





Featured Member Adolph Wolff


LIVING HISTORY

The door opens and a small white haired man motions me to move my car to the other side of the driveway as his wife, Gerda is not home yet. Adolph Wolff is brimming with energy as he leads me up the stairs of their home high on the

west side of Colorado Springs. He proudly shows me the three hundred sixty degree views that show all of the prairie and Pikes Peak. The house is beautiful, and the setting comfortable as we settle in to the display of information that Adolph has assembled. Adolph

has assembled. Adolph showed me some of his very prestigious awards and memorabilia: his Bronze Star, a copy of the cease fire that ended the European Front and so much more. This remarkable man was born in 1914 in Germany after his father left for war (WWI). His father became a POW and didn't return for seven years. The family immigrated to the United States in 1928. When World War II started, Adolph was first

in line to sign up. But, was declared 4F because it looked like he had arthritis and was rejected. Finally the time came when the Army was ready for men who were able bodied who had been rejected before. He was able to join the 110th Infantry.



They were in the thick of the war and what they went through will only be known by the men who survived. They have no way to convey nor do we have the ability to understand the horrors they faced and survived.

Adolph avoided death three times. As an infant he was ill and wouldn't eat and the doctor told his mother that he would die. His mother tried just one more time and he ate and lived. During the War, he was shot by a sniper and the bullet hit his C Rations stored in his breast pocket. In 2008, he was in heart failure and signed up for an unapproved heart procedure which saved his life and opened the way for the procedure to become approved for use. Adolph had the opportunity to save lives as well. During the latter part of the War when they were on the front lines, a man was seen carrying a lantern which brought German fire toward their location. Adolph went to talk to him rather than just shoot him

to douse the light. He was a French farmer whose wife had gone into labor and needed help. Adolph took two medics, went behind German lines and helped deliver the baby boy.

When the European Front was over, he thought he would be sent home or be redeployed to Japan. When the Japanese

surrendered, Adolph was assigned to stay in Germany because he spoke German and had proved his abilities to manage and support the military presence there. Adolph had one request, a pretty blonde secretary. He and Gerda were engaged, married

and had a son before he came back to live in the U.S. in 1978.

In a presentation given by Adolph to the Shriners, he said, "From marriage and fatherhood I learned true love and unselfishness. The greatest overall influences were my wife Gerda and our only son Fred. From Freemasonry, I learned to act with honesty, truth and generosity and to subdue my passions and to keep my emotions and prejudices within due bounds... The good Lord blessed me with good health, long life and better than average intelligence. Life has been endlessly good to me. I have found happiness, fulfillment and rewards beyond my wildest dreams."

In a 90th Birthday message, Adolph said, "I would like to share with you my recipe for longevity. Accentuate the

positive. Live each day to the fullest. Get the most from each hour, each day, and each age of your life. Today our society is captivated by a culture that worships youth. Seniors are pushed aside and 'ageism' is widespread. We notice the relative invisibility of the



elderly in television shows and advertisements... We seniors are often titled 'old geezers'. Yes, old geezers are easily spotted. How does one spot an old geezer? At sporting events during the playing of the national anthem they hold their caps over their hearts and sing without embarrassment. They know the words and believe in them... It is us old geezers who know that our great country is protected not by politicians and police but by the young men and women in the military serving their country. This old geezer has moral courage and decent values. I do not choose to be a common man. It is my right to be uncommon. I seek opportunities to develop whatever talents God gave me – not security. I do not wish to be a kept citizen, humbled and dulled by having the state look after me. I want to take the calculated risk, to build, to fail and to succeed. I refuse to barter incentive for a dole. I will not trade freedom for beneficence nor my dignity for a handout. It is my heritage to stand erect, proud and unafraid; to think and act myself, enjoy the benefits of my creations, to face the world boldly and say – 'this I have done and accomplished.'"

He and Gerda are Social Butterflies and each has their own car. Adolph is the oldest person in the State of Colorado to have a driver's license. They have lived their lives to the fullest. What an inspiration and a joy to meet such wonderful human beings. October 12, 2014 will be the 100th Birthday which is also Columbus Day. Have a wonderful celebration, Adolph Wolff.






FINANCIAL STANDINGS

Brother Nobles,

Here it is the middle of the year, but in the world of finances, it is only the end of the first quarter.



Having gotten through one-quarter of the year, we are reflecting about 50% of fraternal fundraising revenue. This is good as these funds flush out our operating funds. However, put that against the fact that only 71% of our expected dues have been received. Let's get with it and pay our dues.

On the expense side, all of the accounts are showing room for the rest of the year. The sole exception is in the building operations account. That is where we book the insurance costs. The excess of \$805 reflects the fact that not all Units and Clubs have paid their insurance assessment.

Again this year, I have had to fight to get the Unit and Club reports in to the Shrine office. In case it is not realized or known, these reports are required by General Order #1 and are supposed to be in the office by February 1. This is an annual report and the Shrine office should not have to hound the Units and Clubs to make them. These reports make sure that Unit and Club finances are running properly and in accordance with Shrine law. They are due to the Shrine auditor, who prepares the taxes and compiles a report that goes to Tampa, telling them that we are good little boys with our money.





Shriner Hospital: One Miracle at a Time

What a wonderful surprise! I was to meet Prince Lee to talk about his college freshman daughter, Brianna, at the Citadel Food Court, and who should be accompanying him, but Brianna. She'd called and said she was coming home for a long weekend. What great timing. She is tall and lovely, with a story to tell.

Brianna had scoliosis and compensated for the curvature of her spine by wearing baggy sweatshirts and hoodies to hide the bump on her back. When she was 14, the family could tell the curvature was becoming more severe, and they consulted a doctor who prescribed an expensive, painful brace. She tried it a few times and could not bear the discomfort. Yet her body was becoming more uncomfortable. Lying down to sleep was the only way she got relief. Her mother called St. Jude's for help, which referred her to the Shriner Hospital Network. Because Dad and Brianna were living in Grand Junction at the time, they went to a screening clinic there and were sent to Salt Lake Shriner Hospital for Children.

By then, Brianna was 15 and dressing in loose fitting clothes, trying to avoid drawing attention. She felt different from the other girls her age because there were things she couldn't do. Sports hurt too much. She tried golfing with her dad, but that was too painful. When they went to Salt Lake, she

was determined to be a good candidate for a very risky operation. The doctors would open her back, straighten the curvature of her spine, and attach rods to the spine to correct the curvature. The doctors explained this option and gave them some time to think about it. It didn't take Brianna any time at all. She knew she wanted to rid herself of the pain in her body and the feelings of emotional isolation.

Her dad explained how withdrawn this beautiful girl had become and how she tried to hide her deformity with baggy clothing and shapeless clothes. She never wore dresses or anything that would draw attention to her. He cannot express enough thanks to the Shriners for the miracle of health that they gave his daughter.

Two months after the first visit, Brianna had her life changing operation. She had just turned 16 and went into the operation at five feet six inches and came out five feet nearly nine inches. Not only was she taller, but she could breathe better and her body was much more comfortable with the room for her organs, especially the lungs, that came from straightening the spine. The remarkable thing was that her spine had twisted five degrees in the months

between the first visit and the surgery. It was changing rapidly and the timing couldn't have been better.

Brianna's return to high school after the surgery was quite dramatic: she was taller, and she now wore clothes that looked good and made her feel good. Her friends were curious about her transformation and asked questions that they had never asked her before. For Brianna, it was liberating to be able to freely talk about her operation. She began to discover the person she could become and came out of hiding to be who she wanted to be. It was life changing and life giving.

The Salt Lake City Shriners Hospital made the family comfortable and welcome while Brianna healed enough to return home. She has had two follow up visits and every time is treated like returning family member. She is very grateful for all the Shriners have done for her and was so glad to tell me her story and show me the before and after x-rays of her spine. It is an honor for me to accept the thanks and praise on behalf of all that the Shriner Hospitals have done for her. All Shriners and their supporters deserve the credit for the work done to maintain this wonderful hospital system.

Brianna exercises every day to keep her core strong, and she golfs with her dad when they can fit it in. She has no restrictions in her future, other than she can't have a job which requires heavy lifting or is too physically taxing. There may be a time when she needs further surgery but that bridge will be crossed when she gets there. Meanwhile, she continues to explore her college setting. She goes to Colorado State University in Ft. Collins and is now in pre-veterinary studies. She is exploring her interests in science and would love to work in a zoo with a variety of animals.

Mr. Lee kept coming back to the Shriners as miracle workers. One operation changed Brianna's life and opened up new possibilities for living her life. The change in Brianna was dramatic and unbelievably given by total strangers who believe in making children's lives better at no cost to the families. Keep the tradition alive. Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?

If there is a late charge for fuel over what has been anticipated it will be minimal.

Previously the companies which have been dealt with have given a lower charge originally for the trip and then have added many or all those above fees in at the end. Glenda and I paid less than two thousand dollars each for the trip we were forced to cancel and our refund (minus the insurance cost) was well over \$5000. What we added up to \$3500-\$3600 for the trip without optional tours, some meals and souvenirs was actually \$5300 plus insurance. Hopefully, there will be no hidden charges this time.

OPTIONAL TOURS – There are scheduled but NOT paid for tours available. The total for one couple for ALL






BAND

PIPE & DRUM CORPS

The origins of the bagpipe are lost in history. The instrument is ancient, but it was associated with "common" people and made from non-durable organic materials, so no early history was preserved. It was virtually invisible to historians until the middle ages.

Many cultures around the world have invented their own version of the bagpipe, but the Great Highland Bagpipe, used by the Shrine Pipe & Drum Corps, originated in Scotland. These are warpipes that were used in battle to signal actions and strike terror into the hearts of the enemy. The first historical record of their use was in the Battle of the North Inch of Perth in the 15th century. "On hieland pipes, Scotte and Hybernick/Let heir be shraichs of deadlie clarions."

The Great Highland Bagpipes spread over the world following the catastrophic Battle of Culloden and subsequent suppression of the Scottish clans by the English. Many Scots emigrated out of the country carrying their heritage and bagpipes with them. Adding to the dispersal, the English soon realized that Highlanders made excellent troops, and a number of regiments were raised from the Highlands. These regiments also spread the bagpipe across the British Empire.

The bagpipe is a woodwind instrument that generates sound by passing air over the reeds to vibrate them. Unlike other woodwinds the bagpipe has four reeds, a double reed (like the oboe) in the chanter and a single reed in each of its three drones. Air pressure on the reeds must be kept constant to produce the proper sound. Too low and there is no sound. Too high, and the reeds squeak or produce an unexpected high note.

The piper does not blow air directly through the chanter and drones, but through a blowpipe into a leather bag. The blowpipe is fitted with a one-way valve to prevent air from escaping when the player takes a breath. The bag serves as a reservoir. While taking a breath, air is provided to the pipes by squeezing the bag with the arm, to provide a steady and uninterrupted flow of air to the reeds of the chanter and drones. The chanter has nine fingerholes. When played with both hands, like a flute, the chanter produces tones that cover one and a half octaves. The constant flow of air, however, introduces some complexities not found on a simple flute. Because the bagpipes have no silences between notes it is necessary to separate notes by introducing a short note called a gracenote between the melody notes. These gracenotes have no time value, and the tempo is driven by the melody notes only. Bagpipe music has several combinations of gracenotes that must be learned by the piper. The combinations of gracenotes are called embellishments. These short riffs between melody notes can be thought of as bagpipe "soul".

The drones combine to produce a harmonizing backdrop that adds depth to the melody produced by the

chanter. The Great Highland Bagpipe has two tenor drones and one bass drone. The drones each have a sliding joint for tuning and are fitted with a reed. The tenor drones are tuned to one octave below the low A keynote of the chanter, and the bass drone is tuned to two octaves below low A.

When you see a piper marching in a parade, remember he has to fill the bag, pump the air, play the tune, stay alert to marching commands, keep in step, and maintain his position. Not a recommended activity for anyone who cannot chew gum and walk at the same time!
