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

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


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GOLF TOURNAMENT 2009

THE RECENT IMPERIAL SESSION

Nobles and Ladies, as your

Assistant Rabban (and a first-time voting delegate for our Shrine Center), I feel it necessary to report on the trips I take on Al Kaly's behalf. To that end, this article is about my experiences at the recent Imperial Session in San Antonio, Texas. It was a very educational and fun trip. The "call" (the list of legislation under consideration) was very extensive, with some 36 resolutions. Imperial Potentate Douglas Maxwell chaired the sessions. After he announced each resolution on the floor for consideration, he allowed those delegates who wanted to voice an opinion, both for and against, to speak to all the nobility present. There was a five minute time limit imposed on the speakers, but equal time was granted to those who wanted to speak. Maxwell then called for the ayes to stand. He then asked the ayes to be seated and the nays to stand. If the vote was too close to be apparent, we voted via paper ballot, which had to be hand counted by the tellers – a very interesting and time-consuming process.

In my opinion, the most significant pieces of legislation we voted on were hospital related. One of the resolutions called for closing six hospitals, including Galveston. That resolution was soundly defeated resulting in all hospitals remaining open. Another very important resolution that was passed gives each hospital the option to reduce the scope of services it provides while remaining under the clearly identifiable umbrella of Shriners Hospitals for Children. That means that some may become clinics for day surgery and out-patient care, rather than full-service hospitals. Also passed was the resolution that paves the way to accept third-party pay, insurance, and direct payment by a patient's family if the family so desires.

Another interesting resolution that passed changes the overall organization's name to Shriners International. And as if to support that name change, we approved two new Shrine Centers, one in the Philippines and one in Puerto Rico.

All in all, Nobles, it was a worth while trip and I'd like any of you who desire more information to talk to one of the four voting delegates (Tom Holmes, Steve Jordan, Bart Guthrie, and me). By the way, if Al Kaly drops below 1,000 members, we will lose one delegate.

The registrations are "bountifully" coming in, so it must mean that our CSSA is just around the corner. Al Kaly



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Featured Member

Loren Enyeart

While he and a buddy moved through enemy territory on a dark lonely night, he heard the troops marching along the road.

"We were trying to make it across the Zarr River downstream," said Cañon City resident Loren Enyeart. "We were getting shot up pretty badly so we moved downstream under the cover of darkness. We

managed to get across on a platoon bridge."

In order to install wire communications, he and a buddy attempted to locate other companies who were moving into position. When they heard the troops on the road, the two men learned they had made a mistake. "Instead of (our own troops), it was German troops falling back," Enyeart said. "Thinking back on it, we should have known better" because he had heard their hobnail boots on the highway. "We could hear them scrapping the boots on the road. We knew our troops would not be making noise like that."

But it was too late.

"We walked right up to each other, eyeball to eyeball," Enyeart said. "We didn't have a chance to do anything about it. So they took us prisoner right there."

From that point to nearly the end of the war, Enyeart was kept a prisoner along with numerous others. But he kept his sense of humor.

Right after he was captured, while changing locations, one of the drivers, who wore bottle thick glasses, went charging out of the camp and he missed a turn. "He turned the jeep over," Enyeart said. "We landed in a ravine. It didn't hurt anybody. They got the jeep back on its wheels and loaded us up, and took us to a different location," where they were kept

under guard by two World War I vets in a small house.

"I was a prisoner then for nearly until the end of the war," Enyeart said. "The Russians were crowding to the east and the Germans couldn't hold us any longer so we left the prisoner of war camp more or less on our own — with their help actually. They didn't want us to be captured by Russian troops."

Enyeart said they had planned to trade them to the Allied Forces. The Germans lined up the prisoners, according to nationality. When some of the prisoners grew too tired to walk, they dropped off on the side of the road and then after resting, they fell in behind the line.

"We were hungry," Enyeart said. "We were actually pretty much on our own. Each of us foraged across Germany, but the German people, as a whole, knew what was coming. They knew the Russians were behind us so they were willing to help us with what they could. They didn't have much, but

we would gather whatever we could."

Eventually, when the prisoners got to the Elbe River, they found their own troops at Haley, Germany. In the meantime, the Germans stacked their guns in a field and sat down to wait for the Allied Forces. At the end of the war, Enyeart was sent to Camp Lucky Strike to recuperate. "I was a strong man, but they held me there a while," he said.

When it was time to go home on the USS Anderson, he returned to Breckenridge for three months before he picked up his discharge papers at Camp Roberts, Calif.


After the war, Enyeart joined his father in the timber business, but when the bottom fell out, he started working for several mining operations before returning to Climax.

Born July 23, 1919, on a ranch north of Dillon, Loren Enyeart attended a country school at Slate Creek, where

they had a ranch for several years. In 1929, he moved to Breckenridge, where he and his family started a dairy farm. After he graduated from high school in Boulder in 1939, he worked at Climax until he was drafted into the Army in March 1942. After the war, he returned to Breckenridge and married Elva Jane McDonald, who worked as clerk and recorder, in vital statistics and other jobs.

In his leisure time, Enyeart joined the Breckenridge Masonic Lodge No. 47, where he served in all of the chairs,

including worshipful master. In 1985, he joined the Al Kaly Shriners and was involved in several other Masonic orders. 



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Shriners International Positions Itself for Membership Growth

When people think of the Shriners organization, they may think of tradition and the trappings of a 136-year-old fraternity. "Modern" and "contemporary" aren't words that come readily to mind in describing the Shriners – at least it hasn't been the case in the past.

In the last year and a half, a national marketing and branding campaign has brought a new awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children, the official philanthropy of Shriners International, to millions of people. Now it is the fraternity's turn. Shriners of North America, henceforth known as Shriners International, is embarking on an effort to update its look and image, and the media and general public are taking notice.

Recently, the Chicago News-Tribune noted the contemporary approach the organization is using to appeal to younger audiences, citing the Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, the Las Vegas stop on the PGA TOUR. The tournament garnered extensive coverage from major media outlets, including Fox News, CNN and Entertainment Tonight, as well as People, In Style and Las Vegas Golf magazines.

Shriners International is now utilizing the iconic fez as its logo (replacing the scimitar, star and crescent, which has been used since 1872) to modernize the look of materials, and is developing strategies to encourage younger members to join the organization. The latter includes partnering with college fraternities to educate members about Shriners International. In addition,



temples (chapters) are offering more family-oriented activities.

Local Shriners are also being encouraged to create interest groups, or "units," that appeal to younger members. A unique example is the "Wild Fez" Unit from Maskat Shriners in Wichita Falls, Texas. Members of this group, who are mostly in their 20s and 30s, raise money for their temple by organizing an annual concert they call "ShrineFest." Units like the Wild Fezzes are growing increasingly popular and help the public learn more about the Shriners fraternity. These groups also help keep younger members involved in the organization and their communities.

The fraternity has also established a presence within several social media sites in an effort to engage younger members and potential members. Currently, the fraternity manages a MySpace page at myspace. com/shrinershq and can be found on Twitter at twitter.com/shriners. Participation in other sites, such as Flickr, is in the works.

The decision to rename the fraternity Shriners International was made to more clearly reflect the worldwide reach and relevance of the Shriners organization, especially with members in several countries hoping to create new Shriners temples in the near future. While the fraternity is taking on a new look and attitude, the mission of its philanthropy remains the same: to continue to support Shriners Hospitals for Children.


