Stated Meeting...Election of Officers

Pueblo Shrine Club

December 13, 2019 at 7:30 p.m..

You will be called upon to elect the following officers: Potentate, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer, Recorder and Representatives to the Imperial Council.

To gain admission into this meeting, the Shriners International Bylaws require that a member must be in possession of and present his current year's membership card.

Shriners International Bylaws Election Regulations:

Shriners International Bylaws, paragraph 325.11, Election Regulations (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

- (b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

YOUR CHIEF RABBAN

Who is your Chief Rabban?

Brian Carter was born in Enid, Oklahoma and his parents moved to St. Joseph, MO shortly thereafter. The family spent about 4 years in St. Joseph before moving on to Nevada, MO for another 4 years. The family moved once again, this time to Lee's Summit, MO. It was in Lee's Summit that Brian first learned that his father, Frank, was a Shriner. Frank served as

Chaplain of Ararat Temple for 1 year. Frank was a Presbyterian Minister so this was very fitting.

In 1962, the family moved to Salida where Brian graduated high school in 1964 and entered the workforce for two years. During this time, his father joined Al Kaly Shrine and the Mon-Ark Shrine Club. Around the time his father joined the Mon-Ark club, the club purchased an old building on Sackett St. in Salida



and Brian was able to assist with cleaning out the building to prepare it for the club to move in. Brian doesn't know when his father became a Mason, but he dedicated many hours and years to the Salida Lodge and Mon-Ark Club.

In 1966, Brian attend Ft. Lewis College in Durango for 2 years and in August of 1968, he transferred to Southern Colorado State College in Pueblo. In May of 1969, he was hired by the State of Colorado for a security position at the State Hospital in Pueblo where he worked for 6 months. During this time is when he met his lovely wife Emily, who was working at the hospital as a Medical Technologist intern. The two were married in September, 1970.

Shortly after meeting Emily, Brian transferred to a security position at University of Southern Colorado. After 3 years at the university, Brian decided to apply for a position with the Pueblo Police Department...he was hired! On November 27, 1972, Brian was sworn in as a Police Officer for the city of Pueblo. After over 29 years of service to the city and people of Pueblo, Brian retired on January 7, 2001.

In 1977, Brian petitioned and was accepted to become a Mason in Silver State Lodge #95. Brian was honored to have Most Worshipful Master Ben Crosno confer all three of his degrees. Brian's father passed away that same year. While a sad time for Brian, it gave him solace to know his father was proud to see his son become a Mason and follow in his

footsteps.

Brian joined Southern Colorado Consistory in 1978 and then in June 1980, he joined Al Kaly Shriners. In the same class were Past Potentate Robert Mouirguies and Noble Doug Gabel. The sands got very HOT!

Brian served as an Aide to Ill Sir Jimmy Evans in 1982 and to many others over the years. In 1985, Brian was appointed Assistant Football Chairman and in 1986, the Football committee changed to a Basketball Tournament, and Brian served as Chairman for 11 years. In 1997 he was honored by Ill Sir Randy Gregory with the title of Basketball Chairman Emeritus.

As Brian and Emily grew their family and focused on their careers, they took a hiatus from Shrine. When Emily began to travel for work, she thought it would be an ideal time for Brian to reinvigorate his Blue Lodge and Shrine participation. In 2006, Brian decided to expand his outreach and became a plural member of Eureka Lodge #66 in Coal Creek, CO. Brian served as Worshipful Master in 2008 and again in 2015.

Brian revived his participation in Shrine in 2009. He served as Chief Aide for Ill Sir Gary Sears (2012), Ill Sir Roger Mendenhall (2013) and Ill Sir Merv Terrill (2014). It was in 2015, that Brian served double duty; he was Chief Aide and 1st Ceremonial Master for Ill Sir JD Potter. While Brian would like to thank everyone that helped him over years in Shrine; there are just too many to thank individually. Brian is sincerely thankful for all the guidance and mentorship!

Brian has served in many positions over his years of service to Shrine. He has served as Past President, Secretary and even Treasurer of several units and clubs (Pueblo Shrine Club, Fremont Shrine Club, Trinidad Shrine Club, Flivvers, Tractors, Past Masters and Motor Patrol). Additionally, he has been a devoted Circus supporter and attends as many parades as he can.

While Brian "officially" retired in 1991, he hasn't let the grass grow under his feet. In addition to his Shrine and Masonic responsibilities, Brian has worked at various jobs to keep busy. In June of 2019, Brian finally decided to "slow down" and just work now and then in order to focus and devote his time to Shriners over the next year and a half.



A HEARTFELT 'THANK YOU'

Thank You to the Colorado Springs Shriners and to Shriners Hospitals for Children

In the fall of 2018, nine-year old Jhon Quispe along with his father, walked into a clinic in the Peruvian Andes. Jhon's little face, neck and chest were horribly disfigured from of a burn accident he had suffered at the age of four.

His chin was "glued" to his chest, which prevented him from properly closing his mouth, as well as, causing extreme difficulty eating.

Jhon stopped going to school when the other children constantly teased and taunted him due to his appearance.

In an even crueler twist of fate, Jhon's mother died at the age of 32, leaving behind Jhon, his father and a five-year-old daughter.

The people at the Kausay Wasi clinic (Quechua for "House of Health") were heartbroken to hear

Jhon's story and to witness the difficulties he was living with. They were determined to find help for Jhon.

It happens that the founders and operators of the Kausay Wasi Clinic, Guido and Sandy Del Prado,



are the in-laws of Colorado Springs Shriner, Jeff Weiner. When Jeff learned of Jhon's condition, he did what Shriners do; he immediately got on the phone and began the process of getting Jhon treated at one of our amazing burn hospitals – in Galveston, Texas.


Arrangements were made for Jhon and his father to make

the arduous trip from the Sacred Valley of the Incas to Lima, then to Dallas and Houston, where they were met by a volunteer who drove them to Galveston.

Jhon spent six weeks at the Shriners Burn Center in Galveston, where daily communications took place between his Quechua speaking father, the English and Spanish speaking medical personnel and Jhon's local sponsors and translators back in Peru. The care they received was kind, professional and, by all accounts, outstanding. Jhon had four surgeries to remove a large part of his scar tissue.

When Jhon and his father returned to Peru, he was a changed young man! Not only did he arrive with a large duffel bag, stuffed with donated clothing and toys, but he now has a full range of movement in his neck and head!

Jhon will return to Galveston in November 2019 for



additional surgeries to remove even more scar tissue from his neck, chest and arms. He knows that his journey will be a long and painful one, but he is full of hope for his future. He has already resumed his education.

Guido and Sandy Del Prado, Jeff's in-laws, traveled to Colorado Springs in July, in time for

the annual cook-out. They were very excited to meet the Colorado Springs Shriners and to personally thank them for helping to change Jhon's life. Following a moving account of Jhon's story, they received a donation of \$100, the proceeds of the 50/50 drawing, to put toward the expenses of Jhon's upcoming trip to Galveston. It was a superb ending to a great evening!

To the Shriners Hospitals for Children, and to the Al Kaly Shriners and Colorado Springs Shriners Club in particular, THANK YOU! You have given this young man and countless others the possibility to live normal, productive and full lives. We cannot imagine a more worthwhile mission. Thank you for what you do!

Dean was raised in Wichita, KS along with his three sisters. His father was an Army veteran and went on to serve a full career as a police officer in Wichita.

Early on in life, Dean had several jobs which included delivering newspapers, pumping gas (only Oregon and New Jersey still require someone to pump your gas), and as a plumber's assistant. He was drafted into the Army for the Korean War. He spent the first 7 months of his tour on a combat assignment at the "Punchbowl" – the name given to the bowl-shaped Haean Basin near what is now the Demilitarized Zone. Fortunately, he was lucky enough to be selected to serve on the 8th Army Honor Guard in Seoul under General James Van Fleet. It was good duty – he got to sleep in an actual bed!


After his stint in the Army, he went to work for Coleman. Then, with the GI Bill, he attended Spartan College of Aeronautics and Technology in Tulsa, OK. At the early age of 16, he learned to fly and he was determined to earn his license.

His training at Spartan qualified him to receive his Airframe and Powerplant license as an aircraft mechanic. That license led him on a pathway to flying as a corporate pilot. He worked for many companies in aeronautics industry including American Airlines, as an aircraft mechanic. He flew as a corporate

pilot for Sinclair Refining, Sun Oil, Public Service of Colorado, Iowa Beef Processors, and Fleming, the nation's largest food wholesaler based at that time in Topeka, KS. When Fleming moved to Oklahoma, Dean took a transfer and became their chief pilot. He retired in 1991

Early on, with his love of flying and the

need to build flying hours, Dean decided to sell his car and buy a plane; he figured he could hitchhike or catch a ride with friends. In his own plane, he and a friend flew back from a trip to Ohio, stopping in Mattoon, IL. They met a couple of girls walking down the street, stopped to talk, and the rest, as they say, is history. One of those girls was Elaine – now his wife of 62 years! Says he "picked her up" – a phrase I haven't heard in



awhile! They have 3 daughters, 1 granddaughter, 2 grandsons, and 2 great granddaughters. They enjoy traveling – went on the trip to Europe on the Rhine River cruise with the Shrine.

Dean's dad was a Mason and the organization was always in the back of his mind. He turned in his application when living in Kansas, but it wasn't until he moved to Oklahoma where he actually joined. He got interested in the Shrine because of the type of work they do and had friends who were Shriners. His sponsor was Al Early and he was initiated in Colorado Springs. Dean, along with some friends, decided they wanted a unit in Durango – the Shriners were pretty much unknown in the area. They started with 6 men and bought 6 cars. The Tin Lizzie unit was born! Durango finally knew about the Shriners!

Dean had a friend, Steve Jackson, Past Master of Durango 46, who worked for the railroad. Steve had found an old Cushman Silver Eagle left on a train and gave it to a friend who put it in his junk pile. Dean met the friend who told him he could have it – it was a real mess. Dean took it home and located the necessary parts to restore the bike; it looks really nice now. Through research on the internet, he discovered there are Cushman Clubs all over the US and the bike is worth a nice chunk of change!

Over the years, his career had him flying in and out of Durango. He and Elaine decided it would be a great place to live after retirement. Dean is currently the President of the San Juan Basin Shrine Club as well as President of the Tin Lizzie unit. Hobbies Dean has enjoyed includes creating stained glass, woodworking, fishing and hunting...his love was always aviation! He even built an experimental plane that actually flies! 
