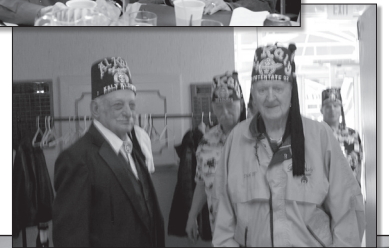

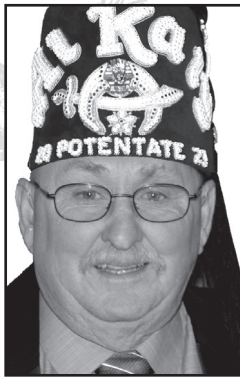

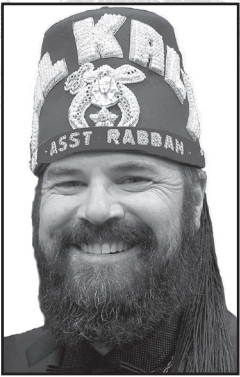

SERVANT LEADERSHIP

Well, we have certainly been busy lately with everything that has been going on! Lots of Official Visits, our Spring Ceremonial, Stated Meeting, and Potentate's Ball, as well as many other events at the Club level. With Parade season coming, the fun is sure to continue. It makes me incredibly happy to see Al Kaly active and keeping busy, while keeping our focus on supporting our Shrine children, who look to us for desperately needed blessings in their lives.

Many of you work extremely hard to make our fundraisers, meetings, and activities a success. I can promise you that your efforts do not go unnoticed! From the time I became an Entered Apprentice and started moving up through the Degrees of Masonry, I quickly noticed that many of the active brethren in my Lodge that were always volunteering to help wherever they could, were the men who were also Shriners. These Nobles set a fitting example for me as a young Mason of Servant Leadership.

One of the main ingredients to making a volunteer organization function properly, is that the day to day running and decision making must come from the membership. Whatever capacity you serve in, you are a volunteer, serving at your own free will. As opposed to what many of us have experienced in military service where you are often "voluntold" what you will be doing! So, what is essential to our success is that we continue to have "a membership who wants to be pullers at the oars, rather than just riders in the boat."

What is a Servant Leader? At Assistant Rabban School this past March, I was taught that,

"A servant leader focuses primarily on the growth and well-being of people and the communities to which they belong. While Traditional Leadership involves the accumulation and exercise of power by one at the 'top of the pyramid,' servant leadership is different. The servant leader shares power, puts the needs of others first, and helps people develop and perform as highly as possible. So, forget the Title, be a Servant."

This tells me that to be a leader, it does not begin with what position I hold in our beloved fraternity, but directly speaks to my willingness

to put the needs of my fellow Nobles before my own.

This leads to some questions for all of us to consider. Do I show up to Al Kaly events looking for a way to pitch in and help? Do I sit down and wait to be served, or do I find the Noble who is coordinating the event and ask how I can help? Do I support the decisions of our Leadership, or do I complain and make no effort to help things improve? Do I keep to myself, or do I sit down next to my brothers and talk to them to get to know them better and see how they are doing? I am reminded of a line in our Shriners Creed, "As Shriners we look beyond ourselves to serve the needs of others."

I am always happy to see the close bonds that many of us have with each other. It is one of the best-selling points that we have as Nobles for our Fraternity to young Master Masons who may be looking to join us. Servant Leadership is but one of the ingredients needed for our success, but it is possibly the most essential. I will offer just one more thought for your consideration. This Noble believes that the Grand Architect of the Universe is his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. During His Earthly ministry, Jesus spent much of his time sitting with people, engaging with them in meaningful discourse, serving and blessing them. Imagine, our Lord, the greatest among us, placing Himself as a servant to all. You could say that he was the original Shiner, setting the standard for all of us Shriners who have taken the Oath and placed that Red Fez on our heads to follow.

I am grateful for the example that many of you set for me to follow. Much of what I know about Leadership, I have learned from my brother Nobles. If we can continue to improve our efforts as servant leaders, I am confident that Al Kaly will also be a success. God bless you all and I look forward to seeing all of you at our coming events!

FEATURED SHRINER DENNIS FEISTER

Dennis Joseph Feister was born on March 28, 1953 in Walsenburg, CO, to Dennis and Elizabeth Feister. He has one younger sister. His father was a ranch owner and cattleman 21 miles west of Aguilar, CO, in the foothills of the West Spanish Peak. Growing up, Dennis was in 4-H, showing fat beef at the local county fair each year along with leather crafting. He continues his hobby of leather crafting to this day.

Dennis graduated from Aguilar High School and continued on to Trinidad State Junior College where he received an Associates of Applied Science Degree in auto mechanics in 1973. His first job away from the ranch was at a local sawmill stacking lumber to help pay for his college tuition. After that, he worked hauling and stacking hay for a trucking company out of Trinidad while also working at the ranch with his folks.

In 1977, he moved to Wyoming where, for two years, he worked in a NAPA Warehouse Distributing Company which was the largest parts house in the US at the time. In 1980, he moved back to the ranch to help his Dad who was in failing health and to take over the responsibilities of the ranch and the cattle.

After a short time of being back, he joined the Spanish Peaks Volunteer Fire Department as a Firefighter. He became the chief for several years. In time, he also joined the Stonewall Fire Protection District and became a Wildland Firefighter. To this day, he remains in both departments with over 40 years of dedication.

In the Spring of 1981, Dennis met his wife to be, Dottie, at a rodeo dance in Trinidad. A few weeks later, he showed up at her doorstep in Pueblo for a date! He took his cattle dog, Dimples, on all their dates and Dottie fell in love with her! Dottie moved to the ranch at the end of 1982 and helped Dennis with the ranch and care of the animals. She loved the country life and he realized he had found the mate who would work alongside him on the ranch as a lifelong partner. They were married in December of 1982. Together, they added more land through the years. Dennis and Dottie were blessed with a son on December 1, 1990, Robert Joseph (RJ) Feister. RJ has followed in Dad and Mom's footsteps and became a Wildland firefighter. He blessed them with three grandchildren, including a set of twins, a boy and girl. The grandchildren are



the love of Dennis' life. Dennis and Dottie still live in the original 1864 log ranch house which has been extended and modernized. He still runs the ranch, but much slower these days.

"To Be One Ask 1" happened at the Fib Ark Parade in 1996. His father-in-law, Bob Walls, was an Al Kaly Shriner in the Foot Patrol Unit. Dennis told Bob that he would like to parade with him. Bob asked him if he was serious

and then told him he had to go to first grade first by becoming a Mason. Dennis was initiated into the Masons on November 12, 1996, and raised November 4, 1997. He went through the chairs in Trinidad Lodge #28 and became Worshipful Master. In 1998, Dennis went through the last Scottish Rite Reunion in Pueblo at the Consistory. Bob Walls became his first line signer into the Shrine in June of 1999. He joined the Al Kaly Foot Patrol Unit and marched next to Bob. When the Foot Patrol disbanded, he became "Rocky the Rodeo Clown" with the Kaly Klowns Unit from Pueblo. He has been Wagon Master for the Nomads and is Vice President of the Kaly Klowns. He was instrumental in bringing a Shrine Club to Trinidad where he served as President, Vice President, and now Secretary. He is still "walking so kids can run".

Dennis believes Masonic teachings help to instill the strength of the Lord. You can talk to the Lord from a mountaintop, from under a tree or from inside a church. He's everywhere you are.

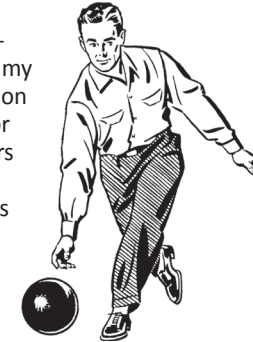

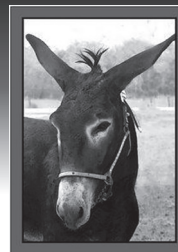
