

&L K&LÝ BOWL-A-THON '25



The leadership of Shriners International is mindful that June 6 is also honored as D-Day, the day in 1944 when Allied forces landed on the beach in Normandy to begin the invasion of northern France. While Shriners International certainly honors the valor and courage of everyone who served on D-Day, many historic events happen on a single day; and June 6 also holds a separate, special meaning for our fraternity.

A Time to Honor and Celebrate Our Rich Heritage

On June 6, Shriners International asks all nobles to publicly display their pride in their fraternity by wearing a fez (when appropriate), hat, shirt, lapel pin, or other item with the Shriners International logo.

THE IMPORTANCE OF LAWN MOWER SAFETY

Shriners Hospitals Wants Kids to Stay Safe

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is committed to helping keep kids safe, and injury-free. Although they may seem like a common household tool, lawn mowers are one of the most dangerous items in our homes. Thousands of people are hurt while using lawnmowers each year - these injuries can include deep cuts; loss of fingers, toes, and even limbs; burns and broken bones. However, many lawn mower-related injuries can be prevented by following some safety guidelines.

Lawnmowei

Keep Children Safe

- Children under 6 years of age should be kept indoors during mowing.
- > Make sure children are a safe distance away from the area you plan to mow because rocks and debris often can shoot out while the lawn mower is running.
- Keep a close eye on children when a lawn mower is in use. Make sure they do not run into the mower's path.
- > Never allow children to play with the mower, even when it turned off. A lawn mower is not a toy.
- Children should be at least 12 years old before operating a walk-behind lawn mower and at least 16 years old to oper a riding mower.
- > Never allow children or any other passengers on a riding la mower because of the potential for falling under the mow and sustaining serious injuries.

Weather and Terrain

- > Do not cut grass when it's wet because it can cause your fe to lose traction and slide.
- > Do not use a mower on hills or slopes, to avoid having it ti over and cause injury.

Prior to Mowing

- ► Read your mower's instruction manual and familiarize yourself with the product prior to use.
- > Use a mower with a control that stops it from moving form if the handle is released.
