A HISTORY LESSON

What an interesting experience to talk with IS Billy Thornburg who was Potentate in 1993 and his Lady Leah. They are great examples of dedication and commitment

to Al Kaly Shrine and the International Shrine. Things have changed a lot since IS Billy entered the Shrine in 1975. Al Kaly has changed certainly in numbers of Shriners, When IS Billy was Potentate, there were thirty two hundred members and more active units. Of course the Hospital System has grown in scope or treatment and the techniques developed. IS Billy has been faithful and participates in many functions and capacities.

IS Billy was raised in Houston, Texas and joined the US Army with a buddy right after high school. After Basic,

they were sent in different directions. He was sent to Vietnam and while there got disabled by Agent Orange. He is sixty per cent disabled from it. When he was returned stateside, he ended up at Ft. Carson where he retired from the Army after six years. While he was there, he met Lady Leah and their story began. Between them they had nine children that they raised together. One son was lost while he was in the Service. Six of the children live in the state, one lives in Kansas and one in California. They have a family tradition of spending time together, just hanging out and just being together. The day of my visit, instead of packing for their annual two week trip to Mexico with family, they calmly chatted. They pack what they want to take and if they forget something, no big deal. They have other weeks dedicated to family time and enjoy their time and family.

IS Billy and Lady Leah have been married forty seven years. She continued to work and supervise the hospital lab at Ft. Carson for fifty years. IS Billy retired after thirty years of government service. Before he retired, he bought a liquor store and filling station where he saved up enough money to buy his first Model A. That started a hobby that he still enjoys. A visit to their home isn't complete without a tour of his collection of cars that he has restored. He shows them and drives them in parades with the Flivvers. One truck, complete with a painting by a sonin-law, looks brand new after several decades of driving.

IS Billy became a Mason in 1975 because Lady Leah's mother wanted to join Eastern Star. Her mom became ill and never joined Eastern Star, but they went

> on to be Worthy Patron and Worthy Matron in 1982 and 1983. IS Billy was Worshipful Master of Coal Creek Lodge and a member of Fountain Valley Lodge 191. He joined the Consistory in 1976 and Al Kaly in 1977. Bud Moore was Potentate and Bill Shawley his first line signer. As fate would have it, IS Billy was Western State Association President the same year he was Potentate. That was a challenging and busy year. He was still working at the time and all of his bosses encouraged him to do what he needed to do and not worry about his hours there. They

traveled almost non-stop for that year visiting the WSA activities and parades and attending all the units and clubs in Al Kaly.

> IS Billy's dedication to the Shrine extends to Imperial Sessions. He has attended twenty four consecutive sessions and is an Imperial Marshal Representative. You need to attend fifteen consecutive sessions to become an Imperial Marshall. They enjoy going to Imperial and always make it a vacation. This

year they will spend their usual two weeks visiting family and friends in Houston.

Interesting note, when IS Billy got his thirty-third degree from Consistory, he went In with Jack Elway, John Elway's dad in Denver.

Coincidences Shriner Child Cov Felton or Miracles?

Fawn, her husband, and young daughter lived in a small town in Missouri. They went to another small town, Monett, to deliver her son. She gave birth to Coy Daniel who was the first child with a cranial facial abnormality ever born in that hospital. No one on the staff had dealt with that condition. Her nurse happened to be the daughter of a Shriner. He was called to the hospital to see if the Shriner Hospital system could help this infant with cleft lip and missing palate. Fawn figured out how to feed Coy a syringe filled with the breast milk she pumped.

When Coy was eight weeks old, mother and son went to Chicago's Shriner Hospital for Children where the staff examined him and scheduled surgery to begin the repair of his palate when he was three months old. There was another major surgery performed at ten months which further allowed him to be fed much easier and more effectively. Fawn and Coy visited the Chicago Shriners sixteen times in the first year. One person on the team who cared for Coy helped Fawn arrange Angel Flights to get them to the hospital and arranged for them to stay at Ronald McDonald's House.

During these first few months with Coy was so small and his condition so perilous, his family evaporated. Fawn was left to care for her daughter Anna Marie, six, and Coy. He developed a cranial hemorrhage on the back of the skull which the Shriners assured her was helpful for the healing that needed to be done in that small area. The doctors in Missouri wanted to drain it which would have severely depleted his blood supply. Over the next few years, he visited the Chicago Shriners and was able to heal from the three surgeries and nine procedures that were



necessary.

His palate has been repaired and future plans for the growth of his head and dental concerns have been addressed. He actually lost one of his front teeth this week. Cov is seven now. Until

he is fully grown, he will have a nasal speech until the final surgeries have been completed.

> Fawn met and married Nick Gianes and they moved to Colorado Springs and Ft. Carson in 2010. She was working as a bank teller when a Shriner came in one day with his pin and all. She told him about Coy and that Shriner, IS Roger Mendenhall, connected her with the Al Kaly Shrine's office who helped her get Coy back to the Chicago Shriner Hospital.

The remarkable thing about Shriner hospitals is the team which coordinates care for the child. When Coy goes for an annual meeting, he is seen by the members of the team. This team has thirteen different specialists who assess Coy's progress. A

psychologist on the team did an assessment of Coy and suggested that he might have ADHD as well as mild autism. Because of her suggestions, he's getting special help to learn how to keep focused as well as having speech therapy. The team has helped her locate the services that she needs here in this area which has been very helpful.

Fawn is grateful for the wonderful opportunities that have presented themselves to her, the nurse being related to a Shriner and IS Roger, coming to her window when she was a teller. Are these coincidences or miracles? Fawn likes to believe in miracles and the Chicago Shriner Hospital has been that for Coy and her. The Shriner Hospitals for Children have been a constant in Coy's life. They will remain in his life until the final surgeries are completed in his teens. The care and love, plus all the gifts that he brings home from each visit, are something this family can depend on. Keep the tradition alive for all children. Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?
