



The Honored Ladies Club



Featured Member III. Sir Earl Aldritch

When IS Earl Aldrich went home to Toledo, OH, after being discharged from the Marines, he worked in construction

and tended bar. What he really wanted was to work in law enforcement, following his experience as an MP in the Marines. He was interested in the State Patrol, but when that didn't pan out, he packed up and followed his brother, Chuck, to colorful Colorado. He started bartending and when a police officer mentioned that the police department was testing for people interested in joining, IS Earl signed up.

His service as a Colorado Springs police officer includes five years as a patrol officer, then twenty years as a detective where he worked in homicide/robbery and the last fourteen years as a fugitive detective. At a contest to find a slogan to be placed on the police cars, IS Earl's "Protect with Honor, Serve with Pride" won and he received one of his many commendations for his service to the community. He spent another seventeen years with the District Attorney's Office.

IS Earl developed a "second sense" about situations and was always getting himself and his partner in "trouble" when it kicked in. He has many tales of working with the late Sgt. Lou Schmidt and seeing something that wasn't "right" which ended up interrupting a crime or helping solve one. Some of his cases were legendary, others just routine and never really noted. One thing that touched me was that he would go to the scene of the crime and pray for the victim after a case had finished in court. Part of his work ethic involved "standing in their shoes" which was Sgt. Schmidt's hallmark saying.

I asked how working in this field, with this segment of humanity, had challenged his faith. He replied that you tried to work for justice and remember the victim and the price they paid. His focus was on the victims who got lost in the justice system and the media's focus on the crime and the perpetrator. His stories are many and Lady Shelia has created wonderful scrapbooks of his newspaper clippings and commendations.

Those scrapbooks are a labor of love and present an amazing story of IS Earl's dedication to public service.

Through all of this activity and dedication to the community, IS Earl joined the Masons in 1978. He belongs to the Southern Colorado Consistory and joined Al Kaly in 1981. His main Unit was the Potentate's Escort. He served in many capacities serving the Shrine until he was appointed to the line by IS Billy Thornburg in 1993. IS Earl appointed IS Bob Burr and the line extends to IS Dave Stevens. What contributions all of these men have made to our Al Kaly Shrine's cause here in southern Colorado! IS Earl's father, Carl, was a Mason and Shriner in Zenobia (Toledo OH) and IS Earl dedicated his year as Potentate to his father. One of the best parts of being

a Shriner, according to IS Earl, is being associated with men and their families who are dedicated to helping children and to keeping the Shriner Hospitals serving children and their families.

IS Earl's motto was "Change the world of a child and you change the world." The dedication to those principles is how IS Earl sees the mission of the Shrine. His family have been patients of the

Shriner Hospital and knows firsthand the wonderful service and dedication that the Hospitals give to their patients and families. His own experiences keep him involved and dedicated to Al Kaly Shrine. His latest foray came from an offhand remark to IS Steve Jordan when he was appointed to line about a Pomegranate. IS Earl became the Earl of Pomegranate for IS Steve during his year as Potentate. The Earl and his Lady

Shelia attended all of the Official Visits and gave an award at each one to a person who consistently helped Al Kaly and deserved recognition. Their joy at surprising and honoring the unheralded volunteers was their big reward for their efforts.

Through their involvement in community service, IS Earl and Lady Shelia have met many people with celebrity status and enjoy celebrating occasions where their friends are recognized for special honors. IS Earl always told Goose Gossage that when he was inducted into the Hall Of Fame, they would be there. They were, and the friendship with Goose is very special to IS Earl.

So here is a man who had dedicated his life to protecting others and bringing justice to the victims of crime in this community. His dedication to the Shrine is no less a commitment. For a man who has spent way too much time in the hospitals, he is one that visits the hospitals or nursing facilities or long term care facilities. He's still serving his community. We are proud of your dedication, IS Earl.



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




PAST EVENTS





To bring us all up to speed on the year-end process for the Treasurer, let me highlight the major actions that need to be taken. The Clubs and Units submit their financial reports to the Shrine office by the end of January. They are reviewed by the Shrine Treasurer and placed in the package for the auditor. The Shrine office gathers its reports and records and includes them with the package by the end of February. The package is given to the Shrine auditor/CPA in March for audit and preparation of the necessary tax forms in April. Obviously missed deadlines mean the taxes are not filed on time and requests for extensions must be submitted. Being anal retentive and trained in the military from my viewpoint, deadlines are to be met. If the auditor needs more time to complete the submission, the delay is on them.

The submitted 990's are not given to the Clubs or Units, but are on file in the Shrine office and are available to anyone for review.

Again, my thanks and kudos to all of the treasurers who worked hard this year to get their reports accurate and submitted on time!



Imagine Aubrey's Story

Imagine that you're really ready to start into second grade and take your little brother with you to school to show him the ropes. Imagine that you're about to be adopted into your forever family. Imagine that in a split second your life is not only changed, but also nearly ended.

Aubrey and her sister were goofing around and trying to get dad, Knelson Spooner to change his mind and let them go to a birthday party. They had broken

a rule and were told they couldn't attend. With a family brimming with children who have been brought together and adopted by this incredibly dedicated couple, the rules have to be kept and consistency is a motto. Knelson and Sherry had been foster parents to many children over the years. They have several sets of siblings that they have adopted. The day I met them there were eight children from their family eating pancakes at IHOP. Aubrey was there with her siblings and wearing her stretcher on her face. Her scars were visible and I just marveled at her spirit and her sweetness.

The girls ten and seven finally gave up and went outside. They were trying to build a fire and weren't very successful. Aubrey decided that gasoline would get it going and got a container with a hole in it to bring some to the fire. As the flames engulfed her, mother Sherry walked outside. Sherry saw the flare and ran to her child. That was the morning of August 9, 2012 and the world would never be the same again.

Aubrey was burned over eighty percent of her body. She was rushed to Memorial Hospital where she was placed on the Flight for Life helicopter for Denver's Children's Hospital. Children's contacted Galveston's Shriners Hospital for Children and Aubrey's journey toward healing began. Within twelve hours of the accident, Aubrey was in Galveston with Dad by her side and Mom on her way.

Friends stepped in and drove the couple to Denver to find out what was happening with their daughter. Friends and neighbors volunteered to care for the couple's other children, while Mom and Dad frantically rushed to Aubrey's side. Dad was able to fly with Aubrey to Galveston and Sherry flew in later. They stayed at the Ronald McDonald House for a while, but the fact that Aubrey was in the Intensive Care Unit made the requirements for chores and times to come and go a bit difficult to keep. Knelson was able to find an apartment to rent

> on a short-term basis, which was more suited for his four-month stay in Galveston.

Sherry stayed in Galveston for sixteen days while Aubrey was in ICU. Family came and visited while Dad and Aubrey settled in to the routine of care for a severely burned child. They helped with

> her care and bathing which was, at first, not encouraged. You would have to meet this couple to know that sitting on the sidelines while others did the care was not their style. Having been foster parents to many children and adoptive parents to their crew, they were ready and willing to step

in and help where they could.

As the skin grafting proceeded, Dad recounts that Aubrey looked like a patchwork quilt. She had areas of her body, soles of her feet, her shins and her head which were used for skin grafts as well as donor skin. Dad said that she looked like a patchwork quilt. This isn't a pretty picture and burns are not pretty. The Shriners try to educated children about the dangers of burns, by their annual Burn Week Program, that is held nationally in the month of February.

As difficult as it is for us to imagine what Aubrey went through, she has dealt with it stoically and bravely. She is really quite an amazing eight year old and is anxious and ready to head back to Galveston for other surgeries and having her ears reconstructed. She was fortunate somehow to have little scarring on her face. Her hands were not badly burned nor were her feet, but you realize the rest of her body was badly burned. Dad and Aubrey were in Galveston for four months and came home on Thanksgiving. She returns in February

for more treatment. The Shriners Hospitals for Children will continue to treat and care for this family far into the future. They will help Aubrey recover and thrive.

Dad mentioned that the Hospital employs staff that has been burned and that those staff members are a real inspiration to the patients and the patient's families. Those survivors give hope and show the families that there is hope for their child's future. Meanwhile, a delightful eight year old is ready to have whatever surgeries she needs so that she can get back to school which she loves. She is so brave and willing to trust what the staff at Galveston can do for her, that she is an inspiration. The whole family is an inspiration, for that matter. Mom and Dad are like magnets for children who need a forever home, love, and structure.





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

Fortunately for the world, Burns overcame his origins and was able to capture the spirit of a people and a nation as no other has done before or since.



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PUEBLO SHRINE CLUB


