

THANKS FOR A JOB WELL DONE!

Fred Kiger is retiring yet again from active duty. Back in 2006, then Assistant Rabban Bill Stoner recruited Fred to help with the recycling program which had been started a few years earlier by the late Noble Jack Cooper. When Bill became Potentate in 2008, Fred took over the program for good. Finally, the recycling program is being

ended, thus another retirement for Fred.

Fred enlisted in the US Army when he was sixteen, with his mother's blessing. He was one of five boys and it made sense at the time. He spent eleven years in the Eleventh Airborne with his first posting to Lebanon in 1957. Members of the Eleventh Airborne were the first servicemen to receive the Armed Forces Expeditionary medals which are now routinely issued for being in a Police Action.

When Fred met Charlotte, he was stationed in Germany. They were both

quite young and for the Army to allow them to marry, Charlotte had to pass muster from a variety of officers before the nineteen year old, Fred, could marry Charlotte. Their first five years were spent with Fred traveling and home only about a year during that time. They have been married fifty four years and have two children.

Fred and Charlotte lived all over the world, and Fred filled different positions. but many were in procurement and material management. Their second child was born in Holland where Fred was attached to the American Embassy. Freddy Jr. had dual citizenship and had to sort that out when he was eighteen and told to register for the army in Holland.

During many assignments, Fred shipped Charlotte and the kids to live with his mother in Alabama. They only spoke English at home and when they were school age, they went to the Department of Defense Schools. Both children came to the US for college. When it was time to retire, after thirty years, Fred stayed on in Germany where he became a private contractor to the US Government, for the next career of fourteen years. He had a Resident Stamp and paid German taxes and they lived in a village in the mountains where there was only one other non-German couple. Charlotte, meanwhile, worked for 25 years in banking.

Fred had become a Master Mason in 1980 in Germany. He was very active in his Lodge and went through the chairs, but his position in logistics required him to travel a great deal and he felt he could not give the proper amount of time if he became Master of the Lodge. His older brother is the Tyler for the Shriner Temple in

> Atlanta. One other brother is a Master Mason. He became a Shriner in 1982 and joined the Scottish Rite that year as well.

> When their children settled in the States and married, it was time to move to the States. So, in 1999 Fred came looking for a place located near the children. In 2000, they moved to Colorado Springs with the mountains and feel of home. Their daughter Julie was then living in Parker and their son was living in Colorado Springs. Falcon seemed to be a good place to resettle. Julie and her husband, Tyler McKee, now live in Indiana where she works in the



Department of Finance. She is a retired Air Force Master Sergeant. Fred Jr. and Michelle have two children Freddie and Catlyn. Freddie left the Army after eight years.

In 2004, they went to a Shrine Circus and IS Lionel Robertson was chatting with people who came to the Circus. When IS Lionel discovered that Fred was a Shriner, he sent Fred a Petition for Affiliation. When he joined the next year and got to know people, he became involved with the Potentate's Escort because he always had a motorcycle. Fred is still involved with the Escort and has filled many

positions there. He also has been the Marshal, officially and unofficially, since 2008. It is a frustrating and fulfilling job. He realizes how important Parades are to getting the message of Shriner Hospitals out to people. That position takes patience and understanding, as well as organizational skills which Fred brings to any position.

IS Bill Stoner turned the recycling program over to Fred to manage and grow for Al Kaly. Over the years Fred estimates that it has produced between seventy and eighty thousand dollars for the benefit of the Al Kaly Shrine. The recycling program at one point had one hundred twelve bins in Colorado Springs and fifty-four in Pueblo. Every quarter Fred visited the bin locations and the people who requested them. That activity put twelve hundred to fourteen hundred miles on his vehicle. He would trouble shoot if the company had a problem and arrange for bins to be placed or picked up. The CS Police would call with problems with the bins. One New Year's Eve the Fire Department called in the middle of the night because of a fire in a bin. It was not unusual to have homeless crawl into the bins to get warm and sometimes light a fire that got out of control while they were in there. The locks only helped some, but if you really want to get in, there's always a way. Wayne McKey checked on the Pueblo bins and dealt with the issues there. Losing the bins will be a financial loss for Al Kaly. It seemed to come in magically and people liked knowing that their waste papers could bring money to the Shrine. Fred has done a yeoman's task for all these years and was not ready to retire again. It wasn't his choice, and he'll probably find something else to keep him busy. Thanks for all the hard work and dedication, Fred, from Al Kaly Shriners.



As you read this, we have closed on another successful year. For me, closing the year with our final OVs - Potentates' Motor



Shriners Hospitals Research Helps Determine Effectiveness of Bracing in Treating Scoliosis

Bracing in adolescents with idiopathic scoliosis reduces the likelihood that the condition will progress to the point that surgery is needed, according to a study published online in the New England Journal of Medicine. The work was supported by Shriners Hospitals for Children® and the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases (NIAMS), part of the National Institutes of Health.

Scoliosis is a musculoskeletal disorder that causes an abnormal curve of the spine or backbone, causing the spine to look more like an "S" or a "C" rather than a straight line, typically affecting 1 in 1,000 children. Adolescent idiopathic scoliosis (AIS) is a curve with no known cause. Mild cases may only need observation by a physician. In more serious cases, especially when the patient is still skeletally immature, other treatments may be needed, such as bracing, or in very severe cases, surgery. However, the effectiveness of bracing for AIS has been in question.

Results of a multi-year study supported by Shriners Hospitals for Children, the National Institutes of Health, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research and other organizations

"Knowing – with confidence – that bracing is effective changes the treatment paradigm," said Matthew Dobbs, M.D., orthopaedic surgeon at Shriners Hospitals for Children – St. Louis, and lead investigator for the Shriners Hospitals' portion of the study. "We can now say, for a specific patient population with AIS, that we can avoid the need for surgery through bracing."

The Bracing in Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis Trial (BrAIST) compared the risk of curve progression in adolescents with AIS who wore a brace with those who did not. The study included 383 subjects at 25 sites in the U.S. and Canada, including 78 patients from seven Shriners Hospitals for Children. Dr. Dobbs oversaw this portion of the study, including compiling data and reviewing recruitments.

In the trial, treatment (bracing or observation) was randomly assigned to approximately 40 percent of the participants, with the rest given their preference. Those receiving bracing wore the device for 18 hours daily. Treatment was considered successful if the subject reached skeletal maturity with their curve remaining under 50 degrees . In the combined groups in the study, 72 percent who received bracing were successful. Those who wore their brace an average of 13 hours daily had a success rate of 90 to 93 percent.

Results of the study have the potential to impact treatment standards for children with scoliosis, as well as effect information provided at screening clinics for the detection of scoliosis.

"It will be our job as physicians to share this information and educate patients and families on the definitive, long-term positive effects of bracing for these patients," said Dr. Dobbs. "The results of this study are truly exciting – and ground-breaking. We thank Shriners Hospitals for Children, the NIH and everyone involved in supporting this work."

Dr. Dobbs is also a professor of orthopaedics at Washington University School of Medicine.

PIPE & DRUMS CORPS




Winter is here with a vengeance. The parades are over. The banquets are over. However, now is not the time to hibernate. Now is the time to practice.
