### The Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels



### **History**:

The title *Kentucky Colonel* dates back to around 1813. The Kentucky Militia had just returned from a highly successful campaign during the War of 1812. When the Militia disbanded, Governor Issac Shelby commissioned Charles S. Todd, one of his officers in the campaign, as an Aide-de-Camp on the governor's staff. Todd's official rank and grade was *Colonel*.

While early Colonels actually served military roles, the position took on a more ceremonial function in the late 1800's. Colonels in uniform attended functions at the Governor's mansion stood as symbolic guards at state events and the like.

"Formulate a society to more closely band together this group into a great non-political brother-hood for the advancement of Kentucky and Kentuckians," Governor Sampson challenged. And they did. Minutes of the early meetings confirm that charitable programs were to be a central part of the organization. Social events would also play an important role. The group held a Derby Eve dinner for

Further information can be obtained by contacting the Governor's Office in Frankfort. The address is Attention: Lora Quire, Room 8, Governor's Office, State Capital, Frankfort, KY 40601.

The Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels does not appoint or commission Kentucky Colonels. That can only be done by the sitting Governor of the Commonwealth. Only the Governor knows the reason for bestowing the honor of a Colonel's Commission on any particular individual.

### Noble Access to WebFez Notice August 2016

#### **Noble Access to WebFez**

The 2017 Dues Notices will include an insert with instructions for Noble access and registration to the WebFez Membership System. You may view and print the insert from within WebFez, under Important Information: "2017 Dues Notice Insert – WebFez Login Instructions for Nobles". Please familiarize yourself with the insert and the registration/login process so that you may support your membership when they call for assistance.

The WebFez registration screen will direct Nobles to <u>contact the temple first</u> with questions and problems to ensure that the temple is aware of issues. This will allow each temple to stay engaged with their membership and the process while assisting with support as we initiate this endeavor.

You may also direct the Noble to view the registration assistance video from the link "New Registration -- Watch the How to Register Video" located on the top of the Registration page that displays after clicking the Register button on the Login screen.

One common problem to be on the lookout for is the mismatch of the last name when typed by the Noble. Example: If you have entered a Noble's last name as "Smith, P.P." within WebFez, it must be entered exactly as it appears when the Noble is registering.

Noble access is a milestone achievement that should help all of Shriners maintain a more accurate database, but it will require effort to get members registered and using the system. The Noble will be able to view and change many items within their own record, as well as reprint a dues notice or a temporary membership card if they are current. (Note that not all functionality will be available in the mobile version.)

Please watch for training dates and be on the lookout for more detailed information in the near future. Also, be sure to discuss this notification with the Temple Divan and relay it to your business office staff and membership so that all are well informed. Let's get the job done together with communication!

- Go to your browser's address bar and type in <u>webfez.shrinenet.org</u>
- Click the register button on the Login page: Register
- From the Registration page, choose your Temple from the drop-down list and then type in your Member Number and your First and Last names.
- Click on the Register button. You will be directed to the Create a New Account page. On this page enter an E-mail address that you will use to log in with, confirm the E-mail address, and then enter and confirm your Password.







The fraternity, which has nearly 200 chapters in several countries and thousands of clubs around the world, continues to support this unique health care system. Please visit shrinersinternational.org to learn more.

**Boilerplate for Shriners Hospitals for Children:** 

Shriners Hospitals for Children provides specialized care to children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families' ability to pay. Generally, care is provided until age 18, although, in some cases, it may be extended to age 21. All care and services are provided in a family-centered environment. For more information, please visit shrinershospitalsforchildren.org.

A Few Other Points to Remember: Don't indicate that Shriners Hospitals for Children provides care "for free" or "at no cost."

- Remember to use the correct name for the fraternity, which is Shriners International, and to no longer use the AAONMS designation.
- It's OK to use the scimitar logo, but please also consider incorporating the official Shriners International logo into your materials the one with the fez and Shriners International text.
- Please remember that the name of our health care system is Shriners Hospitals for Children (and not Shriners Children's Hospital, for example).

### Our Men Have Great Recipes

Since placing Bob Hudson's chili recipe and Barney Miller's chocolate peanuts in the Dust, I have had a couple of men ask if I'd like to put in one of their recipes. OF COURSE!! Here is one I was handed, literally during the FibArk Parade (by one of the parading Nobles).

Noble Jerry Long's Deer, Elk or Beef Roast

1/8 teaspoon each - marjoram, thyme, rosemary

4 Tablespoons parsley flakes

1 can chicken broth – soup sized

1 cup olive oil

2 cups red wine

3 garlic cloves chopped fine OR 1 Tblsp granulated garlic 1 teaspoon each salt and pepper

2-4 pound roast

Put olive oil and 1 cup red wine in 1 quart container and shake vigorously. Add marjoram, thyme, rosemary, garlic, salt and pepper and shake til well mixed. Wash roast and pat dry, place in crock pot. Pour dry spices over the roast, cover, and refrigerate for a couple of hours, turning every 30 minutes. When you start to cook, add chicken broth and 2nd cup of red wine. Cook about 1 hour per pound. Slice and return to broth until ready to serve. Serve warm over rice.

Jerry gave me a couple other recipes I'll share in the future...they sound yummy, also!





- Remember to use the correct name for the fraternity, which is Shriners International, and to no longer use the AAONMS designation.
- It's OK to use the scimitar logo, but please also consider incorporating the official Shriners International logo into your materials —the one with the fez and Shriners International text.

SHRINERS VILLAGE website has been updated to make it more convenient to use, and has many new and exciting features. New features include a "Ladies Tab" and a "video" section. Log on to Shriners Village and check it out!

The PR Committee has been busy examining initiatives on making the Southern Colorado community more aware of our hospitals and the services provided.
