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



Bill has been interested in all things electrical for his whole life and his job out of high school, marking time until he could enlist, was with the REA (Rural Electrification Administration), which brought electricity to the whole nation. When he could enlist he started in aircraft armament. He worked with bombsight maintenance and ordinance support.

In 1947 it was time to leave the Air Corps to continue his education, but he was offered the opportunity to go to Europe and help disarm the countries that had



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fought in WWII.








## FUN SUMMER EVENTS

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
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# DUES INCREASE VS. **FUNDRAISERS**

At the June 24 stated meeting I proposed a \$3 increase

to Al Kaly dues. This will be voted on at our September 9 stated meeting. We also know that our Lodge and Scottish/ York Rite dues have increased in the past few years in much larger increments. This modest increase will in no way meet all of Al Kaly's operating expenses but it will help. Temple operating expenses are supposed to be met with dues money collected.

We are able to keep our dues lower because we have been able to meet operating expenses with the fundraisers, i.e., raffle calendar, annual raffle, circus, pig roast, etc., and fortunately we have had some left over for our reserves. Fundraisers are supposed to "fund" our various activities. So, the budget is now structured to use not only dues money but fundraising money to cover operating expenses and activities. And, money from fundraisers is on the decline also – so you can see where this is heading. With this increase, Al Kaly dues for 2012 will be as follows: Dues - \$60.00, Shriners per capita - \$15.00, and hospital assessment - \$5.00 = total: \$80.00 per year. Life membership in any or all of the above will have this total reduced accordingly.

Please support this increase. It is crucial that we do what we can to keep Al Kaly operational.



# Don't Miss the Imperial Session in Denver





Make your plans now to attend the 137th Imperial Session, scheduled for July 3-7, 2011, in the mile-high city of Denver. You do not want to miss it.

Denver – an amazing city – has activities and attractions for every interest, including the Colorado State Capitol – which is exactly one mile above sea level – the U.S. Mint, the LoDo Historic District, museums and gardens. In nearby Golden, Colo., popular sites include the Red Rocks Amphitheater, the Buffalo Bill Museum and Grave, and of course, Coors Brewery Tours.

The Denver area has a very diverse dining scene, offering everything from typical American comfort food to an apparently endless array of authentic ethnic choices. For those who like to tour new places on foot, Denver has been ranked as having the fourth most walkable downtown area in the nation. If you get tired, a free shuttle bus can be found all along the 16th Street Mall. This mile-long pedestrian walk has more than 20 outdoor cafés, and is lined with 200 trees and 50,000 flowers. Interestingly, the gray and pink granite design on the pathway was designed to appear similar to that of a diamondback rattlesnake, a well-known symbol in the Denver area. Plentiful, unique shopping experiences are also readily available in the Victorian buildings of Larimer Square and on Colfax Avenue, sometimes referred to as "Denver's Avenue of Riches."

Denver is also home to the city's Performing Arts Complex, which encompasses four square blocks of the downtown area and includes a concert hall,

opera house, multi-theater building and ballroom. The city also has several museums, ranging from a renowned art museum to the Denver Museum of Nature and Science. To learn more about what Denver has to offer, visit www.denver.com.

# FUND RAISING ACTIVITIES

It is natural to associate the fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children. Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fund-raising activities, including circuses, to make certain that such activities comply wit the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe that his money will be used for the Hospitals when all or a portion thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

Your specific attention is called to the following fraternal and charitable bylaws:

335.3 USE OF NAME "SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN." The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fund-raising activity by a temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the board of Trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

503.10 The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the hospitals in connection with any commercial product or business enterprise is prohibited unless the written consent of the Board of Directors and Trustees has been first obtained.

Now, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

#### 1. Fund Raising for Fraternal Purposes:

No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated of

- a. An appendant corporations shall engage in any fundraising activity without the express written consent of the temple having jurisdiction thereof.
- b. There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.
- c. The temple potentate shall carefully examine all phases of the advertising, promotion and solicitation to determine that it complies with 335.3 and 503.10 of the fraternal and charitable bylaws.
- d. The temple potentate must approve the terms and provisions of any contract for a fund-raising activity after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, and additionally, as may be required the temple bylaws.
- e. A copy of the temple potentate's written consent shall be mailed to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council. Further, such written material pertaining to the fund-raising activity, as requested by the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council, shall be promptly mailed to him.

#### 2. Fund Raising for Charitable Purposes:

a. No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit,

organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any charitable fund-raising activity other than for Shriners Hospitals for Children. Permission therefore must be first obtained in writing from the temple potentate. The temple potentate must then obtain written permission from the Chairman of the Boards of Directors and Trustees. This request for written permission shall be sent to the Executive Vice President, Imperial Council, P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, FL 33631-3356.

However, a joint charitable fundraising activity with another 501c3 charity may be authorized provided that a minimum of 50 percent of the net proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and the chairman of the boards of directors and trustees determine, on a case by case basis, that it is in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children and they grant their written permission for the activity.

- b. 100 percent of net proceeds (as defined in the Charitable Fund Raising Approval and Reporting provisions of this General Order) from charitable fund raising must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children except for such portion thereof as may be permitted to be retained for the temple Shrine Hospital Patient Transportation Fund, pursuant to the Special Purpose Funds provisions of this General Order. Provided, however, if the Chairmen of the Boards of Directors and Trustees determine for good cause shown, that the law of the land requires that a portion of the net proceeds must b distributed locally, then they may, if they determine if to be in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children, grant their written permission for such distribution.
- c. The temple shall report the results of each charitable fund raising activity within sixty days of the activity, pursuant to the Charitable Fund Raising Approval and Reporting provision of this General Order.
- d. This section shall not apply to activities exempt under 335.4b of the bylaws of The Imperial Council.
- e. Each independent corporation or entity that receives the permission of the Chairmen of the Boards of Directors and Trustees to raise money for Shriners Hospitals for Children, and which does not have its financial statements audited pursuant to 334.5 and 337.8 of the bylaws of The Imperial Council, shall have its financial statements audited by a certified, chartered or licensed public accountant shall submit such audit report to The Imperial Council within 120 days of the activity.

#### 3. Statement of Purpose and Disclosure:

a. Every fund-raising activity must contain factual information on its solicitation material, tickets, programs and documents, including electronically transmitted material, regarding the use of the proceeds.

#### Examples:

- "Proceeds are for the benefit of (\_\_\_\_ Shriners) (\_\_\_\_ shrine club) Activities."
- "Proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children."
- b. Every fund-raising activity which is not entirely for the benefit of Shrines Hospitals for Children shall prominently state on the solicitation material, tickets and documents that "payments are not deductible as a charitable contribution."
- c. There must be compliance with the Revenue Act of 1987 provision of any existing general order by U.S. temples.

#### 4. Compliance with Applicable Laws:

It is the responsibility of the temple potentate, after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, to determine that there is compliance with all applicable laws in its jurisdiction for the temple's fund-raising activities.

#### 5. Financial Records:

a. The temple shall maintain detailed financial records pertaining to all fund-raising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, organizations of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations. Details of all revenues and


- expenditures shall be maintained in such financial records.
- b. The temple must retain such detailed financial records for a period of seven years.
- c. There must be compliance with Financial Reporting on Charitable Funds and Activities provision of any existing general order.

#### 6. Notification of Nobility:

A copy of the Fund-Raising Activities provision of this General Order shall be printed in the temple publication at least once every calendar year. If there is no temple publication, then a copy shall be mailed to each Noble in the temple not later than the last day in March of each calendar year.

#### 7. Discipline:

Any officer, Noble or temple which violates a provision of Fund-Raising Activities is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of The Imperial Council.



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


What an opportunity it is to promote Membership for the Shrine, when we go to these outlying communities and remind those Blue Lodge members of who we are and what we do for the children in the country.

# **Burn Awareness:**Safety Begins at Home

Shriners Hospitals for Children® Emphasizes Prevention during Burn Awareness Week

Our homes are our personal "safe havens," where we can relax, be ourselves, and enjoy time with our families.

However, without some attention and awareness, our homes can also be dangerous places, especially for children.

#### **Consider these Facts:**

- Every day, across the U.S., hundreds of children are taken to emergency rooms for treatment of scald burns caused by contact with hot liquids, steam or foods.
- Approximately 65 percent of children under age 4 hospitalized for burn injuries were scalded by hot liquids.
- Approximately 16,000 children under age 5 are treated in U.S. hospitals for scald burns annually.
- Ninety-five percent of scalds occur in residences.
- Fire causes the death of more than 600 children ages 14 and under each year, and injures about 3,000 more.
- Nearly 50 percent of children injured in fires or fire-related incidents are under age 5.
- More than 60 percent of residential fires that cause the death of a child occur in homes without smoke detectors.

#### **Providing Information to Raise Awareness**

Shriners Hospitals for Children offers a variety of complimentary burn prevention materials, including a coloring book, posters, fact sheets and brochures. Clearly, burn awareness and prevention is critically important to the safety and well-being of everyone, especially children.

Shriners Hospitals for Children®, which operates hospitals dedicated to the treatment of pediatric burns, is committed to decreasing the number of preventable pediatric burn injuries by raising awareness and providing educational materials, especially to parents and families. The health care system uses Burn Awareness Week (the first full week of February every year) to kick off its year-long awareness campaign.

The 2011 campaign, Burn Awareness: Safety Begins at Home, emphasizes the importance of observing basic precautions to keep everyone–especially children–safe at home.

## Preventing Scald Burns and Having Proper Safety Equipment

Scald burns are typically related to ordinary activities, including bathing, cooking and eating. Many could be easily prevented by following some simple precautions, particularly involving close supervision of young children and setting water temperatures appropriately. Young children have thinner skin that burns more quickly than adults'. People of all ages can be burned in 30 seconds by a flowing liquid that is 130° F; at 140° F, it takes only five seconds; at 160° F, it only takes one second. For children under 5, these temperatures can cause a burn in half the time.

Keeping children safe from burn injuries at home requires constant vigilance, including making sure to have proper warning equipment, such as smoke detectors, and keeping them in good working order. It is also critically important to have an escape plan in the event a fire does occur.




## BOWLING LEAGUE

# New Terms Enhance Membership Efforts

Back in 1872, when the Shriners fraternity was established, it made perfect sense to emphasize the middle-Eastern motif of the organization by naming it the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine.

While the fraternity is still based on fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth, neither that tongue-twisting formal name – nor even the more commonly-used name of Shriners of North America – fit the organization today.

Today, there are active members of the fraternity located around the world, and an increasing effort to reach and recruit new members on an international scale. It is important they be acknowledged in the name of the organization.

Consequently, at the 2010 Imperial Session in Toronto a resolution was passed to officially replace the corporate name, The Imperial Council of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine for North America. The resolution also stated that Shriners International should replace the name or any abbreviated versions of it (such as Shriners of North America). Nobles are encouraged to use Shriners International when referring to the fraternity, both in speech and in any temple publications they produce.

Also, just as a reminder, at the 2002 Imperial Session, a proposal to replace the word 'temple' with the word 'Shriners,' when the term is used as a proper name for a group of nobles was

passed. For example, Mecca Temple is now Mecca Shriners. The word temple can still be used to designate general groups of Shriners, or



the building where Shriners often gather. For example, there are now 193 temples located in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, the Republic of Panama and The Philippines, with another temple in Germany currently under dispensation. There are also affiliated clubs located around the world.

Whether we are attracting interest and members globally or locally, we want to be sure we make it as easy as possible for potential Shriners to understand who we are and what we do. Therefore, it was also decided that when speaking to or providing materials for non-Shriners, it is fine to refer to a temple with a secondary references of 'chapter', which is also a clear indication that we are a fraternity.

All of these changes are part of an overarching effort to increase membership by using terms people everywhere can understand, accept and respond to in a positive way. Additional efforts include the website be**ashrinernow**.com, which is specifically for potential new members.

The future of the fraternity depends on increasing membership. While these efforts are important, it is equally critical for every Shriner to be willing to share his interest in and commitment to the fraternity with those around him.
