Raised on a ranch, it was natural to come up with an idea using horses when he joined the Kalyklowns. But he wanted to do something different. "I decided I wanted to portray an exaggerated cowboy," said Wayne McKey, of Pueblo. "I knew I needed a vehicle so after some thought, I came up with the idea of a three-wheel bicycle. I built it to look like a horse with a head, the back part, the middle section and the front legs. It's a one-of-a-kind, with my own idea and the help of Phyllis (his late wife of 48 years). It gets a lot of attention in the parades."

He was born in 1939, in Ingalls, Kansas, which is southwest of Dodge City, Kansas. Then in 1948, he moved to a small ranch in north central Kansas, where he attended school in Agra, Kansas.

"My parents and family ran cattle and a few horses, goats, chickens, etc.," McKey said. "I worked on other farms and ranches when I was old enough to go out and work, in addition to all the things we did on our own farm. When I was 14 years old, I worked in the hay fields, raking hay with a horse drawn hay rake. I was the only other person the rancher would let handle his team of Belgians".

While in high school, McKey played football and other sports before he graduated from high school in 1957. "My life on the ranch was pretty normal," McKey said. "I

enjoyed walking or riding my horse all over the country, carrying a gun". According to McKey, "a friend and I road our horses 20 miles to Phillipsburg, Kansas just to ride in the parade and rodeo's Grand Entry and then road them home again".

Shortly after graduation, he moved to Colorado Springs, where he worked at three different jobs. In 1959, he moved to Pueblo to work at CF&I Steel Company for the next 42 years. However, he went through numerous layoffs. But in May 1959, he met Phyllis, then was laid off from the steel mill.

Instead of letting it deter him, the couple were married July 26, 1959. It took several more months before he got his job back on Thanksgiving Day. Whenever he was laid off during his career with CF&I, he did a variety of jobs, including selling cookware, digging graves and constructing outdoor signs.

Along the way, while Phyllis worked as a teacher with District 60, they built a new house. In August 1960,

the couple had their only child, Ron. McKey lost his lifelong partner, Phyllis

on Nov. 16, 2006, when she passed away.

In January 1970, McKey joined South Pueblo Lodge No. 31, serving in the chairs before he worked his way up to Master in 2000, then took over as Secretary in 2001, which he has remained since then.

He joined the Scottish Rite shortly thereafter and then the Al Kaly Shrine in November 1974.

The first unit McKey

joined was the Nomads, serving as Wagon Master in 1977 and 1978 then he became a member of the Foot Patrol for 19 years. "I'm the oldest living Past Wagon Master," McKey said. "(I also) served as Captain on the Patrol, President of the Patrol in 1985 and President of the Central States Patrol Association in 1986. We hosted Central States here that year."

Over the years, the couple traveled in their motor home to many of the Western States and Central States conventions..

On the side, he became a member of the Pueblo Shrine Club in 1992, serving on the Executive Board and as President in 1993. McKey, also is a Life Member of the Fremont County Shrine Club. He became a member of the Kalyklowns in 1995, serving as its President along the way. But he wasn't through yet. He has also served as President of Al Kaly Past Masters, and has been appointed by several Potentates as a Shrine Hospital representative, a Chief Aide and an Ambassador. In addition to all this, McKey served two years as Rabban of the Clan, the Hillbilly Clan #29 of the International Order of Hillbilly's.

In 2008, the Scottish Rite awarded him with a Red Hat. He has participated in several degrees during their Reunions, as well as receiving several other honors, such as the Pomegranate Award in February.

While competing in clown competitions in WSA and CSSA conventions, he has been in the top 10 in both Associations, which included a third place in clown

competition in 2005 and 2008, and first place in the parade competitions the same two years, as well as first place for Al Kaly Shriners. Along with that, he is one of the whistlers of the clowns, traveling all over the country doing whistling acts, as

well as entertaining children and creating balloon figures at I-25 Speedway, at birthday parties and other events.

In his spare time, he enjoys raising roses and cooking, which includes cooking for his family every Christmas Eve. He also enjoyed camping and fishing all over Colorado when Phyllis was alive. In addition to his son, Ron and

his wife Christy, McKey has three grandchildren, Sarah (Anthony) Sandstrom, Heather, 16, Justin, 13, and a

great-grandson, Hunter, 5.



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
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## PARADES, OVS, AND FUNDRAISERS





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### Research in Spinal Cord Injury Improves Assessment and Treatment



A spinal cord injury (SCI) can be devastating. Generally resulting in some degree of paralysis and disruption of the body's voluntary and involuntary actions, the impact and implications of SCI last a lifetime.

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is committed to providing expert orthopaedic and rehabilitative care to its patients with SCI. However, being able to offer the best care is dependent on accurate assessment and diagnosis, which requires being able to determine the exact level and extent of injury.

In pediatric SCI, this has been especially difficult due to the lack of pediatric-based tools; the standard test for assessing SCI was designed for adults. Researchers have found that age 6 may be the youngest age children are developmentally able to understand the instructions, and older children do not react well to some aspects of the test.

To fill the void in pediatric evaluations, researchers at Shriners

Hospitals for Children®, led by MJ Mulcahey, Ph.D., director of rehabilitation services and clinical research at the Philadelphia hospital, established the first assessment guidelines applicable to kids with SCI as young as 3 months old.

Funded by research grants from Shriners Hospitals for Children®, the pediatric version of the International Standards for Neurological Classification of Spinal Cord Injury, known as WeeStep, is an electronic learning module that compliments the established assessment program for adults with SCI. The WeeStep provides evidence-based methods to evaluate and classify the level and implications of SCI in children, based on established childhood developmental guidelines.

These new guidelines will help professionals determine the level and extent of SCI and allow for reasonable predictions or expectations for neurological recovery and for developing the best medical care plan for each patient. The WeeStep is available to medical professionals world-wide via the American Spinal Injury Association Web site.

Another effort to increase understanding of SCI and related problems is the establishment of the Pediatric Research Center, which opened in September 2009 in Philadelphia. The 23,000 square-foot facility, located in the new Temple University Medical School Education and Research Building across the street from Shriners Hospitals for Children®—Philadelphia, will be used primarily for research in neural (nerve) repair and

rehabilitation, including the spinal cord, neuromuscular injury and brain injury. The Center is under the direction of Michael Selzer, M.D., former director of rehabilitation research and development for the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Temple University and Shriners
Hospitals for Children® aim to establish
a translational research program where
basic science developments can benefit
children with neuromuscular
conditions. Drs. Selzer and Mulcahey
have strategically planned to connect
basic science to clinical research so
that new knowledge will be offered to
children receiving care from Shriners
Hospitals for Children®.

Currently, the health care system is funding approximately 12 research studies at the three hospitals with SCI programs involving different aspects of SCI, ranging from cell repair to quality of life issues. In addition, researchers at Shriners Hospitals for Children® share their expertise through academic affiliations at noteworthy institutions and by providing opportunities for post-doctoral researchers.

The emphasis on research and education is indicative of Shriners Hospitals for Children®'s total commitment to determining, as well as providing, the best care for children with SCI.



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
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## A Few Words on MEMBERSHIP




