
The Ladies said they are all proud to be Honored Ladies and enjoy being a part of the Shrine activities.


This is an opportunity for the Al Kaly temple to raise funds for their Hospital Fund Drive. The donations are dispersed by the temple in the same manner as their paper drive.





I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Clowns for all of the support they gave the Unit and Al Kaly Shrine during this past year.






