



The Melha Riders have donated approximately \$190,000 throughout the years, and are proud of their efforts.

Taking our knowledge global, Ted Huang, M.D., plastic and reconstructive surgeon at Galveston Shriners Hospital, recently shared his expertise on pediatric burn care and reconstructive plastic surgery with Chinese Television (CTS) in Taiwan. In June, nearly 500 individuals were injured after an explosion at a water park outside of Taipei, Taiwan's capital. Representatives from Shriners Hospitals for Children – Galveston will attend the upcoming meeting of the Taiwan Society of Burn Injuries and Wound Healing to consult with medical professionals and assist any way they can.

To show that we are growing worldwide, at the 2015 Imperial Session of Shriners International, the petition of Hikmat Shriners U.D., for a charter to form and open a temple of the Order in Cuiaba, Mato Grosso, Brazil, under the title of Hikmat Shriners, was granted. Hikmat is our first temple in South America. We wish them every success and look forward to their active participation in Shriners International.

The conversion to 2016 on Web Fez has taken place. By now you should have received your dues notice from Tampa. Please



Official Call of the Potentate Stated Meeting and Election of Officers

Notice is given that the Stated Meeting and Election of Officers of Al Kaly Shriners will be held at the Pueblo Shrine Club on December 11, 2015.

You will be called upon to elect the following officers: Potentate, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer, Recorder and Representatives to the Imperial Council.

To gain admission into this meeting, the Shriners International By Laws require that a member must be in possession of and present his current year's membership card.

Shriners International By Laws Election Regulations: Shriners International By Laws, paragraph 325.11, Election Regulations

(a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in

the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

- (b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

Shriner Child Scott Walton

A Chat at Sam's

Dee Burger has an eye out for Shriner children and she called me about Scott Walker who is part of the lawn service at her complex. If you know Dee you know she is dedicated to helping people. She was chatting with Scott and said that she was a member of the Daughters of the Nile and explained that they were related to Shriners. Well, in a few minutes, I got a call that she'd found another Shriner Child for me to interview. This is her second referral and I am grateful for her dedication to telling the story of Shriners and their hospitals.

A busy mom, Terry Walton, tried to help her six year old son, Scott, into a shopping cart at Sam's when a Shriner came up to her and began talking to her. He asked about Scott and commented on his brace which looked very uncomfortable and was difficult to maneuver for Scott and Terry. That conversation was what Terry calls a "God Thing" because it changed Scott's life from that moment on. They were referred to the Colorado Springs Shrine Club's monthly Saturday morning clinic, and the rest as they say is history.

When Scott was four, his mom noticed a slight limp beginning. She took him to the doctor who told her that he thought he knew what it was but that he'd have to refer her to someone else because it was out of his expertise. He was diagnosed as leg perthes, translated as a disintegrating hip bone. Scott was referred to a pediatric orthopedic doctor in Denver. There he was fitted with a "cowboy brace" which was designed to stabilize

the ball and keep it from disintegrating further. Surgery







was seen as the ultimate outcome. When four year old Scott heard "Cowboy" he was all ready to hop on the brace and ride away into the sunset. It, however, was not about to happen because the brace spread his legs out to the side and reduced his movements to a slow torturous waddle. He had difficulty walking and couldn't keep up with his brothers although they were careful and gentle with him, he couldn't play. They tried to find a stroller device to help him get around but Terry was often called upon to carry him. He was embarrassed and she was struggling to carry him as he grew. This struggle went on until that fateful meeting in Sam's.

They were off to Salt Lake Shriners Hospital for Children within weeks and the main descriptions were of the Happy Clowns and the smiling people who helped him. The doctor who saw them said, "I'm going to make your day," as he took off the brace. "You won't ever have to wear it again." Scott being a little boy wanted to beat it to death. The

doctor explained that it was made of titanium and was indestructible. Little Scott nearly six made the doctor promise that no other little child would ever wear it again. That was an easy promise to make.

The Shriners started physical therapy and he was part of the Telamedicine that was used by the Salt Lake Hospital and the Colorado Springs Shrine Club. Every six months they checked to see how Scott was progressing. His range of motion was checked and this service was done from age six to eighteen. The great news is that the hip bone grew back and surgery was not needed. For a long time Scott was the youngest person to be diagnosed with this disorder.




2015 AL KALY SHRINE GOLF TOURNAMENT SUMMARY

Featured Worker - Jina (Lee) Fagerburg

Author's note: This month the Featured Shriner article has taken a left turn. Several of the older Nobles and I contemplated and decided two things... 1) there are many people who are important to Al Kaly Shrine who are not *Shriners and 2) Jina was one of the most important.*

(For those of you who, like me, can't pronounce her name right...it is JEAN-a.) Jina is the wonder who puts the Dust together every month for the last 8 years or so. She is the graphic artist who does the layout (that means she finds pages for the articles and makes them look good) and makes the photos fit the article and fit the page with the words. There are other things involved, but that puts it in the vernacular most of us can understand.

She is a Lady Shriner at heart and knew everyone I mentioned during our interview, from reading the articles in the Dust during the layout process.

Those of you who know "Jina" know her as Jina Lee. However, her husband Josh knows her as Jina Fagerburg. That's a combination of German, Swedish and Irish with the Swedish holding claim to the surname. Diversity is full-blown in their home as Jina is full-blooded Korean.

Our girl Jina was born near Binghamton in upstate NY, where her father was an engineer for IBM (February 9, 1982 but don't tell her I spilled those beans. I won't! - Jina). Being born in the US she spoke English as her first language, along with a little Korean at home. When she was nine, her father decided to move the family to Seoul, Korea, where she was hit with immense culture shock. Immersion being chosen as the quickest way to learn the language and culture, she was enrolled in public elementary school, and within a year the pantomime and the language barrier had faded away. Soon she was a "native" and settled into life in Korea. Then, when she was 15, she and her mother moved to Los Angeles...culture shock all over again and with a vengeance.

On her return she was introduced to her first large modern supermarket with miles of food on miles of shelves, so unlike the small grocery stores in Korea. Then there was the trip to WalMart...never before had she seen anything like that. And the difference in schools was unbelievable.

Her Korean schools had single gender classes. mandatory uniforms with strict requirements on hair length, style, and accessories. The idea of school girls in long hair wearing shorts, tank tops and high heels to school was very strange, coming from the strict Korean culture. After wearing required skirts and tops for so long, it was only in her junior year in LA she wore her first skirt to school.

> Unused to seeing her in the black skirt with a flowered print, one of her friends thought that someone in her

With the common co-ed classes came the hand holding and "making out" common in high schools here but unheard of and prohibited in Korea then. Culture shock on steroids

family must have died.

In 2000 Jina graduated from Crescenta Valley High School and went to Northwestern University in Evanston. IL. with the idea of going into veterinary medicine. Her

parents wished her to pursue a medical career; Doctor Jina Lee was their dream and her mother encouraged her in that direction. But Jina's mother's father was an accomplished artist, having moved to Los Angeles

when Jina's mother was eighteen. In Korea he had painted many award-winning pieces, and to this day a photo of her grandfather with the Korean President is one of the family's prized possessions. Having a grandfather who was such an accomplished artist and loving the artistic field, she found herself studying biology interspersed with a few art courses "as a hobby."

During this time she worked as a customer service rep for three years at the Pick-Staiger Concert Hall at Northwestern. Her time there in customer service as a "work study student" was invaluable as she continued her career life.

After graduation, she returned to California and got a job as a bilingual customer service rep for Culligan Water, while also tutoring high school students. California couldn't hold her, however, and when her brother moved to Colorado Springs, he invited her to come to Colorado, too. A mother-



daughter talk later she and her mother were on their way to Colorado Springs.


Now what to do? Bank of America needed help in their call center so... but this wasn't her ideal occupation, and she was burnt out on biology. She kept remembering her time in high school where she had worked on the school newspaper editing articles, doing graphic design and layout. Soon after, her mother told her about an opening for a layout designer at a Denver paper. Although the job cemented her determination to go into graphic design, any of you who have driven Monument Hill in winter will understand her decision to take a position at Signal Graphics in Colorado Springs after eight months of commuting. One day, two Shriners needing a graphic and layout person for the Basketball Tournament program came into the store. Those Shriners were Past Potentates Bob Burr and Steve Jordan, and when the Dust needed a new designer a few months later, Ill. Sir Bob remembered her and we have been blessed with her since.

After her stint with Signal Graphics, she began taking contract design jobs in Colorado Springs with Ingersoll-Rand and the Gazette newspaper. As a lifelong gamer, she also ventured into online gaming to stay connected with friends, who were now scattered around the country. One of these was an acquaintance named Josh, who was a boom operator in the Air Force, stationed at Kokomo, Indiana, and flew around the country as part of his assignments. One day he was coming to the Air Force Academy and emailed his friend Jina asking if she would consider meeting him for coffee so they could put faces on the names. As they say, "the rest is history."

Over the next year they met periodically and Skyped often, and in early 2009 Jina moved to Chicago to fulfill her college-era dream of living there, but also to be closer to Josh. Although she loved Chicago, she eventually moved to Kokomo to be with Josh and found a job as a graphic designer in Indianapolis. During this time, Jina visited the yearly International Festival in Indianapolis, and was soon volunteering at the Korea booth. Each year after that, she spent a day at the festival discussing Korea and drawing free anime portraits for visitors and children.

In 2013, Josh's re-up date arrived and he opted not to remain with the Air Force, so he was issued his Honorable Discharge while the couple was preparing to be married. Although their first meeting was not a date in the common sense of the word, it had become the beginning of a wonderful friendship, a courtship and their marriage on September 28th, 2013, at the Butterfly Pavilion in Westminster, CO.

With both available to do what they wanted and no strings holding them anywhere, in May 2014 they returned to Colorado. Josh has family and friends in Denver and Jina has family and friends in Colorado Springs. Josh was also




looking to follow his desire to become a nurse, and with Colorado Springs having a premier nursing college at UCCS, the decision to move here was made. With the mountains, hiking areas, camping and outdoor activities available here, the decision was a perfect fit for them and Josh is now attending classes at UCCS. Jina has followed her dream of an artistic career (in her grandfather's footsteps) and has just recently joined the staff at UCCS in their marketing division after working in a print shop in Woodland Park for the last year. She continues to work on the Dust, having done so even while out of state.

We want to thank you, Jina, for your dedication to our fraternity and people.
