

As a matter of consistency, Al Kaly allows \$400 per trip to the Salt Lake City hospital for Orthopedic Procedures and \$500 to the Chicago, Sacramento, Los Angeles or Galveston Hospitals for Burns or Cleft Lip/Cleft Palette procedures.

Funding: As a 501.C.3 nonprofit organization, Al Kaly Shriners Hospital Patient Transportation Fund relies on the generosity of donors to continue assisting families with funding to transport children to hospital appointments. Here are some suggestions to make your tax deductible donation to our Hospital Patient Transportation Fund which can be made by cash, check or credit card:

- A simple tax deductible donation
- A gift in your will
- A gift to honor a relative or loved one at Christmas or on their birthday
- Memorial donations in memory of a loved one







Shriner Child Steve Ruano Playing Sports through the Pain

What do you do as a parent when your eight year old child who has played ice hockey and run whenever and wherever possible starts complaining of pain in his hip and leg? What happens when it is so painful that he can't walk and needs a wheelchair? Well, that is what Perthes Disease can do to a child. The onset isn't overnight, but for some unknown reason, the blood stops flowing to the ball at the end of the femur where it fits in the hip socket. When there is no blood, the bone begins to deteriorate and flatten which can cause mobility problems and pain.

This is what happened to Anne Von Mizener's son, Steven Ruano. Perthes Disease affects more boys than girls and is a juvenile disease. The earlier it strikes, between five and eight, the less complicated it is. Steven was eight when the symptoms first started. They were living in Kremmling and the medical help was limited. Ann had been working in Kremmling; when the job went away, she moved to Colorado Springs.

She went to a doctor in Denver and was referred to the Shriner's Hospital in Salt Lake City. Steven is eleven now and has had some rough times. He has been in a wheelchair for periods of time and uses crutches at school. Steven saw Dr. Halok Altiok in Salt Lake. Although the bone will begin to heal itself after a time, there is little that can be done but wait and see how that healing progresses. The idea is to not have lots of pressure on the ball of the femur so that it grows back in a ball shape. If it is misshapen it is very painful and will not allow unhampered movement. One of the treatments that can be done is a fixator surgery. The fixator is metal and is attached externally to the leg bone and hip socket to keep the ball from getting squashed as it regrows. (Those are not the technical terms.) It is prone to infection and is painful. Another thing that can be done is physical therapy that can



strengthen the muscles that hold the leg bone in place. The last visit to see Dr. Altiok, showed that the physical therapy was doing a good enough job that attaching a fixator wasn't needed at this time.

Dealing with the pain and letting Steven still express his athleticism is a real issue for Ann. I met with them at Panorama Middle School one evening to watch Steven and his younger brother Arthur play wheelchair basketball with several other people. Now that is a sport!! First off the wheelchairs have wheels that are sort of slanted in toward the top. They can stop on a dime and turn and wheel around. It looked like you really get a workout doing it. The session was the last for a while. Now he can go to sled hockey which he likes, but isn't as much his passion. Sled hockey is done on ice and you are in a sled that you propel with your arms while seated on a sled that is about four inches off the ice.

Growth spurts make getting around more difficult and painful. Controlling the pain is a huge issue for Steven. There are various therapies to control the pain and Steven prefers one that puts electrical impulses to dull the pain. One doctor prescribed narcotics that Steven didn't like. He does not like the feeling he gets from them and avoids using them. He goes to physical therapy two times a week. He goes to school as much as he can and had to use a wheelchair part time last year. This year he uses crutches to go to school but ditches them whenever he can.

One delightful thing about Steven is that his hair is usually a different and vivid color. He is trying to maintain a persona even as he struggles with pain and limited mobility. The road to recovery is long, maybe as long as five years. He may need hip surgery after he stops growing.

The family has counseling to keep balance. Arthur has had to step up and help Steven who had always been the "big brother" before Steven got Perthes. With their list of chores, they have figured out how to do what they need to by modifying the way they work together. Arthur, who would much rather read and be on the computer, participates in the sports with Steven. This family works together.

Dr. Altioke will continue monitoring Steven and check on the regrowth of the ball on the femur. The Shriners would have done or will do the fixator surgery if it becomes needed. In the meanwhile, this family has good council, good medical advice and help when they need it. Keep the tradition alive. Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?




