## garden sale a success



The garden sale at the Pig Roast was a great success this year. We were able to raise about \$230.



#### QUIET SERVICE

Noble Bob Allen and his wife of fifty-two years, Phyllis, are regular fixtures in the Hospitality Rooms for Shriners parades and OVs and any other function where the Potentate requests it. He has served as Chief Aide, Assistant Chief Aide and combinations of the same for several Potentates. He is wonderfully welcoming and the food and refreshments always plentiful. You know his smiling face and now here's the rest of the story.

Noble Bob was born and raised in Illinois and served in the US Navy for over twenty years. His grandfather fought for the Union in the Civil War. He lived in the territory of North Carolina which

later become Tennessee. He wasn't welcomed home after the war and moved his family to Illinois. His great grandfather fought in the War for Independence so it seems military service is part of the family history. Noble Bob became a Mason in 1970 when he joined Lodge #95, Silver State, in Pueblo and joined Al Kaly Shriners in 1994. He is a life member and a 32nd degree in the Scottish Rite. His First Line Signer was Noble Paul Cooper who was a member of the Honda Patrol. When Noble Bob joined the Honda Patrol, he helped start the Canon City Gun Show which has been a fund raiser for Al Kaly Shrine for years. He and Lady Phyllis are members of the Nomads. When she and son-in-law Bill gave Noble Bob a 1967 Ford Mustang, he joined the Flivers. His car collection is his pride and joy. He has two Corvettes ('81 and '86), a '87 Thunderbird, a pickup and all terrain Jeep.


In 1958, Noble Bob was working for Caterpillar Tractor Company and decided to enlist in the US Navy. His tour took him to the Philippines, Korea, Vietnam, Japan and Hawaii. When he was stationed in Hawaii, he came home on leave and his sister, Bernadine, introduced him to her best friend, Phyllis, whom she wanted for a sister-in-law. Her wish was fulfilled and they were married in 1962. Their family grew to add son Robert and daughter Gail. One of their postings took them to Pueblo at the Naval Reserve Center. When the movers pulled up in Glenn Ellyn on January 26, 1967, it started to snow. They were lucky to be able to leave as the snow kept coming. During the blizzard which lasted twenty-nine hours, twenty-three inches of

> snow fell. When they got to Pueblo, they bought a house and settled into various activities. Then off to Charleston, South Carolina where it never snows. Well, hardly ever, in the last one hundred years. When the Allens got there it snowed, and they were the only ones in the naval housing with a snow shovel!

After twenty years, Noble Bob left the Navy and returned to Colorado and built their home in Canon City. Noble Bob worked for the Department of Corrections and went back to college at CSU-Pueblo where he earned a degree in Business Administration. He had three strokes and surgery that went bad and he retired from DOC. It was hard for him not to work so he became a greeter at Walmart which kept him

busy until he retired again in 2002.

Fishing, hunting, gardening, bowling and woodworking have been his main hobbies. He's had to cut back on some of them because of his health. They spend time in Cripple Creek when they aren't traveling and helping with the Hospitality Rooms and other Al Kaly Shrine activities. With their son, Robert, daughter, Gayle and son-in-law, Bill, and grandson, Christopher, all living in Colorado, Noble Bob and Lady Phyllis are able to sit back and enjoy their home and land. Evidence of Noble Bob's handiwork is evident in their family room which he finished out with beautiful cabinets and paneling. It is a lovely place where they can relax and enjoy their times together.



A big thank you goes out to all that have participated in the parades to help show that Shriners still do exist and the Red Fezzes are there to prove it. The Bowling season has begun and I'm am happy to report that my Lady Rosa and I lost our first four games mainly because we were both in Cortez, so we will be back for the September bowling and will just have to crawl out the basement.

Just when you think you have heard all that the Shrine Hospitals can possible do a new story comes to surface. It seems that that a special little person named Ana Paula arrived at Shriners Hospital for Children-Los Angeles to receive a life-changing surgery not available in Panama. Ana was born a conjoined twin, twenty days after birth she underwent her first operation. Joined at the pelvis with her twin who did not survive the operation, Ana was left with a third leg, three kidneys and possible reproductive issues.

The medical team at Shriners Hospitals for Children-Los Angeles has developed a reconstructive surgical and treatment plan for Ana with hopes she will be able to lead a happy healthy life. This condition is so rare - there are only 12 survivable cases like it in the world each year. Ana is expected to undergo multiple surgeries including the removal of her two non-functioning legs before being fitted with a prosthetic.

Dr. Song states that she may never be able to run as fast as other children, but she will be able to move about and keep up with her peers. Just another incredible story of the miracles accomplished in our wonderful Shriners Hospitals.

In closing, Nobles, we belong to the Greatest Philanthropy in the world and our achievements in hospital care are nothing short of miracles. However there are millions of children out there still needing our help so our work is far from done. Together we make a difference in a children's lives.





### IMPORTANCE OF SELECTING QUALIFIED CANDIDATES FOR THE POSITION OF ORIENTAL GUIDE



From the Office of the Imperial Recorder. When the members of a Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for any merit achievement to the high office of Potentate.

Hence, it's quite evident that the nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon a thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, and interest.

A Noble can be a good fellow, a hard worker, and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the basic qualifications which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair both to himself and to his temple in seeking the office or in permitting his fellow nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

The normal starting point of Shrine leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naïve or presumptuous as to all the virtues, talents, and qualifications which are set forth in this checklist for advance evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

- Community standing and influence
- Financially secure •

- Capable of building good public relations •
- Good habits and moral character
- Interest in Shrinedom •
- Ability to give and get cooperation
- Diplomacy

Many temples have placed a definite limitation upon their progress as a result of hasty judgment in connection with nominations for the office of Oriental Guide. Every Noble is not fitted to meet the rigorous demands imposed upon Potentates.

So let's be fair, honest, and wise in the all-important matter of electing to office only men who are eminently qualified for the job. We all know that with honor comes responsibility. And while there is high honor associated with a Divan office, the ensuing responsibilities entail a lot of time-consuming, energy-consuming WORK! Eternal vigilance must be wisely and thoughtfully exercised by the voting membership in order to perpetuate a high caliber of leadership!


## Memorial Brick Project Underway

# Official Call of the Potentate....Stated Meeting...Election of Officers

Notice is given that the Stated Meeting and Election of Officers of Al Kaly Shriners will be held at the Pueblo Shrine Club on December 12, 2014.

You will be called upon to elect the following officers: Potentate, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer, Recorder and Representatives to the Imperial Council.

To gain admission into this meeting, the Shriners International By Laws require that a member must be in possession of and present his current year's membership card.

Shriners International By Laws Election Regulations: Shriners International By Laws, paragraph 325.11, Election Regulations

(a) **Electioneering.** A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in

the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited. (b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) **Violation.** For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) **Notice.** At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

# There Goes Henry

### Shriner Child Henry Gott IV

Better look quickly as Henry runs through the grass, up a tree, or onto the slide. Watching from a picnic table in Shooks Run Park are his parents Laura and Henry III. They are so happy to see their six year old son and their four year old daughter Cloe having such a good time. They are also grateful for Al Kaly Shriners part in their son's life.

According to Henry IV the braces he wears are to help his feet. They are really nice and he doesn't mind them because, although he can't run as fast with them on, he has a good time. Henry was born with contracted Achilles Tendons. When he started walking, he walked on his tippy toes. His parents asked their pediatrician about it when he was a little older and still didn't walk on his whole foot and his feet turned out some. They were referred to a physical therapist who wanted him to do occupational therapy and wondered if it was a psychological problem. His parents were concerned about his mobility in that his dad had always had problems with his own feet. They were also surprised that the PT thought it might be something other than a physical problem.

Laura's dad is in a men's group that includes a Shriner. Grandpa told them about his grandson and the frustration that the parents had in trying to find help for him. The Shriner told him about the Shriners Hospital for Children and how to get their help. Of course, once in the Salt Lake Hospital for Children, the doctors knew what was causing Henry's tippy toe walking and what to do about it. It was the shortened Achilles tendons, and braces were designed and created so that Henry's feel were on the ground and Henry was back running around and climbing whatever was in front of him.

He's only been in the braces since June and his parents can see the change in how his feet are pointed more straight ahead. Convincing Henry that braces were the way to go was a process. The longer he wore them, the more confident he

became in them. Dad Henry and Laura were certain that Henry would benefit and firmly encouraged him to learn to get around with braces. His school, Buena Vista Montessori, has been supportive as well. You see, they have inside shoes and outside shoes, which require getting the braces into the shoes with each change. The mobility in the braces is really good. He knows and understands the need to wear them so that someday he won't need them.



Dad and mom are so happy to see how just a few months has changed his walking. If they see him slip into the tippy toe walk, they remind him that he needs to walk on his feet and he obliges. Dad particularly is pleased to see how his feet are more flat on the floor even without the brace. They will go for a six month check in December so doctors can evaluate his progress and to order new braces if needed.

This is another success story that happened because the parents were concerned and would not give up on looking for a solution. Both parents are very grateful for not only the help their son and their family is receiving from the Shriners, but also for the way that their family is being helped. To have the answer to their child's gate problem and to know that help is there for him to have a normal life. Henry is interested in Martial Arts and they are happy because they know that with his athleticism and desire he will do well.

The challenge, as always, for the Shriners is to get the word out not only to the public, but to the pediatricians. Henry's gate will be corrected when he's young. Had it been done sooner even better. So this young family will be our ambassadors and tell others about what miracles the Shriner Hospitals can do. Aren't you proud to be a Shriner?


### AL KALY MULE TRAIN






