They too, fed us, so we would not succumb to under nourishment (please note that very few of the Divan have this problem).



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Jumping behind enemy lines with a parachute was not his cup of tea. So when Al Wetmore had a choice, he opted to go into the Air Force. And it gave him an opportunity to work in communications in special activities, which the 79-year-old said, "I can't go into."

After a 23-year career in the military, he became a technical representative for RCA, specializing in communications. Later, he transferred to a cellular system in Colorado Springs as an engineer.

After Wetmore retired, his life changed forever about 15 years ago when he received a phone call from the Al Kaly Shrine office requesting his assistance.

Originally, Project Mobility co-founder Linda Terrill

and her husband had planned to send battery powered wheelchairs to third world countries. However, the founders realized they would not work overseas because of the terrain and other factors. Consequently, the Terrill's decided to call the Al Kaly Shriners to ask if they could use them. Someone in the office

suggested Wetmore, who agreed to give it a shot.

"I restored the wheelchairs and took them to the Shrine Hospital," Wetmore said.

Since then, he has renovated numerous wheelchairs and expanded his abilities into other areas, including restoration of orthopedic items. After accumulating a full load, he takes a truck to Salt Lake City. Over the years, he

has had help from the late Noble Chuck Carley and Nobles Steve Jordan and Geno Romero. The first year, one of the Nobles worked with Penske Truck Rentals to take the equipment to the Shrine Hospital.

Wetmore said it was amazing the ways he had received wheelchairs to restore for the project. For instance, an airline pilot called Wetmore from Pennsylvania, asking if he would meet him at the airport, where he had a wheelchair. "It's fun to restore them then get them donated to the hospital" for children.

Another time, Wetmore received a call from North Dakota, who sent a chair back and forth between several Shrine and Elks clubs. Eventually, the chair arrived in Colorado Springs, where Wetmore picked it up.

"It's a good sign that fraternal organizations are willing to work together for the betterment of children," Wetmore said.

Sometimes, the donations he receives are more adaptable to adults, so he restores them and puts them into storage until needed. Currently, he has available several wheelchairs, crutches, a walker and bathroom items for those who need extra help.

Wetmore also works with El Jebel, as well as Al Kaly Shrine, taking chairs and other supplies to the Shrine Hospital. One time,

Wetmore spent several days at the hospital, doing a seating internship.

Born Oct. 24, 1930, in Plymouth, Ind., he graduated from a high school in Indianapolis, Ind.

In 1947, he joined the military, where he spent 23 years. At first, he was in the Army Air Corp and later the Air Force.

When the two split, he had a chance to go to Fort Benning, Ga., where he trained with a parachute jump school. After completion, he asked the sergeant 'what's next.' He was told he would be dropped behind enemy lines, where he would tell others when and where to fire their weapons.

"I told him, 'I'm going into the Air Force,'" Wetmore (continued on page 7)

said. "I've always been in the right place at the right time."

During his service, he joined the Masons in Germany

in 1961 and later transferred to the Colorado Springs Lodge No. 76. Along the way, he also joined the Consistory in Denver then transferred to the Southern Colorado Consistory in Pueblo. In 1994, he joined the Shriners, which he has been involved with the Clowns of Al Kaly.

He has been married to Patricia for 51 years. Together, they have three children, five grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

When asked why he continues working on wheelchairs, he said, "It's something that needs to be done."

And Wetmore is modest. "It is my way to make a contribution," he said. "Every time I help a child, I help

the hospital. For every chair I restore, the hospital does not have to buy one so it's a savings to their budget."





~ A Dedicated Al Kaly Shrine Employee For 25 Years~

When she started working at the Al Kaly Shrine office in February 1984, it was on a temporary basis. But 25 years later, Roxie Graham is still going strong.



"I had been a

housewife and mom for 14 years when the recession hit in the 1980s," she said. "My husband was in construction and had had knee surgery. The kids were older and the handwriting was on the wall. It was time for me to go out and look for a job to help with the whole financial situation at home."

Originally, Graham worked for a temporary service through Louise Keach, who also ran an answering service.

"It was a cordboard answering machine. That's what I really wanted to do," Graham said. "At first, she put me to work filling in at KDZA Radio Station for an afternoon or two then I did phoning for elections. I filled in here and there."

She finally landed the graveyard shift with the answering service, which she worked for about two weeks when Keach asked her if she wanted to work temporarily at the Shrine office.

"I came to work for Bob Sutter, who was the recorder in those days," Graham said. "Newell Hall had just gotten in as Potentate and I worked through that for a full year." At that point, Sutter decided he wanted to hire her permanently.

"I told Louise I would still work this as a full-time job and just work part-time for her at the answering service, which I did for 12 years" Graham said. "I filled in after I worked (at the Shrine office) then I worked Saturdays" during the day.

Objectives:


America pageant and a former trucker / wild land firefighter / white water rafter who also hikes and has been to the base camp at Mt. Everest!



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


