












Featured Member Frank Klein

Frank was born and raised in San Antonio, TX., lived there through college until he entered the military as a Field Artillery Officer and earned a degree in Business Administration with a Major in Marketing from St. Mary's University in San Antonio.

At age 9, he began music lessons on the Hawaiian steel guitar and in country western music. By age 14, he was playing in a trio which grew into a band known as the "Texas Star Playboys", performing on TV and radio. Frank played with that band through high school and college. 
When he was 10 years old, Frank went to see the Blackstone Magic Show in San Antonio. The show lit a fire in him which has never gone out. He started doing magic professionally about 1965... on top of his day job! Frank performed at the Broadmoor Hotel for 16 years, as well as all the major hotels in Colorado Springs and all over Colorado. For six years he has been performing magic at one particular private house party spending two hours walking around doing close-up magic for the guests....both kids and adults. Frank also attends one or two magic conventions each year.

Frank loves photography – has been involved in photography for almost 50 years! His website WWW. FRANKKLEIN.ZENFOLIO.COM has galleries of his photos; a very impressive collection! Many of the photos on the Al Kaly website were taken by Frank as he has been an Al Kaly photographer for 10 years.

There's a place in Utah where he would love to do some photography, but it requires a guide, a 3-hour hike in and 3 hour hike back--that's a little more than he wants to tackle! (But he hasn't ruled it out.) He has a friend who will take him to a similar place a little north of Las Vegas. He, also, attends

a photoshop convention every year.

Frank entered the Army as a Field Artillery Officer a month after completing college. He became certified as a pilot in fixed wing aircraft and later served as an instructor pilot at the Army Aviation School. A transition into helicopters came next and he flew CH47 Chinook helicopters for two tours




in Vietnam. During his 30 years in the Army, he was also stationed in Korea and Turkey. He enjoyed Turkey – an exciting and rewarding tour (you'll see why later).

Between his Vietnam tours the Army sent him to Texas A&M University where he obtained a Masters degree in Meteorology. His last five years in the Army, he was assigned to the Pentagon where he spent two years with the Joint Chiefs of Staff using his weather background. While at the Pentagon, he was awarded the Superior Service Medal. Along with it, his

Army career earned him two Distinguished Flying Crosses plus 18 Air Medals and a Bronze Star. He retired as a Colonel.

For the next 25 years, Frank worked for Science & Technology Corporation as a Program Manager on contracts. Frank met Janell through friends he knew in Turkey (this is why his tour there was so special); they had all retired to Colorado



Springs. These friends invited Frank to a dinner party and just happened to invite Janell as well. Frank did some magic, as he usually did, at their house. The spell must have worked—they have now been married 18 1/2 years!

Frank and his first wife didn't have children before she passed away but Janell has a son and daughter from her first marriage who both have children.

Frank has a close relationship with her children and when her daughter got married, since her father had died, she asked Frank to take her father's place and give her away. That's a relationship to be treasured! Frank and Janell stay

should they lose their current card and need one in a pinch.






