His interest in riding began when he was a boy. "Since I've been a rancher and farmer, I was an experienced rider," said Past Potentate Dan Neu.

After befriending several members of the Mule Train, he found the unit to be very active in the Shrine, so he joined it. Neu then purchased a mule from a trainer in Nebraska, but when that didn't work out, he purchased a black mule called "Jackie O." "She was a well trained mule," Neu said. "She was beautiful and could do anything." He had the privilege of leading the Rose Bowl Parade and a Fiesta Bowl Parade with her, he said. Since then, he also purchased several mules to ride in the Shrine parades.

Born March 2, 1923, in Bayard, Neb., as one of 13 children, Neu moved to South Dakota, where he grew up on a farm and ranch. He said he is proud of his German heritage. "My great-great grandparents left Germany and went with Catherine the Great to Russia, then my parents were born in Russia," Neu noted. "They were going to draft my dad into the Russian Army during the Japanese conflict in the early

1900's. He left Russia and came to the United States. He said he was a German and wasn't going to serve in the Russian Army."

In the 1940's when Neu's three older brothers were drafted, Neu quit high school to help his father on the farm until he was drafted into the Army in 1944. While going through basic training in Texas, he married Pauline, then transferred to various Forts, before leaving Pier 16 on the Queen Mary to sail to Liverpoor, England. He made his way to Hampton and crossed the English Channel on a

LST to LeHarve, France, then rode a 40 and 8 train to the south of Paris, where he joined the 36th Infantry Division.

In the battlefield, "I started out with an M-1 rifle," Neu said. "A guy I went overseas with (who was from



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Pennsylvania) took a hit from a big artillery shell. He died on the way to the hospital. I inherited the Browning automatic and I carried it across France, Germany, Austria and up Brenner Pass to Italy" until the war ended.




The 36th Infantry was sent home, but because he didn't have enough points to go home, Neu was stationed with the 3rd Infantry Division. When that division was sent home, he was stationed with the 2nd Regiment of military government in Frankfurt, Germany, as a file clerk. Here, he read that those without enough points could go home for Christmas if they reenlisted in the regular Army for one year. "I never missed a Christmas away from home," Neu said.

From there, he jumped on a ship, which took 14 days to arrive

back in the United States. After 60 days, he began making his way back to his camp, thinking he would not be sent back to Europe for nine months, but he was wrong. By then, he had

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been promoted to the rank of sergeant and was deployed to Germany, where he refueled ships for the remainder of his time in the military.

After his discharge, Neu worked in construction in Nebraska before leasing a large ranch, where he stayed until the ranch sold. Then the family bought a ranch of their own before leasing 13,000 acres of farm and ranch land from CF&I Steel Mill. When costs of ranching became prohibitive, Neu purchased a trash business in 1976, starting with 2,300 customers, by the time he sold the

business to his children he had 8,000 customers. The couple moved to Vineland, where they have remained since.

In the early 1950s, he joined the Camp Clark Masonic Lodge No. 285 in Bridgeport, Neb., where he went through the chairs, serving as master in 1967. He also joined the DeMolays and served as an associate guardian of Job's Daughters along with his Lady Pauline, who was the guardian.

In 1968, he moved to Colorado then joined Scottish Rite, York Rite and Al Kaly Shriners all in the same year, 1969. In 1984, he joined the Mule Train. Along the way, he

In the meantime, Neu went through the chairs and became the Potentate in 1986.

After serving as Potentate, he immediately was appointed to the Shriners Hospital Board in Salt Lake City, Utah, which he served for nine years. He was on the board when a new hospital was built. Never content to be idle, he

also joined the Flivvers and was one

of the Charter Members of the Pueblo Shrine Club. Along the way, Neu also won several awards, including an award from Silver State Masonic Lodge No. 95 and the Colorado Mule Riders as a Life Member.

"That was a total surprise to me," Neu said. He and Pauline recently celebrated their 65th Anniversary. They have two sons and a daughter, six grandchildren, four granddaughters, two grandsons and four step-great-grandchildren.

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A DEFINITION OF GREATNESS

Why did you join the Masons? What is the definition of greatness? We know that many famous men were Masons, such as

George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Meriwether Lewis and William Clark. The list goes on and on. More than likely they fit the definition of greatness.

Let me digress and tell the story of Brother Christopher Hodapp, author of *Freemasons for Dummies*. His father-in-law, Bob Funcannon, lived for many years in Indianapolis but retired to Dallas, Texas. When Bob died (in Dallas), his daughter and son-in-law went there to arrange Bob's funeral. The following is an excerpt from the book:

"So when he died, we... decided to have his funeral in Texas where he had spent the last 15 years of his life. We saw to it that the biggest funeral chapel was reserved [to accommodate his many friends]. At the last minute, my wife remembered that her dad had been a Mason, and we knew Masons performed a funeral service for departed Brothers. So late on Sunday evening before the Monday funeral, we started madly calling every Masonic lodge in Dallas and Fort Worth. At last we found a janitor working late, and he said he would try to contact some of the Brothers. We didn't hold out much hope. The next day, we discovered to our great dismay that virtually no one had come, and that we should have brought him home to Indiana after all. That cavernous chapel was populated by the four of us in his family, a neighbor, and the three people he lived with. And ten Masons.

"Ten men who never knew him, called by a stranger on a Sunday night, dropped what they were doing that morning and came to say goodbye to a Brother they had never met and extend a helping hand to his family. I'm certain that all ten of them had obligations of work and family. But not one was too tired or too busy to be there for a Brother. They performed a memorial service far more moving, comforting, and final than the rented minister who mispronounced Bob's last name every time he said it. And when it was all over, they stayed behind and made it clear that they would help us in any way they possibly could.

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
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MEMBERSHIP!

The Revenue Cycle Committee is on a path to begin our first "Billings" in 5 months ... July 1st, 2010 for our Phase 1 group. Phase 1 Hospitals...Cincinnati, Philadelphia, Lexington, and Portland. Phase 2 Hospitals... Spokane, Erie, Tampa, and Salt Lake City... beginning on Oct 1st, 2010. Phase 3 Hospitals...Springfield, Boston, Chicago, and St Louis... beginning on Jan 1st, 2011. And the remaining eight U.S. Hospitals will be in Phases 4 & 5, starting during 2011.

With this Plan of Implementation.. the projected Return on Investment (ROI) as calculated by our Consulting Group...

"Price Waterhouse Cooper" will be: "Net Revenue" for Year 1...\$12.5 million, Year 2...\$108.8 million, and rising in Year 3...to \$172.6 million. Years 4 & 5...estimated to exceed \$175 million per year. After seeing this ROI analysis our new Executive Vice-president at HQ... Keith Gardner, stated... "I'm very Optimistic for the future of



Shriners Hospitals for Children."

By providing this "New Revenue from Insurers" and "by Reducing the Demand on our Endowment Fund"... It should allow us "new opportunities"... for helping children.

Excerpts From Shriners Hospitals for Children Chairman's 4th Message -Imperial Sir Douglas E. Maxwell, President and CEO

The crisis in Haiti continues to be on everyone's mind. Because of our passion for helping children, especially those who might not otherwise be able to afford that help, we are drawn to trying to decide the role that Shriners Hospitals for Children might play in helping the children of Haiti that have suffered significant orthopedic, burn or spinal cord injuries.

Many of our hospitals have been contacted individually by various groups about our willingness to accept patients for treatment. The official position of Shriners Hospitals for Children is that we will be prepared to accept children with appropriate injuries for care in any of our hospitals.

Obviously, there are some rather key assumptions in that statement. As we have always done, we will be reliant on others being responsible for the transportation to and from our hospitals and any necessary accommodations for an accompanying person while the child is in our care. We must know that there is a clearly established plan for the child to return to Haiti or to the custody of an approved person or organization once treatment has been completed. In order to have a consistent, coordinated approach in responding to these requests, it has been recommended that all requests for care in any of our hospitals be channeled through the office of the Vice President - Medical Affairs. Dr. Armstrong and his staff will review the requests and ensure that they are appropriate for treatment in one of our hospitals.

Depending on the circumstances and the availability of transportation, the most appropriate hospital will be

identified and Dr. Armstrong and Joe Melchiorre, VP of Hospital Operations will make contact with the hospital to coordinate the logistics associated with the acceptance of the patient. In order to support this effort, the hospitals will be provided with Dr. Armstrong's office, cell and home phone numbers to facilitate contact at any time.

The reports coming out of Haiti indicate that there are a large number of children who have suffered debilitating injuries, particularly those affecting arms and legs. In many instances, either because of the severity of the injury or the delay in receiving needed treatment, a large number of children have required amputations. Obviously, we have tremendous experience in dealing with such children. Perhaps this is where we might have our greatest impact.

Because of the large volume of children who will require prosthetics, particularly for leg amputations, it may make more sense to assess the capabilities in Haiti to produce these prostheses, and support those efforts with our skilled knowledge and experience. To that end, the Chairman has asked that I travel to Haiti with one of our prosthetists... at an appropriate time... to assess how SHC might best help solve this major problem on a more local basis in Haiti, as Dr. Robert Sheridan of Boston, suggested a few weeks ago.

In summary, Shriners Hospitals for Children... WILL be involved in helping the children of Haiti in a way that best utilizes our tremendous knowledge and expertise. **Editor's Note:** This material was included in a letter sent by Peter F. 
(b) Annual Meeting. The annual meeting shall be held during the month of January at the location of the temple.




Shriners Ambassador Megan Johnson Named 2010 Washington State Youth Volunteer

Our Al Kaly Friend and Shriners International Hospital Ambassador Megan Johnson, has been named one of Washington State's top two youth volunteers for 2010 by The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards program. This is a nationwide program honoring young people for outstanding acts of volunteerism. Each year, 102 youth throughout the United States are selected as State Honorees - two from each state and the District of Columbia. She will receive \$1,000, an engraved Silver Medallion and an all-expense-paid trip in early May to Washington, DC, where they will recognize the honorees.

Accourding to The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards program site, Megan Johnson, 18, of Federal Way, Wash., a senior at Highline CHOICE Academy in Burien, initiated several programs over the past eight years that raise money to provide homeless people, hospitalized children, and drug-addicted babies with things that make their lives a little easier. Megan, who has had 26 surgeries to correct a facial disorder, knows the pain of being unaccepted. "I was harassed in school," she said. "The kids made me feel worthless and I was so lonely. So when I saw a video about street people, I could feel their loneliness too."

Determined to show the homeless that somebody cared, Megan began making blankets and soliciting donations to buy them personal items. Then, in the following years, she started making blankets for infants born of drug-addicted mothers, and collecting DVDs for five children's hospitals. She also has raised money to help four families get off the streets and into their own homes, and to make a large contribution to Shriners Hospitals, which asked her to become a national patient ambassador. To support her projects, Megan sells hot cider at Christmastime; writes and illustrates children's books; sends letters to corporations; and sells homemade

necklaces, ink pens, and silicone wristbands. In addition, her projects have received support from schools, churches, community organizations, a network of 50 individual volunteers, and inmates at a local prison (who knit caps for her to give to the homeless). "My dream is for others to see that even if you are different, you can make a huge difference," said Megan.

This Unit, first hit the streets in 1969, with the *(continued on page 26)*




