

Heatured Shriner

John Ladd

While riding in a military jeep through the wooded areas of Belgium during the Battle of the Bulge, they got near the front lines and wound up between the Germans and the Allied Forces. "I told my driver, 'Let's get the hell out of here," said John Ladd, who trained with the military while still in high school. "The driver took the back roads through the forest and we got clear. That really was all I saw of combat, but that was close enough." As a member of Gen. Omar Bradley's staff, John Ladd was ordered to stay away from the front lines during the heat of World War II. But sometimes, he found it necessary to go up to the front lines with supplies and messages for regimental headquarters.

Born Jan. 12, 1912, at 29th and Elizabeth, Ladd grew up in Pueblo, where he attended Central High School, graduating in 1930. He trained in a citizens' military training camp, beginning in 1929. For four years, he trained in the camp for 30 days at a time and took correspondence courses. During this period he moved to Denver, where he worked as a chalk artist for Boetteher and Company for several years. In May 1933, at the completion of his training he was commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant in the Army Reserves. After receiving his commission, he served on active reserve duty periodically in Fort Warren, Wyosning.

"In 1940, I was called to active duty for a year," Ladd said. That year turned into about seven years." In Bremerton. Washington, while serving as part of Gen. Bradley's staff, he was in charge of sending troops to Alaska. It was there John heard that Japan had bombed Pearl Harbor. Later, he transferred to the headquarters in San Francisco, California, and it was during that time that he joined the Blue Lodge. "Ldid the memory work while sitting on the beach, looking out at the ocean during blackouts," Ladd said.

From San Francisco, he was sent to Gen. Bradley's headquarters in London, where he was involved in several briefings that were led by Gen. Dwight Eisenbower, the Supreme Commander of the European Theater. "In France," John said, "I had no business being in the front lines because I was what they called a High Security Officer. I knew the overall battle plans. Gen. Bradley had about 12 million men under him but the thorn in his side was Gen.

Montgomery. Although the commanders had the battles planned, some leaders did not adhere to them. On D-Day, Montgomery was supposed to take one of the first towns in France, but it took him two weeks to take control. He wanted to march straight into Berlin, but it would have backfired because the enemy would cut the forces in half, which would have taken longer to win the war in Europe."

After the 1st, 3rd, 9th and 15th stormed the beaches of Normandy, he followed about a month later. "In my position, I was unable to get around quite a bit," Ladd said. "I was in charge of Morale, Welfare and Graves Registration." After the war ended, John was assigned to conduct five studies and to collaborate with two others to learn what happened and to learn how the generals awarded decorations. Following the war, he kept his reserve commission, which was open-ended until 1966 when he was



transferred to inactive duty and ranked as a colonel for life.

He moved back to Pueblo, joining his father and two brothers in the lumber business in August 1946. John was master of two of the lodges there. He also became involved in the Scottish Rite, where he became a 33rd degree Mason. He then became involved with the Scottish Rite speech therapy program. He later joined the York Rite and Al Kaly Shrine, where he served as Potentate in 1966.

As a part of the summer training with the military, Ladd marched from Fort Carson to Cheyenne, Wyoming in five days. When the Army decided to get rid of their mules, the quartermaster picked out 29 mules and the Shriners purchased them for \$25 each. "After the auction, they muck them home. The next day, they were back at Fort Carson," Ladd said. This was the beginning of John's membership in the Mule Train of Al Kaly Shrine. In the 1970s, the Shriners built the clubbouse for the Mule Train unit in one day. John rode his mule in two different Rose Parades and in the parade when President John Kennedy was inaugurated.

Ladd also was involved in his community, founding the Pueblo Rural Fire District on the mesa, of which he was president for several years. He served on two Pueblo City Charter committees in 1950, which are just now being re-organized. He also learned to fly an airplane and enjoyed traveling around the world, including Australia, New Zealand, South Pacific and Europe. John first met his wife, Mildred, at a freshman mixer; however, she moved to Denver shortly thereafter. He didn't see her again until a friend fixed him up with her. The Ladds were married in 1933 and were together for 74 years before she passed away in April 2007. Ladd has a daughter, Donna (Peter) Gruitch, of Green Mountain Falls, four grandchildren and numerous great-grandchildren.



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This month, we will start the 5-year strategic planning process. If anyone would like to serve on this committee, I would welcome them with open arms. The process is, to say the least, daunting. Obviously the most important part of the plan is that of creating an environment for the creation of new members.

A little history

In 1978, Al Kaly Shrine had 2,259 members, and clubs and units were flourishing with enthusiastic participating members. At year-end 2007, we had 1,052 total members, have disbanded several units, and others are struggling.

The train is off the track and there is too much we have to offer to let it slide any further. Let me supply you with some additional numbers. The following are **annual averages** over the past 20 years.

- ▲ Creations 49
- ▲ Affiliations 15
- Restored 7
- Total average increases 71
- Now let's take a look at the losses side
- Demitted 22
- Suspended 36
- ◆ Passed away 54
- ▲ Total average losses 111
- ▲ Average annual <u>loss</u> 40

Nobles, the time has come to get our arms around this decline in membership. But let's take a look at the positives.

- Many Masonic Lodges are showing large number increases.
- 2. We are seeing a renewed increase in Shrine petitions.
- We have seen a new unit formed successfully in the last year.
- A few units have merged to capitalize on their individual strengths.

Nobles, the temple needs your help. Everyone should commit to bring in at least one new member this year. It is not enough to make this statement without showing you a way for this to happen. I know from personal experience, that if a man off the street is approached to become a Mason and ultimately a Shriner and has sufficient information, he will most likely join and start the process. But unfortunately, we haven't had the tools to make this happen.

I recently produced a DVD that talks about Al Kaly, Masonry, and the Scottish and York Rites. There are three DVD's incorporated onto one disk with an introduction, transitions for each presentation, and a summary. The disk is packaged in an envelope with a petition for each body and information pieces. The objective is to give the whole package to a prospect. I am not in favor of mailing unless the prospective candidate has already expressed interest. In other words I wouldn't like to see these mass mailed. In my opinion, they need to be given friend to friend. Call the Shrine Office if you would like to have a set.

I often hear "But I don't have a petition!" Well, now you do. The website has a tab labeled "Membership Applications." Simply bring it up, print it, and off you go. Nobles, together we can get this train back on track, but it will take all of our efforts to do so.

"The F/Stops Here" By Bob Bills Al Kaly Photos



Hi Everyone -

Remember playing Tic-Tac-Toe? There are two lines vertical, two lines horizontal. Where the lines cross you have four points that are the same points used for composition in photography or painting. Those cross-points rarely change. Usually you place the Subject in the upper right "cross point" area or the upper left "cross point" area. For instance, if your subject is looking left, you place them in the right cross point, giving them "room" to look.

What I'm referring to is, when you peek in the viewfinder of your camera, or perhaps look into the screen monitor - the subject of your photo should be placed in that imaginary "cross point" in order to get the most attractively composed picture. Use these "imaginary" tic-tac-toe cross points to help you do the locating.

If you have a digital camera, try it. Then purposely do the opposite giving your Subject person no room to look. See what happens to your composition.


If you are taking a close-up of a bunch of flowers, the same rule applies.... upper left or upper right "cross point" for the focus of your main Subject, and then you can get creative and put a plastic Ladybug or some kind of creepy-crawler in the bottom cross point to tell the rest of the story. It works. Try it.

If you have a digital camera, you should shoot it at full quality resolution all the time. You can always crop and straighten it in the computer. If you start with low resolution, you will end up with a less than good photo every time.

Next time what the heck is an F/Stop?

We have the next two 'featured member' articles lined up for July and August, but are always on the lookout for the next one. IMPERIAL SHRINE HEADQUARTERS

Provides Three Days of

Leadership Training

Many Al Kaly Shriners and their Ladies may or may not know that the Imperial Shrine Headquarters provides three days of leadership training each year in Tampa for the Oriental Guide and the Assistant Rabban given by a cadre of presenters made up of Past Potentates, Recorders and Treasurers from many Temples around the country. There were even a couple of past Grand Masters thrown in for good measure and, of course, a host of Imperial Officers, including the Imperial Potentate. Having been to two of these sessions now, I can tell you there is a lot of information exchanged in three days and it's not all from the presenters. Allan Ake and I (with our Ladies) returned from our sessions in March and want to share with you some of our thoughts and experiences.

Let me clarify a few points first. In our Al Kaly budget we have allocated money to pay most of the expenses of the Oriental Guide and Assistant Rabban but not our Ladies. We are encouraged by Imperial to bring our Ladies, mainly for the social aspect of the experience, but there are some presentations for the Ladies independently and with us. You would be surprised at what our Ladies learn that we should be doing! The two sessions are very similar in course structure but still geared to our different leadership positions. Allan, what struck you first?

Well, Steve, in Imperial Potentate Bernard Lemieux's opening remarks to the Oriental Guide Seminar attendees, he made it clear that he wants the nobility to have fun as Shriners, and said, "Fun and fellowship is our purpose; the hospitals are our cause." I think it interesting that you told me he also said that to your session and at the CSSA business meeting a few weeks ago. It seems he is serious about that point. I agree we must look for new and fun activities for our Nobles and their Ladies!

Allan, I agree. I remember Imperial Sir Bernie saying "the fun came first" and we have to get back to that. If we are having fun and helping kids our membership goals will be easier to meet (especially retention), so naturally we will support our hospitals.

Steve, as we all know, declining membership is a huge problem for nearly all of the 191 Temples in the Shrine. At the beginning of this year Shrine membership was 375,621 and that is a far cry from our high point in 1979 of over 940,000. One of the ideas given in our membership presentations was to start up a New Nobles Unit. The unit could pull the new Nobles together for the purposes of getting acquainted, sparking interest in the Shrine, and providing feedback to the Al Kaly Board of Directors (formerly referred to as the Divan). The new unit would have a Board member within the unit to be a mentor to the new Nobles and act as liaison between the new Nobles and the Board of Directors. The Board would then receive ideas and feedback from the newer members. One of the most interesting membership presentations was "Stickball to Star Wars" by Bob Conley, Past Grand Master of Michigan. He outlined the various generations and age groups and how each age group's view of the world was shaped by their

experiences. The various age groups really do see the world differently. That causes us to have different ideas and different value structures. His main point is that if the Shrine is to attract younger members, we must be sensitive to their attitudes — and listen, listen, and listen to them. Then we must act on what they tell us.

Allan, I agree. We (Ladies included) too heard RWB Conley's interesting analysis and also talked about a new members club as a way of feedback. I think now we need to find some of our new members who want to help our fraternity get better at meeting the changing interests of our membership. If any readers are interested, let one of the Board Members know so we can work with you.

Allan, as you already know, finances and budgets are always a big topic of discussion and it becomes even more so with a declining membership. Since it is the Chief Rabban's responsibility to chair the budget process for the following year with the elected Board, we spent several hours discussing the different facets of a Temple budget so we would better understand the process. One of the most important principles in that planning process is to be extremely realistic with the numbers for revenue streams and very cautious about what the expenses will be. I was reminded that because our Temple has fewer than 3,000 members our books only require a 'review' and not a more costly 'audit'. I'm sure I heard that before but this time it stuck! Another major point that we were reminded of was that the Transportation Fund really belongs to the hospitals and not to our temple, even though we like to think it does. You might have been surprised at some of the looks on some faces in the room. I also learned that there are a number of Temples that suspend members on the December 31st if their memberships are not renewed by then. They don't "carry" members another year as we do. Maybe we need to look into that since the Temple must pay the Imperial per capita and hospital assessment for the member.

Thanks for that good info, Steve. Now I'd like to write a little about our leadership seminar. It was an all-day seminar based on John Maxwell's 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership. The concepts and presenters were both interesting and informative. One of the key leadership qualities that I learned was the "attitude of service." According to Maxwell, "leaders add value by serving others," and I believe it.

Allan, I hope that doesn't mean we have to do the dishes at all the OVs!!....I'm just kidding. We were into those "laws" too. One of the bigger topics for us was the planning aspect of the leadership responsibility. We hammered on the three to five year strategic planning process that is needed to ensure growth (membership) and prosperity (revenues and expenses). As we have discussed among the board members, this is something we need to focus on again. I also see service in such things as being mentors to our new Shriners by helping them understand how our organization works and see to it that they have as much fun in the process as we do. Come to think

of it, I guess every member of Al Kaly should share in that 'service'. continued on page 9

We also talked about team building, communication methods, insurance for the Temple, the current expansion of the cleft lip and palate program and the upcoming Imperial sessions. We were very fortunate to have an almost two hour presentation by Dr. Patel of our Chicago hospital on cleft lip and palate. I don't know how many before and after slides he showed of the children that the team there has helped but I have to tell you it truly approaches the level of miracles. We would go from crying at the before picture to amazement at the after picture. Dr. Patel, who is a plastic surgeon, among other things such as an electrical engineer (degree), gave credit to what he described as an incredible team of care givers administrators, nurses and aids to an assortment of different kinds of doctors who all get together to perform a wonderful (and most often beautiful) transformation of a child. Thank God, we have doctors and staff who care like they do.

Wow, Steve, that's very interesting information from Dr. Patel. We Oriental Guides also heard about the hospitals from Jim Full, Executive Vice President, Shriners Hospitals for Children. His main theme was the fact that the hospitals must be continually reinvented. His example was that our hospitals were created to treat polio. When polio was eradicated, the hospitals had to begin treating other children's conditions. We continually change the way we do business as the medical climate changes.

One of the most valuable experiences of the OG School was that my Lady, Linda, and I had the opportunity to meet many of our counterparts. We met men and women from all over the country and Canada. What a learning experience it was to find out how other Temples operate and the differences between them all. It was great to meet so many other men and women.

Allan, Deborah and I totally agree with that! I guess you could say "It's just Dandy to be a Shriner!"


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

Children's Screening Clinics

If you are interested in helping with the Screening Clinic in your Community, contact your local Hospital Representatives and get involved early. A successful annual Screening Clinic takes 10-12 weeks of preparatory work and many helping hands, and there never seems to be enough help.


If you know of a child who needs our help and you send them to one of our clinics, be sure to tell them to bring as much information about the child's condition as possible. This includes medical records, x-rays or other test results, and by all means the Social Security number of the child. The more medical information we can forward with the application, the easier it is for our Doctors to make a decision.

The Hospital Representatives who work these Clinics are appointed by the Potentate, for his year. So if you are interested in being a Representative let someone on the Divan know and they might be able to include you in their plans for their year. Know when the Screening Clinic is scheduled for your Community and be prepared to pass that information along.



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Wheelchair Program

In conversation with Ken Kozole we have learned that many of the wheelchairs that are loaned are never returned to the hospital. Therefore, we are setting up a procedure whereas Ken will inform

me each time a wheelchair or other equipment is loaned to a
patient, and the estimated time the chair will be needed. I will
furnish this information to Larry Newman who will inform the
Hospital Rep in the specific area of this loan. This Hospital Rep
will recover the chair after it is no longer needed by the patient and
inform us that he, in fact, has the chair. It will be transported to me
and I'll pick it up on inventory and inform Ken that we have the
chair. I will perform any restorative maintenance that may be
required, if possible. When we have enough equipment for
transport, we will do that.

We understand that this is a test project, but have a strong belief that it will proceed successfully. There will, no doubt, be a few procedural changes along the way that we will implement. Additionally, for the startup of this process we are requesting a list of wheelchairs that have been issued during the past year and not returned. We will also try and make that recovery. With Bob Burr's advice we will make every effort to make sure that we stay within the appropriate guidelines of the Shrine. I will donate my time to accomplish this project. If you have any questions, please ask.

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PATIENT AMBASSADOR A SHINING EXAMPLE

"It is my belief that the major problem in the
world is the lowering of expectations," says

12-year-old Tampa Shriners patient Benjamin Carpenter.

"Today, we reward people for 'trying' instead of
'doing'. The most obvious example of this is with
education. If a student tries and fails, the student
is still rewarded for the effort. Short term, this
seems like a good idea, but does it really help the
student? My answer is no, because once the student
becomes an adult and enters the real world, results
are what matters."

This drive for results has paid big dividends for Benjamin. He has gotten straight A's on all report cards since he's been in school. Twice he finished in first place in his school's Accelerated Reader program. He was selected "AAA School Safety Patrolman

of the Year" for the Southeast Region, and finished second in the Hillsborough County Science Fair. Benjamin has never missed a day of school and received a Chair Scholars Scholarship, which will pay for tuition and books for any 4-year college or university in the state of Florida.

What makes Benjamin's accomplishments all the more remarkable is that he uses a wheelchair for mobility. Diagnosed with Spinal Muscular Atrophy, a degenerative

genetic nerve disease that does not allow his muscles to receive all the messages that the brain sends to them. "Many people have the misconception that people in wheelchairs are automatically not only physically handicapped, but also mentally challenged. Sometimes I think I do so well in school because I have to show that my wheelchair is not attached to my brain. My advice to people with disabilities is to not let what people say or think get you down. What matters is what is in your mind and heart."



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





I'm happy to report that Illustrious Sir Jerry Sube is getting better and better each day that rolls by.


AL KALY SHRINE BAND

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MERIT BADGE AND JEWEL OF DISTINCTION

At a recent Shrine function the Potentate announced that one of our new Nobles would receive his merit Badge in January. That's about seven months after joining the Shrine, and believe me, to accumulate 500 points in that short a time requires a lot of work.

Sitting in the crowd that evening I heard some varied comments, such as: "I've been in the Shrine five years and I don't have mine yet," "How do you suppose he did that so fast?" or "Isn't that an impossible task?" This article is written for those people, our new Nobles, and anyone else that may be interested.

To earn his medal in seven months, this Noble visited four Shrine Hospitals (200 points), 1* line signed two new Nobles (175 points), attended numerous parades (15 points each), Screening Clinics (20 points each), Basketball Tournament (25 points), a number of Circus performances (10 points each), Stated Meetings (15 points each) and worked actively at restoration of members (100 points each). As you can see, he worked hard for that award and he will wear it proudly.

From this point forward, when he accumulates an additional 500 points he will receive a silver star for the medal, up through 2000 points. At the 2500-point level the Merit Badge is replaced by the Jewel of Distinction and is awarded with four gold stars. For every 500 points thereafter a gold star will be awarded.

One thing to remember about all of this is that accurate reporting by your Unit Secretary, or by you (if you don't belong to a Unit) is a must. Our Recorder maintains a log of all points earned and Medals and Stars that are awarded, so he needs all of your information reported accurately and timely.

If you should misplace this article and wonder about the Point System, refer to your Potentates directory, published annually, and you will find nearly four pages dedicated to the subject of points.

Note: As of calendar year 2000 there is a 10,000 and now a 25,000-point pin that will be awarded and worn on the Jewel of Distinction.

Good luck to all. Work hard and wear your award proudly.

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



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


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COLORADO SPRINGS SHRINE CLUB

Estimates to re-do the parking lot have escalated to \$131,000.




