Dan suggested that he begin to think about holding them. They kept meeting and concentrating on holding the sticks and after many meetings his client started to hold them and then began to control them and now he is playing with a band; a great story about self-motivation. You see, Dan does not have hands either, because of severe burns he sustained as a child.

We also heard from Lacy Davis, also one of our Shrine Children. What an outstanding 4th grade teacher she will be! Knowing what our hospital care system can do for the young people that we send them should make each Shriner proud. We then heard from Gary Sears about the membership plan for the coming year. If you know a Shriner that is not going to meetings or does not belong to a unit, bring him and his wife to a dinner meeting

at one of the clubs.

During our first Divan meeting we learned that the bus trip to Shriners Hospital Salt Lake City will cost over \$200 per person, plus hotel room and meals. This information was very disappointing. The cost is directly related to the cost of fuel for the bus. We will continue to look for a way to visit a hospital.

The East/West game and the activities around the game gave us a big boost for what Shriners do. While there we also visited the Houston Space Center. As you can see by the picture on the front of the Dust we enjoyed the visit. It is hard to believe that we have made 7 trips to the moon and that it started over 50 years ago.

For every first line signer that produces a new Al Kaly Shriner, an entry will be placed in the membership jar. At the last Stated Meeting in December 2008 there will be a drawing from the jar to select the winner of a free trip. From all the Honored Ladies, Happy St. Patrick's Day on March 17th and Happy Easter on Sunday March 23rd. See you soon!



Colorado Springs Area By Ann Sater, President

It was supposed to be an easy mission; fly over Paris, drop the bombs, then get out and return to their base in England but it turned into a nightmare. Bill Sheaves, a non-com flight engineer, was on his 14" mission with the Army Air Corps when his plane was shot down over Paris on Sept. 9, 1943. "We were at altitude," he said. "We had taken a hit from 88 mm anti-aircraft fire, which took out all our oxygen. We had no choice but to get down to a low level fast! You can't fly at 30,000 feet with no oxygen." However, as the B-17 attempted to make its way back to England, they encountered five German fighter planes that came up from behind. "After four of their planes were hit by our tail-guns, the fifth one abruptly left the area," Sheaves said.

Eventually, though, unable to continue on, his plane crash-landed in an open field near Beaumontle-Roger, France. They were quickly surrounded by some 500 Germans who wisely kept their distance because of the 50-caliber machine guns on the plane. The Germans all stayed about 100 yards away from the plane until the Luftwaffe arrived in force to take the crew as prisoners of war. Unfortunately, the tail gunner was killed during the bombing raid and the ball turret gunner died in the crash-landing. As Sheaves stepped off the airplane, he saw that one of the crewmen was injured. Bill started to reach for the first aid kit that he had strapped to his should but one of the Germans shot him in the right leg, knocking him to the ground. "I stood up and reached for the kit again and he shot

me again," Sheaves said. "I finally realized that he thought I was reaching for a hand grenade so I stayed on the ground. By that time, I had to use the kit for myself, too."

The eight remaining members of the B-17 crew were taken to the field headquarters, treated for their wounds and given a meal. "We had German bread, cheese, bratwurst and hot tea, but no coffee," Sheaves said. "That was the last good meal I had in Germany." The next morning, the crew found themselves on a train, en route to Dulag Luft, near Frankfurt, Germany, where the four sergeants were separated from the officers. His new home was a solitary cell, about 4 X 8 X 6 feet high, where he was interrogated about his involvement with B-29s at Boeing Aircraft in Renton, Wash. After it was determined he did not know anything about the planes, he was sent to Stalag 7A. "No pillow, no eating utensils, no mess kit, NOTHING," Bill said.

This was the beginning of two long years where he was starved, froze in the winter, burned in the summer and was lonesome for his family, his country and his freedom. The end of September he and about 750 other POWs were again loaded on "40 and 8" rail cars on a cramped, crowded train, on their way to another prison camp,

Stalag 17B at Krems, Austria. After three or four days the train stopped on a siding to let a munitions and troop train pass on its way to the Russian front. Sheaves and two other POWs were sent to dump the sanitation facility (a honey bucket, of sorts) in the nearby woods. Unguarded, they escaped into the forest, only to be discovered three days later by two Austrians who took them to the Gestapo. They were severely punished before being sent on to Stalag 17B.

After the Allied Forces landed in Normandy they advanced eastward toward Berlin, liberating the countries along the way. The first part of April 1945, the Russians took Vienna, which was 40 kilometers east of the prisoner of war camp. "We saw lots of fighting

going on east of us," Sheaves said. "At that particular time, the Allies had issued an unconditional surrender demand no discussion whatsoever. However, the German high command decided that they would move all the Americans, Canadians, Australians and British POWs back to Stalag 7A. The Germans planned to hold them as hostages in order to negotiate a truce with the Allied Forces other than unconditional surrender. As the prisoners marched toward Stagel 7A at Moosberg, near Munich, they learned that Patton's 3" Army had liberated all the prisoners at Stalag 7A. Their guards turned the prisoners south to Braunau, which was Hitler's birthplace, on the Austria and Germany border.

"We were in a forest area," Sheaves said. "On April 26, there were about 40,000 prisoners in that area. We were the only Americans there. We were on the east side of the Inn River and the Allies were

across the river." The prisoners were only guarded by old men in the wooded area that had no barbed wire fence. "They tried to move us out of the camp again, but we decided we weren't going." Sheaves said. After convincing the guards, who were greatly outnumbered, that they would be killed by the prisoners if any further attempt was made to move them, the POWs left the area on their own. They were then able to contact the Americans, who evacuated them to Camp Lucky Strike at Le Havre, France. Finally the long ordeal was over. Sheaves was returned to the U.S. in June 1945 and was discharged in October of that year.

After returning home, he worked part-time in the coal mines of West Virginia for about 4 years while attending College. Bill's primary interest was to get a degree in electronics; however, those courses not being available there, he re-entered the military, this time joining the Army, to study under Wernher Von Braun, the renowned German scientist. After completing the extensive course at White Sands, New Mexico, he served as an instructor at Ft. Bliss for a little over a year. Because of his highly specialized training, he received a direct commission and in the following years he served

in various fields related to Air Defense, Radar & Electronic Warfare at several bases throughout the world. Some of his many assignments included two tours with ARADCOM in Colorado Springs, Japan, Ft. Monmouth, NJ, then as an exchange officer in the British Army, Commanding Officer of the 63rd Signal Battalion in Viet Nam and The Defense Communications Engineering Center Washington, D.C. Sheaves retired in 1975 as a Lieutenant Colonel and returned to

Colorado Springs where he formerly had a home. He worked for GTE for several years before retiring a second time.

Sheaves joined El Paso Lodge #13 in 2002 and later became a Shriner, where he is a member of the Drum Corps. Born in Lawton, West Virginia, Sheaves is married to the former Ruth Wilber. He had two sons, from his first marriage, four grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. Ruth has a daughter, one granddaughter and two great-granddaughters.

Those who have occasion to visit the Air Force Museum at Peterson Air Force Base will be most interested in seeing the 1:10 scale radio-controlled model of a B-17 hanging in the main entrance. This model, whose wingspan measures about 11 feet, was hand-built by Bill over a 7-1/2 year period. It is an exact replica of the "Tar Fly," his downed aircraft. After flying it one time (just to make sure it would) he donated it to the Air Force museum.

Thanks, Bill, for your courageous service to our country!

Editor's Note







For The Shriners Hospitals for Children

February 12th was a spectacular day from Texas to Colorado, as IHOP (International House of Pancakes) hosted a fundraiser for the Shriners Hospitals for Children. Three IHOPs in Colorado Springs and two in Pueblo opened their doors from 7 am until 10 pm for free pancakes to everybody. All they asked was a donation to the Shrine Kids.

IHOP supplied the pancakes; waitresses and the Al Kaly Shrine supplied the manpower with clowns, Nobles and their Ladies. Patrons, staff and Nobles all enjoyed the day.

Donations were plentiful at each IHOP. Even many of the waitresses donated their tips.



By the end of the day, groups of exhausted Nobles & IHOP staff were ready to tally up the results.

The total amount of donations was \$8,164.00. Not all of it came from IHOP, though. A little restaurant in Falcon also wanted to participate. Jill's Country Café was my initial planning of the IHOP adventure. I frequent the "Liars" table most every weekday morning and was working on the layout for February 12th. Jill helped me with some photography and asked what it was for. When I explained the Free Pancake day by IHOP, she asked if she could help raise funds for the Shriners Hospitals as well. I could not turn down such a generous offer so Jill opened her doors from 7 am until 1 pm and raised \$708.00, which became part of the total figure.

AL KALY READY WHEN DUTY CALLS

Reporter's Note: As Shriners, we all know that our primary mission is to help children. We know that we stand ready to admit qualifying children into the Shriners Hospital system to receive care as long as their needs exist, within certain age parameters. Beyond that, the children we help, and the specifics of their individual cases, typically don't hit so close to home or with such devastation to an entire family. The following story, however, illustrates the importance of our mission, especially in emergency situations, and how the Shriners (and Al Kaly) are always ready to get involved.

It was a cold Tuesday morning, January 29th, in Colorado Springs. Broadcasts of shocking news had broken that around 10:00 pm the previous evening, a 25-year old, widowed, despondent, stayat-home mother of five had allegedly set all of her children afire.

The children, ages 9, 8, 5, 3 and 1, suffered varying degrees of burns, with the youngest being pronounced dead at the scene. The remaining four, all in critical condition, were transported to The Children's Hospital in Aurora. The most serious had burns over 85% of his body; another suffered cuts or stab wounds.

A representative of The Children's Hospital, recognizing the need for the exceptional burn treatment capabilities of the Shriners Hospital Burn Center in Galveston, Texas called, inquiring as to whether Shriners Hospital would accept these children. Shriners Hospital assured them that they would, provided that Flight for Life transportation could be provided. Shriners Hospital then called Ill. Sir Bart Guthrie, Recorder of Al Kaly Shriners, to see if we were adequately funded to cover the transportation costs, initially estimated at \$35,000, in the event that the family did not have insurance to cover it. If Al Kaly could not, a last resort possibility existed that Galveston could, perhaps, access an emergency contingency fund.

Ill. Sir Bart conferred with Potentate Bill Stoner and decided that, most importantly, the kids needed to get to Galveston as quickly as possible, and, yes, we would fund it, though it would be a tremendous drain on our transportation fund.

Later that night another call was received from Galveston. It had been determined that only the 3 and 9 year olds would be coming to the Burn Center. The Children's Hospital had decided that the lesser-burned child and the one with cut/stab wounds could be adequately cared for in Aurora. Also, most fortuitously, in light of the fact that the mother had been charged with murder, the children had become legal wards of the state. Consequently, Medicaid support through the Department of Health Services (DHS) became available to cover the air evacuation costs.

So it was, then, that the two children arrived in Galveston, in little more than twenty-four hours after they had been burned. Such a short period of time for all the conversations, decisions and activity to take place was certainly due to the paramount interest, concern and effort of all those involved, including our Al Kaly leaders, as well as personnel of the Children's Hospital of Denver, the Shriners Hospital, El Paso County's DHS office, and Flight for Life.

With the best of care for the children notwithstanding, theirs will be a long, grueling and painful journey back to some semblance of normalcy and good health, but we know that, for the two in Galveston, they could be in no better place than a Shriners Hospital for the treatment, rehabilitation and love they will need. It is a rule of thumb in the Burn Center system that each one-degree

of body burn requires approximately one day's hospital treatment, recovery and rehab. Therefore, it can be reasonably expected that the child with 85% burn coverage will need about three months of care!

Severely burned patients often face many reconstructive surgeries and skin grafts over a long period of time. And the physical trauma is only half of the story. The emotional aspects can be equally debilitating when a child looks in the mirror and sees a scarred and disfigured person looking back at him that he does not recognize.

Because of the long-term hospitalization necessary for this courageous 4th grader, certified teachers at the Shriners Hospital will work with the local school district to help keep up with his education as best they can while he is away.

Throughout this whirlwind of events, our Public Relations representative, Dr. Ralph Hathaway, has been point man for disseminating information to our local and Denver media, resulting in some positive coverage by Channel 5/30, Channel 13, Denver's Channel 9, and a nice front-page article with good exposure for the Shrine by reporter Brian Newsome of the Gazette. At this writing, the 5 and 8-year old children in Aurora have both been upgraded from their initial critical condition status.

Unfortunately, until DHS gives Shriners Hospital authorization to release medical information about the two children in the Galveston hospital, HIPAA privacy laws prevent them from giving any information as to their conditions. We can all only hope and pray for their well-being and steadily improving conditions as they fight their long and painful battle.

Nobles, if you have ever wondered about the value of your involvement in this great organization called Shriners you need wonder no more. These kids will know and appreciate the Shriners for the rest of their lives.

SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN

This article is directed at the new Nobles, but it's for all Nobles.

As I visit the various Hospitals, I find the Staff and their active volunteers are quick to show you their facilities and tell you why they are unique to our system.

The Honolulu Unit took their first patient in 1923, when they were using the rear wing of the Kauikeolani Children's Hospital to treat Shriner children. They were later bequeathed property with the buildings that were converted to the present Hospital (1930). The latest activity is the modification of the Hospital started this past year. This Unit is the only hospital in our system supported by a single Temple. That is Aloha Temple and they are doing a fantastic job as they support the children across the Pacific Rim.

A huge accomplishment they are very proud of is the application of the Ilizarov Leg Lengthening Technique to a young lady in their care. They were able to extend her leg seventeen inches. The process took three visits with the leg being lengthened ten inches, and on the second visit an additional five inches and on the last visit the final two inches. The Honolulu Unit was the first of our Hospitals to successfully perform this technique, and have done many more over the years.

This is representative of what goes on every day in our Hospitals. In summary, Nobles, take the opportunity to visit and make yourself proud of what you are doing for these children.



The band had a very busy but enjoyable year. The following is a "Rewind" of activities in 2007:


- ▲ Participated in twelve parades and one county fair.


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KALYKLOWNS


