


Remember, the parade and circus seasons are rapidly approaching and we would really love to see a lot of you with your fezzes showing up at all events. It's always nice to

WEB FEZ AND STUFF

The song says.... "It never rains in Southern California". Not true, this year's Recorder Seminar was hosted by Al Bahr Shriners in




San Diego. It rained the entire time I was there except when I left I saw beautiful blue sky through the airport window. The main topic at this year's seminar was the new Web Fez Membership Program, a computer program that maintains Al Kalv's membership files in the Office. Currently we have a standalone system that uploads information monthly to headquarters. The new program is web based, meaning we will be able to access on any computer with Internet and the system is maintained in Tampa. Training was conducted in San Diego and Chris and I have been doing Webex training in the Office by way of conference calls from Tampa. The implementation is set for around April 20, 2015. At this time, I'm not sure I'm any smarter with the program than before training began. After the conversion is where the real learning occurs. I'm not sure I understand all of the features yet, but there are many. For example, nobles will be able to view the information we have on file online, and update address, phone numbers, emails, and spouse information. Eventually club/ unit officers will be able to access a variety of information on their club and unit members. The membership committee will be able to access certain information too. 

Shriner Child Casey Messke

Life's Challenges

When Casey and Cameron were delivered to Glen and Wendy Messke, fourteen years ago, they were delighted at the miracle of their twins. With one boy at home, life was busy and yet manageable. When Casey was only months old, Wendy noticed his spine was curved. When he was eighteen months old, he was diagnosed with scoliosis He was fitted for a brace which he wore for several years. His pediatrician referred him to the Shrine Hospital in Spokane. Casey wore braces at night and also wore one to school. When they were transferred here, he was sent to the Shriner Hospital for Children in Salt Lake. He was in a

cast for a year which was changed every six to eight weeks. The casting was not successful in that when they removed the cast for any length of time the spine resumed its curve.

Glen was transferred to Germany as a civilian employee for the Air Force. There the doctors wanted to fuse Casey's spine when he was nine years old. The family decided to wait for any medical treatment until they came back from Germany. When they returned, the Shrine hospitals were consulted and it turned out that there were three surgeons who had expertise in this difficult surgery. St Louis had one of the top surgeons who only operated on the very most difficult cases. They had to visit the hospital and go through a series of x-rays before the doctor accepted Casey for surgery. Casey's spine was at 132degree curve which also involves organ restriction. Movement is restricted and there can be multiple physical issues. Casey's lungs were not affected which allowed him more mobility.

Last May they went through to St. Louis for the surgery. The preparation for the surgery required Casey to be fitted with a halo which had counter weights that were used to align his spine. It was all attached to a walker sort of device. According to Casey, it was the worst part of his journey to getting his spine straightened. He was in it for six to eight weeks. At the end of July, the surgeon started the surgery which requires two procedures: fusing the spine and inserting the rods next to the spine to keep it straight and strong. With that surgery, Casey grew **eight inches**. His spine is now at twenty degrees and he has learned how



to walk all over again. He works with physical therapy and has had a shortened school day because he is still healing. The good news is that Casey is a gifted student and has managed to keep up with his classes, even while missing school due to his physical needs. He is looking forward to high school next year and starting with everyone else and not missing classes because he needed something else done. He just returned from his from his checkup in St. Louis and will go back this summer for his year checkup.

During the life of the twins Cameron has been very athletic and has participated in many sports. While Glen and Wendy have never

discouraged Casey, he played and participated with Cameron with the main restrictions being Casey's mobility and fragile back. Casey tries everything and gives it his best effort. In school he was part of the Science Olympiad and will try new activities as they present themselves to him. The classes he likes the best are science based. He loves to read and write. He likes science fiction and Harry Potter. He also journals and has found that helpful through his many hospital stays.

With the challenges that he has faced, Casey's attitude is one of a courageous, brave young person. He has never complained and is grateful for the Shriners for giving him the opportunity to pursue his life. One thing that he is happy about now is the diminished back pain. He is working on building his upper body strength with physical therapy. When asked what he'd like to thank the Shriners for, he replied, "Everything." Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?






National Pancake Day Update
