FEATURED SHRINER - T'CHRIS GARDNER

T'Chris was born and raised in the beach areas of Los Angeles, California. His name is Scottish – subsequently, the "T" is simply the letter T. It's just T'Chris. His dad is of German descent and his mom is Dutch and Irish.

When he was a young child, he was diagnosed with Klippel-Feil syndrome, a bone disorder characterized by the abnormal joining (fusion) of two or more spinal bones

in the neck (cervical vertebrae). The doctors told him they could either fix it or he would be paralyzed by 15 or dead by his 30's. "The surgery must have worked because I'm still here and mobile." T'Chris says he has always been a go, go, go person; he was afraid he wouldn't be done by the time he was 30! He used to think "Wow, 13 surgeries by the time I was 13 is so many!" But getting to know the Shriners Hospitals, he realizes it's not that many after all.

He earned his first degree from Ft. Lewis College in Durango, Colorado, a bachelors in communications - that was just the beginning. He went on to earn a masters in computer science from the University of Phoenix and a masters in systems engineering from Colorado Technical University. Eventually,



he hopes to complete his doctorate in computer science from Colorado Technical University as well. He's currently a software development instructor at Colorado Technical University.

T'Chris' hobbies includes working at the Renaissance Festival (nearly 20 years selling turkey legs), home brewing (stout beer is his specialty) and rocket building. One year he lost track of time on a batch of home brew. It wasn't until a buddy called asking if he had any beer for an upcoming event did the light bulb go on. He decided to bottle it in wine bottles.

T'Chris and a friend dabbled in building rockets. They had successfully made 13 launches out of Roswell, New Mexico. During one launch they were testing a new deployment system; it worked, the rocket went up. However, it came down through a cloud – and it never came out of the cloud! They went out in search of the rocket and it should have been easy to locate; the parachute was bright orange. A couple of weeks passed when the pilot they hired called saying he located the rocket;

about 100 feet from where it was projected to land. Ironically, the parachute was neatly folded up beneath the rocket. During that time, it had snowed and there was no weather damage. Even the windows on the fuselage



were still clean! They decided to review the onboard electronics for data feedback. While the equipment was all there, it was completely "clean". It was as though it had never been turned on; no data as if it had never been activated...nothing! To this day, they've never been able to figure out exactly what happened. Aliens?

His interest in Masonry began in New Mexico when an acquaintance invited him to become a member. Life got in the way and between one thing and another he never made it to the



Roswell lodge and he lost contact with the individual. Their conversations about Masonry made a lasting impression with him, so much that he sought out a lodge here in Colorado. As time passed, and he learned the craft and was elected into the position of Secretary. He currently holds a "line" position and hopes one day to become a Worshipful Master. It was one of his Masonic mentors that asked him if he would be interested in becoming a Shriner...the rest is history! T'Chris is associated with the Corvettes unit. While he's still technically part of them, he always ends up



helping out the band – just driving the trailer, not playing in it!

Periodically T'Chris can be found tending bar at the club. He is TIPS certified (Training for Intervention Procedures); he attended class to learn how to serve and when to cut alcohol off. He started bartending when someone asked him to fill in and lend a hand. He has worked several wedding receptions and the Oktober fest. He plans to assist with bar duties during the Fall Ceremonial.

NATIONAL BURN AWARENESS WEEK FEBRUARY 3-8, 2019

Burn Awareness Week is an opportunity for parents to remind their children of the procedures for fire safety and prevent accidents and injuries from happening.

Each year Shriners International sponsors Burn Week material to all children in the primary schools. El Paso & Teller county school systems are provided with Burn Safety booklets to all 4th graders. Noble Dr. Ralph Hathaway of El Paso county and Noble Wayne McKee for Teller County distribute over 6000 Burn Booklets thoughout the various schools.

Results from an independent survey conducted by Shriners Hospitals for Children shows many parents do not practice fire and burn prevention in the home.

Safety in the home requires plans for the family to have an escape route in case of fire. All family members should practice their escape safely; don't forget pets as well.

Smoke detectors should be placed on each floor and near bedrooms to alert occupants of a possible fire. Fire extinguishers should be readily available in strategic locations such as in the kitchen.

Cooking is the number one cause of home fires. Small children are at particularly high risk for burn injuries due to their immature motor and cognitive skills, inability to selfrescue, and dependence on adults for supervision and dangeravoidance intervention.

Over 350,000 scald burn injuries associated with consumer household appliances and products (e.g., stoves, coffee makers, tableware, cookware, bathtubs. etc.) were seen in hospital ER's in the U.S. between 2013-2017, 78,526 (21%) of these occurred to children 4 years and younger.

Did you know that hot water will burn skin at temperatures much lower than boiling point (212 degrees/F)? In fact, it only takes 3 seconds of exposure to 140 degrees of water to cause a burn serious enough to require surgery. All water heaters should be set at 120 degrees or just below the medium setting. A safe bathing temperature is 100 degrees/F.

Most of the Burn injuries occur in the home; tragically, children are especially vulnerable to burn injuries. Almost onequarter (24 %) of all burn injuries occur in children under the age of 15.

The good news is that 96.7 % of those treated in burn centers will survive and unfortunately, many of those survivors will sustain scarring, life-long physical disabilities, and adjustment difficulties.

Kilee gives back to help other burn patients



about the work they do."

On November 10, 2014, 16-year-old Kilee arrived home from school and discovered a bad smell in her house. What she did not know was that the odor was coming from a gas leak. She lit a scented candle to eliminate the smell and the gas furnes ignited in a fisry blast. Kilee was thrown backwards and knocked unconscious. She awoke to her dog barking over her, felt flames enveloping her body and got up to run to neighbors for help.

After being medevacked to an emergency room for initial care, Kilee was in critical condition with burn injuries over 45 percent of her body. She was later transferred to Striners Hospitals for Children — Cincinnati where she underwent troatment for 38 days.

Kilee has since undergone surgerles, skin grafts and painful ongoing physical therapy to regain her independence and relearn simple tasks like tying her shoes and even turning a doorknob.

Remarkably, less than a year after the explosion, Kilee was back to playing varsity soccer. She says, "I've gotten my life back because of Shriners Hospitals, and I want to spread the word
