



If you need something done, ask a busy man. Noble Lester Nowell is a busy man who took time to share some thoughts about community service, business, Shriners,

Boy Scouts, and many more topics. For those of you who know Noble Lester, he had strong opinions on all of the subjects discussed. They are a part of the man whose father died when Lester was seven, leaving six children for his mother to raise. They lived in a small town in Georgia and all of them pitched in and worked to take care of each other. Selfreliance and self-sufficiency were the key words in his family.

He graduated high school when the war in Vietnam was escalating. Even though he was working for the defense contractor Lockheed Aircraft Company and attending college, when the letter from the draft board arrived he didn't even get to pack a bag before leaving to

enter the U.S. Army. He had been working as an electrician and stayed with that in the Special Forces unit to which he was assigned. He was young and was assigned to the 173rd Airborne where he kept the choppers running and flew when he had to. His most exciting stories are from the time when he was moved near the Ho Chi Minh Trail. Only the young can go through all of that and keep on keeping on. He was in Vietnam for thirteen months

and when it was time to leave, he knew it. He received commendations and the Bronze Star medal during his service.

Back home in Georgia, he went to school again while working as a machinist then went back to work for Lockheed. Noble Lester later became an insurance adjuster. His training was in Yonkers, New York. Between his Georgia twang and the Yonkers version of English, communication was very interesting. When he met and married Mimi, they both were in college. When they graduated, he moved into manufacturing fabrics and did engineering of the machinery. Of course he went back to school to work on an MBA at West Georgia College where he occasionally sat in on Newt Gingrich's lectures. It is such a small world for some people.

and knows what a wonderful influence it has been in his life. He took a troop of sixteen boys whose parents were involved with the Criminal Justice system. Only one of the boys got in trouble. The rest benefitted from his guidance and direction. He taught them how to work and have self-respect. He was on the Eagle Scout

Committee for years.

Noble Lester was ready to become his own boss and friends who were in the food industry introduced him to that career path. After exploring franchising, he decided to go with Captain D's. He had visited Colorado Springs and loved it, plus he had

relatives in the area. He moved here in 1986 and left Mimi and their two children in Georgia for the first six months. Those months were dedicated to learning the business and how to manage a store and the people who work there. It was an existing location so there were repairs and problems to overcome.

Noble Lester is always available to give advice or









Nobles, I'm requesting or pleading for your help! It's the age old problem of dinner reservations. I have tried to get

my arms around this; but just can't seem to do it – trying to stay a nice guy. The January Stated Meeting cost Al Kaly over \$100. It's because of either "no shows" for dinner or those that cancelled reservations on the day of the stated meeting.

We cut off reservations two days prior to the event because we have to give our caterer a good count for food quantity. To my knowledge, it has been this way forever! Invariably we'll have reservations made Thursday or even Friday morning. To accommodate this, I "pad" the reservation number because I don't want to turn anyone away. At the January meeting we had a number of nobles that cancelled their reservation on Friday (we still have to pay for the meals), then there are "no shows" (we pay for those meals too). However, there are always a number of you that show up without a reservation. This can be good as it offsets the last minute cancellations and no shows — it's neither a good business practice nor is it being a good steward of Al Kaly's money.

OK – let me ask you this – please make your reservation by the cutoff date, if you cancel the day before or the day of the event plan on being billed for the meal. If you show up without a reservation, plan on either being placed on "stand by" or getting turned away. I hate charging Nobles that put so much in to Al Kaly for a meal for which they don't show up; but, I don't like wasting our money either. Please help me with this.

Where the Shriner's Hospitals SHINE

Going to a home where your records show the Shriner patients have had more than eighty surgeries is really an eye-opener. First off is the question, what diagnosis could cause such a family story? How does a family cope with the disruptions to their lives? How does the Shriner's Hospital provide such quality services and attention over the years? When Laura Wright, the mother of six boys, opened the

door, the commotion of six boys was present. She is a postal carrier and this was her day off.

Victor, the oldest son, and I started chatting. He has lost count of the surgeries he has endured, but he guessed somewhere over forty. All of his surgeries and those of his brothers Alex and Isaiah, are the result of a hereditary disease passed from the father's genes to the male children. The condition is named osteochondria which is very rare and has little research on it. It is described as a calcium lump which grows on a bone or perhaps in the joint, can take a spiral form or a mushroom, is extremely painful, and needs to be removed if possible. This condition can cut off the blood supply and damage the nerves when it starts growing. Osteochondria seems to be governed

by the closing of the growth plates in the shins. What that means is apparently the growths will stop at some time in the late teens or twenties. The damages and the pain remain, the growths slow down and stop.

Victor's first surgery was when he was nine or ten. The attempt to remove the lump at his right elbow was unsuccessful and he nearly lost the arm. Laura was a postal carrier who happened to have a Shriner and his Lady on her route. Noble Ed and Susan Warheim adopted the family and introduced them to the Shriner's Hospital system. They have been in Tampa, St. Louis and Salt Lake City's hospitals. Once when Victor was younger and they were leaving the hospital after another surgery, he wondered why he had these problems, "Look how good looking God made me." Then he thought for a while, and, when Mom had no answers, said,

"Maybe so I can help others."

While each of the boy's symptoms vary, all are involved to the degree that at least forty other surgeries have been part of their lives. A huge issue is schooling because the pain becomes so debilitating surgeries are required then there are amounts of time spent either in the hospital or recovering at home. Now these are not simple surgeries, because most of the surgeries are unique to the particular child. There is no "one size fits all" surgery with this

condition.

It seems Victor has gone through the most. He is now twenty-one and the Shriners will help him until the growths stop appearing. This fact is one that really is amazing. Just because he is over the "age limit" does not mean he is bounced out of the system. Because this condition affects the bones, joints and the connective tissue, standing or even walking can be a challenge. Entry level jobs are not something Victor is able to do. He cannot stand for long periods of time because of the pain and he has no training or a skill that allows him to stay seated. He got his GED because his time out of school was an impossible challenge. He would like to work in the aerospace industry.

Alex, seventeen, has had challenges with school as well. He

challenges with school as well. He would like to get into welding and work with his hands. He's had thirty-eight surgeries, and missed huge amounts of school. He is trying to find his way to being a productive citizen. Isaiah, who is fourteen, has only had six or seven surgeries. His growths, however, are on his spine near his neck. They are bound up in his nerve centers and cause headaches and pain in his arms and legs. Removing them surgically is not an option because he could be paralyzed if it didn't work. He's had to use wheelchairs, walkers and crutches.

The disabilities of the brothers require special help, not only from the hospitals, but also from the community. Trauma counselors visit the boys each week and try to help them deal with the effects of their condition, the pain, the

frustration, and the way to the future.

The situation is one of those "good news/bad news" deals. Apparently the growths will stop when the boys reach their full growth, i.e. the growth plates close. The bad news is, because this is not a fatal disease, little research is directed toward it. It is rare but not life-threatening; will cause pain for the rest of their lives, but there isn't a cure in the wings, or even much research even happening.

What is so remarkable is the Shriners were aware of the condition and have worked to treat the growths and help the boys live the best possible lives. They can't cure them; they can help them to not worry about the "aging out" of the boys. We always are amazed at the versatility of the Shriner's Hospital System and are grateful for their unending quest to help children live their best possible lives. Keep the tradition alive. Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?



Nickels the Clown: an East-West Shrine Game Tradition

WHEN BOB BURR JOINED AL KALY SHRINERS in Pueblo, Colo., a local temple (chapter) of Shriners International, in 1967, he had no idea that he would one day become a traditional figure at the East-West Shrine Game, and would continue that role for 28 years straight. Burr became a Shriner just before he was deployed to Thailand to serve as an advisor to the Royal Thai Air Force, and upon returning to the U.S., he was assigned to the Strategic Air Command Headquarters in Omaha, Neb., for three and a half years. When he returned to his home in Colorado Springs, Colo., in 1972, it took him another three years to become involved with the fraternity. After four Shriner clowns from Burr's temple visited him at work, telling him that they had decided he should join their unit, he decided to take them up on the idea, and Nickels the Clown was born.

Noticing the Clowns

In 1988, while Burr was working for Martin Marietta Aerospace in San Jose, Calif., he received tickets for the East-West Shrine Game in Pelo Alto, Calif. Since he would be in town, he decided to attend the game. Burr was surprised to see so many Shrine clowns there, entertaining the children; he was impressed. The following year, Burr decided to make another appearance at the East-West Shrine Game—as one of the Shrine clowns. And according to Burr, he was instantly hooked.

The first couple of years Burr wore a typical clown outfit, and then he decided to do something different. He started dressing as a football player, which he has continued to do ever since—pads and all. He has attended the East-West Shrine Game every year, even throughout its moves around the country, and this year is his 28th consecutive appearance at the game as Nickels the Clown. "I've made so many friends within the fratemity,"

Burr said. "It has been a truly incredible experience."

Clowning for the Kids

His time as Nickels the Clown has been rewarding. "One of the best parts is when they bring the patients from Shriners Hospitals for Children to the game, and I'm able to interact with them, give them stickers and my token wooden nickels," said Burr. "During the games, when I make my way over to the Shriners' children to help make their day a little better, and to be a part of their lives — that's what it's all about for me."

Burr is in makeup 35 times a year, and out in his local community making people smile. He became a clown in March 1976, and has been active ever since—and for 38 years, his wife, Betty, has made every single one of his outlits.

"To me, being a Shrine clown is the opportunity to work with the children," said Burr. "When I parade down the street, there will be a little one that runs to me and asks, 'can I have a hug?' The things kids say and do because you're a clown are just heartwarming."








NATIONAL PANCAKE DAY




