alamosa and Fort Garland, has collected numerous 5 gallon buckets full.


BOWLING LEAGUE

AL KALY MULE TRAIN

Wayne Coble has been the Mule Train farrier for quite a number of years. Not long ago he was at the Mule Train to trim the mules' hooves. Geno Romero, Gale Fortney, LD Younts, Debbie DuPont, and yours truly were there to help halter the mules. Ok, we didn't need that many people, but we like to be there to visit with Wayne. LD and I queried him a little along the way to satisfy our curiosity.

"Most of these mules don't need trimming," he said.

"How much growth do you look for?" I asked.
"Three eights," he said. Three eighths meaning three eighths of an inch. "Lemme show you." He picked up a front hoof of a small mule named Jill and quickly removed the dirt (and other stuff) from the hoof with a hoof pick.

"And they are like people, that is, each is different. Each mule's hooves grows at a different rate. Age plays a part, too. Younger mules' hooves grow faster than the older ones."

He put his hoof pick in his apron (a thick leather apron with pockets), pulled out his hoof knife and trimmed the frog. The frog is a soft cushion area at the rear of every

hoof. He then pulled out his hoof nippers, a tool which looks like some sort of modified pair of pliers with about 14" handles. He quickly and expertly trimmed off a bit of hoof, pulled his rasp and smoothed the hoof. He picked up the trimmings, showed it to LD and me and said, "See, three eighths. She could have gone a little longer, say to a half."

Holy cow, er, holy mule!, I thought. You can tell the difference between three eighths of an inch and a half an inch just by looking?

"That mule there," he said, pointing with his nippers, "is pigeon toed. She doesn't need trimming yet, but I always trim her so she can walk a little straighter on that hoof."

"How can you tell if the hoof is straight?" (That was LD asking the question.) Wayne found a mule that needed trimming and quickly put the nippers to the hoof, then rasped the bottom smooth and straight.

"Lay the rasp across the bottom of the hoof and eyeball it. If the rasp is not level and straight then a little more work is needed." He laid his rasp against the bottom of the hoof in demonstration.

"Take a look at this hoof over here," he said, this time pointing with the rasp. "See these ridges along the hoof wall? That means this mule is not digesting his feed properly. It's not really a problem, but it can be."




