Featured Member Morris Shanstrom

He watched the Enola Gay take off carrying an atomic bomb and has, on his wall, a photo of Hiroshima with a mushroom cloud hovering above.

Morris Shanstrom was born November 5, 1919, graduated from Central High School in 1942 and left to join the Army Air Corps at the start of "The War". Having a pilot's license on joining he envisioned flying planes in the beginning war and went to Nashville for training. Shortly he was called to headquarters and told his piloting days were behind him due to an enlarged heart. Slightly "perturbed" by this turn of events he was sent to Lowry Air Force Base in Denver and trained as a war photographer. Immediately he was reassigned to the Air Force School of Applied Tactics in Orlando, Florida. Ever heard of that?? Neither had Morris and he soon learned it was a top secret school and was intended to stay that way. He was taught to photograph everything that crossed his path, and his path was to be on land, in the air and several places in between. However, this photographic assignment placed him in airplanes with Col. Robert Conley, the future governor of Texas and the gentleman shot while in the fatal motorcade with President John Kennedy in Dallas.

He, also, found himself in a plane with a little known officer named Doolittle who became General "Jimmy" Doolittle and who had lead the April 18, 1942 raid on Japan and became the leader of the 80 "Doolittle's Tokyo Raiders".

One of Shanstrom's assignments took him – now remember this is 1942 – inside a hurricane. The planes were nothing like the ones we know today. He took multiple photos inside the hurricane and helped learn what made them do what they do. He was assigned later to hunt for submarines and photograph them from the air. Night missions were also on the agenda and occurred frequently.

During his Air Force career, he flew or flew in B25s, B26s, B17 and 19s and B24s. That "B" designation means he was riding with bombs most of the time. One of the more different bombs he traveled with was the "skip bomb". Like skipping a rock across the water the

skip bomb was dropped, "skipped" up and exploded in tunnels and caves higher than the ground. His photos of this happening assisted in perfecting this task. He also photographed a bomb with wings which could fly along above the ground for many miles and land other than where the planes were flying. This had to startle the people on the ground that couldn't see or even hear the plane that "got 'em".

All that air time had to include at least one crash; and it happened in a B26. The plane lost one engine and pretty soon...lost the second. When you are in a two engine plane - that is a recipe for catastrophe. Morris was told to get out. However, he and his camera were in the

back of the airplane and his parachute was in the front. As the plane crashed it skimmed the top of the trees and was completely destroyed. The crew suffered broken bones, severe bruises and other trauma and was hospitalized for 2 weeks; but they all survived.

Near the end of WWII Morris was enrooted to China when Japan claimed the airfields there. Forty days later (with no bath facilities) they stopped at Tinian Island and took up residence there. One day he was told another airman had seen



"a really big bomb" at North Field and urged Morris to go photograph it. He states it was about 9 feet long and 19-20 inches in diameter. As part of his job was taking pictures of planes and their crews and the aftermath of our bombing flights he took many photos of devastation in Tokyo where we dropped hundreds of bombs in a single day and destroyed everything there He photographed the planes and crews responsible for those necessary attacks as well. Soon after photographing the large bomb he was again taking photos of one of the crews loading that particular device onto an airplane named the Enola Gay. After seeing the total annihilation of Hiroshima he is still amazed one bomb could cause more damage than the hundreds dropped on Tokyo. Days later he watched as "Fat Boy" was loaded onto another plane and took off for Nagasaki. After these flights and their consequences he knew exactly why many of his photos were turned over to military authorities,

along with their negatives, as soon as they were developed; secrecy was mandatory.

One evening recently Morris and his wife, Bev, were watching a WWII documentary on television when the photographer panned the crowd and they were quite surprised to see Morris and his camera taking photos, also.

Reflecting on his war experiences, Morris leaned back on the couch and stated he had met many nice Masons during his service time, both in Florida and Colorado as well as overseas. Those, and the Masons he has met in his civilian life have taught him that Masons depending on each other and living the Masonic teachings make for a great life.

Discharged in 1946 Morris returned to Pueblo where he joined the family business, Opp's Beauty Supply. In that year the store was located on Union Avenue next door to the Al Kaly Temple. Fridays he remembers going to the Temple for the Cheese Knife luncheons and recalls they were "good home cooking" and great fellowship with other Masons.

Soon the family bought the old Water Works Building on Abriendo in Mesa Junction and revamped it for the growing business. He worked with the family business for many years.

Ill. Sir Morris came from and produced a long line of Masons. His Grandfather George Opp, Grandfather Shanstrom and father, Harvey Shanstrom were all Masons in Coolidge, Kansas. It is no wonder in 1935 Morris was Master Counselor of his DeMolay Chapter, joined South Pueblo Lodge 31 February 1, 1941 and also later joined both the Consistory and Al Kaly Shrine. He was in the first Consistory class after the war ended and joined the Shrine when it was still holding meetings above the American Furniture Store in the 100 block of Main Street. As a Shriner he was Director of the Works for 4 years and in 1963 he became (at that time) the youngest man in any temple to hold the office of Potentate. He was 44 years



old by now. His son Steve is a Mason in Grand Rapids, Michigan and Karl is Past Master of #31 in Pueblo. Ron Pearman, married to daughter Krista, joined the Masons in Colorado Springs and Al Kaly Shrine soon after their wedding and Krista works as the nurse for our screening clinics in Colorado Springs.

He and his family

have visited Temples in such places as Hawaii, Canada and Salt Lake City. They also have visited many hospitals and talked with several "Shrine Kids". One notable little girl was found by nuns looking like a "pretzel" and was turned over to the Shriners. She had literally been "thrown away" by her family in a society where that was permitted as she was hampered both by physical deformity and by being a girl. She was from a very small island in the Pacific and returned to it for the first time at the age of 12 after much care from the Shrine Hospital in Hawaii.

One of the doctors commented to Bev, "Where else but at a Shrine Hospital could I practice medicine with the newest and best equipment?" And he was certainly making a difference in the lives of children, too.

Ill. Sir Shanstrom spent many hours after his retirement making wooden radio controlled (RC) airplanes (I wonder why he chose airplanes?). October 1978 found the RC Airplane Magazine cover adorned by Miss Colorado Teen 1978, Puebloan Linda Potestio, and one of Morris' RC planes. He also built many wooden birdhouses which now reside in several of the states of our nation and wooden snowmen, one of which lives at the Pueblo Shrine Club and appears every winter to decorate the building.

For 10 years Morris was a Boy Scout Leader for Troop 17; both of his sons are Eagle Scouts. Nineteen-seventy two and 1973 found him as Dean of Philmont Scout Ranch, Rocky Mountain Council in New Mexico.

The Shanstroms married August 26, 1969 and have 2 children, Karl and Krista; Bev teaches English at Pueblo Community College. Karl graduated from medical school in Kirksville, Missouri and Krista is a nurse in Colorado Springs. Morris has a boy, Steve, and girl, Linda, from a previous marriage. They, also, have their own "Shriner's Kids" as Ron and Krista have adopted two darling little girls, Emily and Lauren. Emily was born without a right hand and Lauren has no right ear flap and possesses an extra thumb on her right hand. Emily is being fitted for a prosthesis now, and Lauren will face reparative plastic

surgery later in her little life.



Youngest member: 24 years old


Number of members born after 1950




George A. Mitchell







When you make your vacation plans take a second look at the locations of all of our Hospitals throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico.

As I visit the various Hospitals, I find the Staff and their active volunteers are quick to show you their facilities and tell you why they are unique to our system.

My latest visit was to the Honolulu Unit, where myself and an Aloha Clown "Flip" were given the grand tour by Mrs. Lan Tran. A special thanks goes out to her and Randy Chang who took time out of their busy schedules to answer my questions.

The Honolulu Unit took their first patient in 1923, when they were using the rear wing of the Kauikeolani Children's Hospital to treat Shriner children. They were later bequeathed property with the buildings that were converted to the Hospital (1930). That hospital has undergone a complete renovation the past three years and just had it's grand re-opening this past Fall .This Unit is the only hospital in our system supported by a single Temple. That is Aloha Temple and they are doing a fantastic job as they support the children across the Pacific Rim.

A huge accomplishment they are very proud of is the application of the Ilizarov Leg Lengthening Technique to a young man in their care. They were able to extend his lower left leg 13 inches, The Honolulu Unit was the first of our Hospitals to successfully perform this technique, and have done many more in the past six years.

This is representative of what goes on every day in our Hospitals. In summary, Nobles, take the opportunity to visit and make yourself proud of what you are doing for these children. Watch for our Temple to publicize Divan Days at the Salt Lake City and that's normally the third weekend of September and everyone is invited. There will be special times set aside for visits and tours through out the hospital. It's a great time for you and your Lady to visit.
